#### Governor's Forward

since its inception in 1960, the New York State Council on the Arts has shown an unwavering dedication to its mission to preserve and expand the rich and diverse cultural resources that are the heritage of New York's citizens. Guided by this mission, the Council has continued to work tirelessly to maintain the state's preeminence as the cultural center of the nation, and the world.

The arts continue to thrive throughout New York State. Over the past four years, I have raised the amount of public funding given to the New York State Council on the Arts by 56 percent. During the two fiscal years represented by this report, I was pleased to increase the Council's budget by 27.5 percent. These budget increases have supported artists and have made possible the expansion of arts and cultural organizations throughout New York State. As a result, New Yorkers have greater access than ever before to arts activities.

In Fiscal Year 1998, I was especially pleased to provide support for a landmark conference on technology. The *Governor's Conference on Arts and Technology* brought together the arts, business, funding, and education communities to explore the incredible explosion of technological advances that are transforming the creation and marketing of the arts.

The arts have long proven their value as an educational tool through innovative programs such as our Empire State Partnerships project. Since its inception, the Empire State Partnerships project has grown to incorporate 113 schools, 84 cultural organizations, and 34,000 children. When children learn about music, dance, drama, and the visual arts, they learn to appreciate life.

Not only are the arts a vital part of our children's education, they are a vital part of our communities. Where the arts flourish, communities are strong. Throughout New York State the arts are playing a vital role in the transformation and economic revitalization of our communities. Two economic impact reports published during Fiscal Year 1998 found that not only do the arts enrich our lives, they provide a host of economic benefits to New York State. Both reports calculated that in 1995, the total economic impact of the arts in New York State was \$13.4 billion and the state's investment in the arts industry yielded a return of more than 700 percent.

Last but not least, it is with great pleasure I welcome Richard J. Schwartz as Chairman of the Council. Chairman Schwartz has the energy and experience to lead the Council into the 21st Century. Let me also express my gratitude to Chairman Emeriti Earle I. Mack and Kitty Carlisle Hart, whose passionate voices for the arts clearly articulated how much the arts can enrich all of our lives.

I applaud the strength and dedication of all the voices for the arts, with special recognition to Chairman Schwartz, Vice-Chairmen Debra R. Black and Reba White Williams, Council members, and staff for their lasting commitment to the arts. New Yorkers recognize those individuals who contribute their time and energy to promote the arts, and whose work has helped the Empire State earn its reputation as the "arts capital" of the world. The vision and aspirations of these creative individuals will enable us to continue with great confidence into the 21st century.

#### Chairman's Review

hanks to the leadership of Governor George E. Pataki and the support of the State Legislature, the Council is once again prospering. For the fourth straight year, we have received a substantial budget increase. This year's increase took us beyond the \$50 million mark, a milestone that exemplifies New York's firm commitment to the arts.

During the two fiscal years represented by this report, the Council's Local Assistance budget rose from \$32.3 million to \$41.2 million. This support allowed us to expand our institutional grants that play a vital role in maintaining New York State's arts infrastructure. In addition, we continued funding project-based grants that serve as a catalyst in the development of new art forms and community-based activities such as festivals, exhibits and performances.

The Council is especially appreciative of Earle I. Mack, who served as its Chairman during this time. He was a strong advocate for the arts and played a vital role with the Governor and Legislature in the growth of the Council's budget.

In both fiscal years, the Council continued to work closely with the Governor by hosting the *Governor's Arts Awards*. For the past 33 years, these awards have celebrated New York's preeminence in the arts by recognizing some of the state's most accomplished artists, arts organizations, and patrons. With the richest and most diverse arts and cultural opportunities in the world, New York State is enriched by our honoree's service and dedication.

In 1998, after in-depth discussions, the Council adopted a new five-year plan. As part of the plan, we reaffirmed our commitment to discipline-based grantmaking activities. By concentrating on our core values and improving administrative functions, the Council can better provide leadership and resources in areas that address emerging needs and opportunities.

The arts, generally looked upon in terms of their intellectual, emotional, and cultural benefits, now have quantifiable data that reinforces their economic power. *You Gotta Have ART!* published in Fiscal Year 1997 by McKinsey & Company articulates what we have known for a long time. New York leads the nation in terms of the proportion of artists in the labor force. Total employment in the New York State arts sector is almost a half million people. This fact, along with the report's other major findings, clearly demonstrates that the arts are neither a luxury nor a charity, but an industry. The non-profit arts sector continues to play an indispensable role as both an incubator and a bridge to for-profit arts activities. The explosive growth in New York City's film industry can be attributed to the infrastructure created by non-profit arts organizations funded by the Council. The cross-sector sharing of writers, performers, set designers, musicians, and other related professions gives New York a competitive edge that propels it to the forefront of this nation's arts activities.

In addition to the Governor and the Legislature, let me express my appreciation to the Council's Executive Director, Nicolette B. Clarke who has ably led the daily activities of the Council through a dynamic period of renewed growth.

Lastly, I would like to thank the Council members and staff for their determination and commitment to bringing the arts to all New Yorkers. Their efforts will enable New York to maintain its pre-eminent position in the arts as we enter the new millennium.

#### Executive Director's Statement

ver the past few years the New York State Council on the Arts has been reinvigorated through increased financial support from the Governor and the State Legislature. The Council is viewed as a significant force in the development and sustainability of the nonprofit arts industry.

Building on the increased commitment of funds, we developed a five-year plan. The planning process consisted of both an internal evaluation and a field assessment that gathered input from the Council's constituents. The recommendations that grew out of this process framed the agency's vision for the future and determine its priorities, as well as specific strategies to achieve them. The plan, *Renewing NYSCA*: A Five Year View, was adopted on October 22, 1998.

The plan's statement of priorities calls for the Council to continue to be diligent in promoting quality, access, equity, and impact in all its activities. Utilizing a discipline based grantmaking approach, the Council emphasizes leadership development, enhancement of our statewide reach, and cultural diversity. The plan also challenges us to strengthen technical assistance and support for individual artists. Additionally, it identifies education, technology, and cultural tourism as three initiatives where the Council can provide leadership.

During the two years covered in this report, arts-in-education has been a focal point of the Council's work. The Empire State Partnerships project has made significant strides in improving the quality of arts-in-education programs in elementary, middle, and high schools across the state. Over the next few years the advancements made by the Empire State Partnership project will be integrated into the overall activities in the Arts in Education Program. Additionally, we plan to expand our efforts to increase learning opportunities for citizens outside of the k-12 school population.

Supporting the use of technology by artists and arts organizations is recognized as another important area where the Council is making a difference. In 1998, the Council, along with the New York Foundation for the Arts, assembled artists, technology professionals, and interested organizations to foster an exchange of knowledge and ideas regarding the application of new technology in the arts. The enthusiastic success of the statewide *Governor's Conference on Arts and Technology* reinforced the Council's observation that artists and cultural organizations increasingly depend on various digital technologies for creative and administrative purposes.

Cultural tourism is the last of the three areas targeted as a special initiative. During the planning process, it was viewed as an area of interest and opportunity, particularly by cultural organizations outside of Manhattan. We are working to coordinate cultural tourism activities in conjunction with the broad tourism efforts of the Empire State Development Corporation's Division of Tourism.

The plan's priorities and new directions were incorporated in our new *Program Guidelines for Fiscal Year 1999/2000 and Fiscal Year 2000/2001*. The inclusion of these changes represented the first significant revision to program guidelines since 1994.

The Council made significant advancements during this two-year period through the tireless efforts of then Chairman Earle I. Mack. I am deeply grateful for the support and guidance he provided the Council, staff, and me.

Under the new leadership and direction of Chairman Richard J. Schwartz and the other Council members, I am confident the Council will continue to excel. A key ingredient to its success is the dedicated Council staff whose generous service to the arts community is unparalleled. I deeply appreciate their continuing commitment.



# New York State Governor's Arts Awards

stablished in 1966, the New York State Governor's Arts Awards celebrate New York's preeminence in the arts by recognizing some of the State's most accomplished artists, as well as organizations and patrons that exemplify the creativity, diversity, and dedication of artists and art enthusiasts statewide. Each of the recipients of the New York State Governor's Arts Awards is presented with a painted and fabricated brass sculpture, titled "Starburst", created by the late artist, Roy Lichtenstein as a lasting symbol of the gratitude of the State.

In 1998, the Governor's Arts Awards was held in connection with the 150th anniversary of the first women's rights convention in Seneca Falls, New York. In honor of this event, a special tribute was given to Judith

Jamison, Tania Leon, and Beverly Sills, whose landmark contribution to the arts embrace the ideals expressed in Seneca Falls.

"I am honored to salute those individuals whose artistic voyage has extended beyond themselves and into the lives of people worldwide," Governor Pataki stated. "The dedication of each of the recipients is truly a testimony to the greatness of our State and has helped New York earn its reputation as the 'arts capital of the world'."



# Circuits@nys



In 1998, the New York State Council on the Arts (NYSCA) launched a new statewide technology initiative titled circuits@nys. With special funding from Governor George E.

Pataki, NYSCA opened the initiative with the Governor's Conference on Arts and Technology that was held March 27 to 29. Over 600 participants representing government, technology, higher education, foundations, and the arts attended the three-day conference at the Palisades Executive Conference Center in Rockland County.

The conference's main theme was the exploration of technological advances and how they influence the way art is made, presented and preserved as well as its impact on arts organizations' business components. The conference included workshops and demonstrations, performances and exhibitions of digital art, roundtable discussions on artistic practices, policy and technology planning, one-on-one consultations with technology providers, lawyers and technicians, town hall meetings, a trade show, and a *cybercafe*.

Many business leaders and arts service organizations played a significant role in the organization of the conference. The Council's primary partner for this initiative was the New York Foundation for the Arts (NYFA). Their leadership and hard work expanded the impact of this project.

Throughout 1999, the initiative included:

- The publication of The Digital Directory: Arts & Technology Resources for New York State;
- Basic technology workshops hosted by NYFA and Artswire; and
- 14 Arts & Technology Planning Grants awarded from a field of almost 200 applicants. The application process was administered by NYFA.

# Program Highlights Fiscal Year 1998 - 1999

he New York State Council on the Arts (NYSCA) is a funding agency that provides support for activities of nonprofit arts and cultural organizations in New York State and helps to bring artistic programs of high quality to the citizens of the state. The Council has been directed by the State Legislature to maintain the "paramount position of this state in the nation and the world as a cultural center" through the support of nonprofit arts organizations in New York State.

NYSCA strives to provide this support through its core grantmaking activity and by convening the field and discipline leaders, providing information and advisory assistance, and working with partners on special initiatives to achieve mutual goals.

NYSCA invites nonprofit arts and cultural organizations that meet basic eligibility requirements to apply for grants. Applicants must also meet the specific eligibility requirements for those particular NYSCA funding programs and categories to which they apply, and they are evaluated according to NYSCA review criteria. The Council employs a four-step review process involving NYSCA staff, qualified advisory panels, a committee of Council members, and the full Council.

Although the appropriation legislation does not allow NYSCA to contract directly with individuals, certain programs and funding categories have been designed to provide support for individual artists. Through NYSCA's Individual Artists Program and other discipline programs, we assist individual artists with project and production support and with commission grants.

To effectively ensure that cultural support is available to geographically diverse segments of the state's population, the Decentralization Program (DEC) is in place. Through a system of regranting agencies located throughout the state, NYSCA assists in the development of community-based projects. Selected local agencies throughout the state receive Council funding and are authorized to administer the regrant process for professional and avocational arts activities in all artistic disciplines within their communities.

The Council offers grants and supports services to the field through a number of discipline- and field-related programs. The following Program highlights and financial statements are arranged by art disciplines. In addition, NYSCA grantees are listed alphabetically for both Fiscal Years 1998 and 1999.



# Architecture, Planning & Design

he Architecture, Planning and Design Program (APD) was established in 1973 to catalyze excellence in design and planning in the public realm for the benefit of all New Yorkers. The Program has always aimed to increase the awareness and appreciation of the built and designed environment and to advance excellence and innovation in the design and planning fields. FY98 marked the program's twenty-fifth year of achievement.

Four strategies were used in FY98 and FY99 to achieve this mission. Institutional support was offered to 28 organizations across the state whose core mission is to provide programs and/or services in the design, planning and historic preservation fields; the development of design literacy among citizens of the state was encouraged through support of exhibitions and publications; funds for design and planning professionals' fees were awarded to a wide variety of nonprofits and municipalities to create better communities, public spaces and cultural facilities; and the evolution of the design arts themselves were

stimulated and supported by direct grants to individuals in these fields.

APD continued its commitment to supporting design excellence in FY98 with awards made to several particularly notable adaptive use projects. The St. Mark's Historic Landmark Fund received \$19,500 for architect Harold Edelman's fee to convert an old rectory into the Neighborhood Preservation Center – a new home for three nonprofit historic preservation groups as well as meeting rooms, referral services and an "incubator space" for New York City's grass roots preservation movement. This new "hub" for the field opened in November, 1999, to great acclaim. \$20,000 was also awarded to the Irvington Public Library which moved into a nineteenth century industrial building at the foot of the village's Main Street and hired Dobbs Ferry-based architect Steve Tilly to provide design services. This important and enlightened mixed use development includes affordable housing on the upper floors of the building and has proven once again that reactivating fine old buildings benefits

communities enormously. A spectacular piece of new design was also funded in FY98 for the support of the architecture firm Platt Byard Dovell's fee to create the all new Selwyn Studios Building in Times Square for The New 42nd Street. This important complex of rehearsal and office space will serve New York's entire nonprofit performing arts community, but, more to the point, will enliven 42nd Street with its extraordinary façade – a composition of spectrumenhancing dichroic glass and stainless steel blades which will be flooded at night by a state-of-the-art system of multicolored lights.

FY98 also saw the second year of a special initiative that the program undertook in collaboration with the National Trust for Historic Preservation and the Preservation League of New York State. Workshops on financial planning coupled with one-on-one follow-up were held throughout the state for community based nonprofit historic preservation organizations called the New York Preservation Leadership Institute. Staff and board members of 19 groups attended sessions in Buffalo, Albany and New York City.

In FY99 the program was able to support several extremely strong community planning projects in its efforts to help create better, more livable towns and villages across the state. The Towns of Tusten (Sullivan County), Lloyd (Ulster County), and Shawangunk (Ulster County) all proposed terrific projects where the consulting planners and landscape architects were working closely with community residents to enhance and enliven their downtowns. Two other particularly strong projects were supported in FY99. One was a \$10,000 grant to the Architectural League of New York for their publication on the work of French architect and designer Charlotte Perriand, and another was a \$10,500 Independent Project award to architect Steven Cassell to examine how new design technologies are altering the creative thought process. Finally, the program also established an important partnership with the New York City-based Nonprofit Facilities Fund in an ongoing effort to help arts groups with up-front planning when launching into capital projects. That initiative is more fully described in Capital Projects.

# Architecture, Planning & Design Capital Aid

apital Projects makes grants and lowinterest loans available for the improvement, expansion or rehabilitation of existing buildings that are owned or leased by nonprofit cultural institutions receiving programmatic funding from the Council. It supports organizations across the state in all arts disciplines and has given grants to help enhance theaters, dance studios, museums, galleries, and multi-arts, literary, and media centers. Capital Projects has become a critical source of support for essential projects, helping many of New York State's cultural organizations ensure that their facilities are safe, comfortable and accessible to all New Yorkers.

In FY98 the program's maximum grant was doubled. The new \$50,000 maximum reflects the substantial increase in the cost of construction in the 10 years the program has been in existence. Twenty-two organizations received matching grants of up to \$50,000. While many of the funded projects continue to be for basic but essential building renovations, the program saw a substantial increase in the number of requests to help create new homes for flourishing arts organizations. The Center for Exploratory and Perceptual Art in Buffalo moved into its new home in the Market Arcade after

receiving a second grant for interior renovation, and Second Stage Theatre received a grant and loan toward the construction of its new home designed by cutting-edge Dutch architect Rem Koolhaus. The new theater opened to great fanfare in 1999. The program also funds historic preservation and adaptive-reuse, as exemplified by the grant to Historic Hudson Valley for the restoration of the coach house at Montgomery Place for use as an education center.

The Program assists organizations striving to make their facilities more accessible to all New Yorkers. FY99 was the "year of the elevator" as Capital Projects funded the Albany Institute, the Elaine Kaufman Cultural Center, Hubbard Hall, the Reg Lenna Civic Center, and the Rensselaer and Saratoga County Arts Councils to install elevators in their facilities.

Over the years, Capital Projects has mounted workshops, conferences and other programs in an effort to provide useful information to arts organizations planning facilities projects. In FY99 the program provided financial support to the Nonprofit Facilities Fund and the Arts and Business Council to provide technical support and planning assistance to

organizations planning to undertake facilities projects. Both organizations intend to continue their projects in the future. Capital Projects also continued to offer targeted technical assistance consultancies to organizations just getting started on projects and to organizations that have had specific design problems with capital projects. As an example, EI Museo del Barrio received a Technical Assistance Grant for a study on climate control in its Northeast Gallery to determine whether the plans would have a negative impact on the building itself.

The New York State Council on the Arts Capital Projects helps to maintain and enhance New York State's art infrastructure, and in so doing is furthering the Council's goal of giving artists the freedom and space to create along with giving its audiences the opportunity to experience and enjoy their work.

# Arts in Education

he Arts in Education Program (AIE) began as a cooperative effort between the Council and the State Education Department (SED). The primary goal of AIE has been to support curriculum-integrated arts collaborations that involve artists. students and teachers, in pre-kindergarten through twelfth grade classes throughout the state. General Operating Support (GOS) is offered to those cultural organizations whose primary mission is arts in education. Implementation support for in-school residencies makes up the largest portion of AIE-funded activity. Planning and Development support is offered primarily to cultural organizations that are new to the Program, to help them plan projects with their educational partner(s). Special Projects Support has been directed to professional development for teachers and artists, as well as for assessment of ongoing programs. In 1996-97, AIE and SED initiated the Empire State Partnerships (ESP) project. The Council funded twenty-three cultural organizations for the first phase of in-depth collaborations that were expected to embed the arts into school curricula utilizing the New York State Learning

Standards adopted by the Board of Regents in 1996.

In 1997-98, the AIE Program supported 322 requests from 229 cultural organizations—in amounts ranging from \$2,000 to \$300,000—for a broad range of multidisciplinary activity. ESP funding included collaborations between Project UNIQUE and Rochester's School #42, the Arts Council for Chautaugua County and Jamestown High School, the Hangar Theatre and the Ithaca City School District, and American Ballet Theatre and the Frederick Douglass Academy. ESP project teams attended a two-week Professional Development Summer Seminar at the University of Rochester, and an October Assessment Day in Tarrytown. Eighteen additional organizations were awarded ESP planning funds, including the Antique Boat Museum (Clayton), Just Buffalo Literary Center, the Albany-Schenectady League of Arts, and New York City Opera. In 1997-98, AIE continued to support regional workshops and conferences, as well as the Artist in Residence (AIR) and Technical Assistance

# Arts in Education

(TAP) programs at the New York Foundation for the Arts (NYFA). Development funds were used to conduct a technology needs assessment for the arts in education field throughout the state.

In 1998-99, the AIE Program supported 355 requests from 239 cultural organizations around New York State, in amounts ranging from \$2,000 to \$320,000. AIE increased its support to the New York State Alliance for Arts Education for their expanded role in helping facilitate ESP Professional Development. In Buffalo, AIE helped establish a Coalition of Arts Providers for Children that received first-time ESP funding, along with seventeen additional organizations, including Ballet Hispanico, the Everson Museum (in Syracuse), and the Nassau County Museum of Art. The ESP Summer Seminar was held at Sarah Lawrence College in Bronxville. Funds were awarded to the Educational Development Center for assessment of the ESP, and to WNET-TV to produce a half-hour documentary on the ESP. Special Project funding went to such organizations as The Center for Arts Education (the New York City Annenberg

Challenge) for assessment, the Central New York Community Arts Council (in Utica) for artist training, and the Rensselaer County Historical Society (in Troy) for professional development for teachers. Also in 1998-99, AIE awarded first-time support to the New York Foundation for Architecture, the Spanish Repertory Theatre Company, and the Woodstock Guild of Craftsmen.

# Dance

he Dance Program's primary goal is to help make possible dance performances of high professional standards for citizens throughout New York State. Dance organizations eligible for support include ballet, traditional modern and avant-garde, ethnic, jazz and historical dance companies as well as dance service organizations and consortia serving management needs. In addition to providing grants under the categories of General Operating Support, Services to the Field, and Professional Performances – Home Base: the Dance Program offers support for incentive projects such as Building Ballet Repertory, Commissions, Long-Term Residency in New York State, and Rehearsal Space.

Building Ballet Repertory is a process-oriented category, created in response to the dearth of new ballet choreography and choreographers. Through Commissions, dance companies are encouraged to broaden their repertory by inviting guest choreographers to make new works or to restage or reconstruct existing works.

The desire to foster more dance activity upstate led to the Long-Term Residency category. A dance troupe is able to spend

three to six consecutive weeks in residence in an area that is outside New York City and/or its home county, engaging in creative work, community and educational outreach efforts, and public performances. Rehearsal space support helps subsidize those organizations attempting to provide affordable, low-cost studio facilities to dance artists and companies.

In both 1997-98 and 1998-99, the Dance Program continued funding of a developmental project, the New York State DanceForce, which is dedicated to increasing the level of dance activity around the state. In 97-98, the DanceForce was co-administered by Dance Theater Workshop and Pentacle, with \$188,000 in funding through DanceWorks (under the Long-Term Residency category). In the following year, \$191,000 was awarded through the Danspace Project, which took over co-management responsibilities with Dance Theater Workshop. The DanceForce since its inception has consisted of 15 – 17 partners of aesthetic, ethnic, and geographic diversity, who are committed to implementing a state-wide program of locally initiated, short-term artists residencies involving performances and

providing community and educational outreach. Under DanceForce sponsorship, Ralph Lemon, Reggie Wilson, Pepatian, Séan Curran, David Parsons, Doug Elkins, Iréne Hultman, Yoshiko Chuma, Goldhuber/Latsky, Wally Cardona, Elisa Monte/David Brown Dance, and Garth Fagan Dance were among the many artists/companies invited to do residency work in upstate New York communities. Other projects undertaken by DanceForce members included cooperative audience development and marketing efforts by the major presenters, arts-in-education/ teacher organizations, and dance activists in the Capital Region. For the past two years, Erie County's Pick of the Crop has organized a choreographers' showcase featuring the works of emerging artists throughout the state. While, the New York City-based HT Dance Company has selected an upstate choreographer (through an auditioning process) to be presented on their New Steps series at the Mulberry Street Theater.

In 1998-99, through a Technical Assistance grant, the Dance Program commissioned consultant Robert Yesselman to do a preliminary study on the need for an affordable mid-sized (1,000 –1,500 seat)

dance theater in New York City. The absence of such a center was felt to have severely limited the dance field's ability to build audiences, lessened annual performance opportunities, and impacted the financial stability of many New York-based dance companies.

# Electronic Media & Film

he Electronic Media and Film Program (EMF) supports audio art, film, new media and video art. The Electronic Media and Film Program originated in 1966 through the Council's Film Project, showcasing film as an art form through support of local film clubs. The program has always strived to connect artists and audiences. And, it has nurtured the independent media artist. The EMF Program presently supports the exhibition and distribution of the media arts. information and equipment services, production training and residencies, preservation, and other services appropriate to each medium and the Council's diverse constituencies.

In addition to its direct support of arts and cultural organizations, the Electronic Media and Film Program regrants funds to a number of partners to further its reach and support of projects throughout the State. The Experimental Television Center in Owego, administers a production finishing fund, fees for artists to tour with their work and the new technical assistance fund for media arts

organizations, established in FY99. National Video Resources in New York City, is a partner in supporting the distribution of recently completed films and tapes by independent media artists. Media Alliance aides collaborations between upstate organizations through its Media Action Grants.

FY98 brought a number of new applications for media arts organizations to expand their programs in digital media. Dia Center for the Arts received support towards residencies for artists to create new artwork for the World Wide Web. Thunder Gulch, a project of Lower Manhattan Cultural Council, was supported to present new media and video work on a large video wall using public space in the NY Technology Center. The Museum of the Moving Image developed policies and methods for exhibiting on the Internet when the museum added a range of new media projects in its collections. The energy directed to these efforts in no way has eclipsed film. Rather, it has appreciably expanded the audio and moving image artist's palette and exponentially enhanced information services.

FY99 saw increased activity in the area of video preservation. Electronic Arts Intermix served as the sponsor of a fledgling group dedicated to preservation of electronic media. The project developed into Independent Media Arts Preservation (IMAP) and has worked with a number if organizations on cataloging their tape collections. This project was part of the growing movement to preserve the rich legacy of independent media produced in New York State. This effort was further aided by a statewide conference, Video History: Making Connections, held at Syracuse University, October 16-18 1998, (funded through a FY97 NYSCA Challenge Grant to Experimental Television Center).

Film remains a vital part of the EMF Program's funding roster. First time funding was awarded to the Nuyorican Poets Café for its series of screenplay readings, aimed at launching new feature film productions. Joining the constellation of funded exhibitors in FY99 was The Solomon Guggenheim Museum and the Documentary Film Festival (a sponsored project of Women Make Movies).

The Electronic Media and Film Program served as the conduit for NYSCA's Technology Initiative, designed to advance the use and understanding of new technology and the digital arts. Working in partnership with the New York Foundation for the Arts (NYFA), funds were awarded in FY98 for The Governor's Conference on Arts and Technology, also known as circuits @nys: The Arts in a Digital Age, held in Palisades, NY, March 27-29, 1988. It included panels, workshops, demonstrations and exhibitions and was documented via a website (circuitsnys.org).

In FY99, continued funding to NYFA provided technical assistance, the Digital Directory and the pilot year of arts and technology planning grants to support the informed research and planning for the incorporation of new technologies into the programs and operations of non-profit organizations.

# Folk Arts

ver since the Folk Arts Program was established in 1985, it has emphasized the regionalization of folk arts activities and creation of opportunities to reinforce and perpetuate traditions within all of the State's cultural communities. A statewide infrastructure for the folk arts field brought into being by the Program grew to include 15 county-wide and multi-regional programs. Led by staff folklorists, they document and present ethnic, regional, occupational and religious traditions. These programs also assist other organizations interested in developing folk arts activities as well as individual folk artists. Through the Program's support and developmental assistance, the New York Folklore Society expanded in the late 1980s and early 1990s, growing from an all-volunteer group to a thriving service organization. It partners with our Program to provide technical assistance and professional development through a mentoring program.

In 1986 the Program organized the first New York State Folk Arts Roundtable with the Cultural Resources Council of Syracuse and Onondaga County. Held every year, the Roundtable is the primary forum for the

State's network of local and regional folk arts programs. Participants gather to discuss current projects and issues in folk arts and folklife. The themes of the Roundtable have embodied concerns addressed by the Folk Arts Program, including "Community Cultural Empowerment" (1989), "Making a Living as a Traditional Artist (1993), and interpretation of folk arts programs (1995).

Traditional folk artists pass on their traditions through oral tradition and by example, through face-to-face interaction with members of their own community. The Program's Folk Arts Apprenticeships funding category is the Program's primary means for supporting this transmission of traditions. Since this category was initiated in 1984, prior to the establishment of the Program, it has supported a broad spectrum of traditions that have included Puerto Rican cuatro making, upstate old time fiddling and Native American oratory.

The Program expanded the statewide infrastructure to the Hudson Valley in FY 98, by providing General Program Support for a year-round program of the Dutchess County

Arts Council. Two rapidly growing regional folk arts organizations received substantial increases in General Operating Support: Long Island Traditions, and the North Country based Traditional Arts in Upstate New York. A collective conversation about long range planning for the folk arts field occurred at 1998's New York State Folk Arts Roundtable, in a session which contributed to policy formation and guidelines revisions for the Program.

Funding in FY 99 reflected the Program's embrace of an every diversifying range of ethnic and immigrant populations. First time funding was provided to two Korean American organizations, the Center for Korean American Culture and Korean Traditional Performing Arts Center. The Eldridge Street Project was supported for a festival of Jewish traditional arts that included a klezmer group, Torah scribe and a Yiddish storyteller. The problems of refugee artists in maintaining traditions and marketing crafts were featured in a Roundtable session, which included compelling presentations by two Southeast Asian artists.

In 1999, the Program launched a technology initiative that began with workshops on web development and archival documentation databases. Technology-based technical assistance, provided in partnership with the New York Folklore Society, was also made available. Following the mission of the Program, technology is used strategically to perpetuate folk arts through presentation and documentation, enabling them to remain dynamic as living traditions in a rapidly changing world.

# **Individual Artists**

he Individual Artists Program (IND) was formed to promote the creation of work by New York State resident artists and to support the advancement of individual artists and the preservation and documentation of their work. IND allowed artists to apply directly to the Council under the sponsorship of a non-profit organization for artist initiated projects. IND was set-up as a competitive panel process so that artists' proposals were evaluated for artistic quality and originality directly by a NYSCA panel. Artists may apply for Film Production, Electronic Media Production, Composer Commissions, and Theater Commissions. In addition, IND has supported the New York Foundation for the Arts (NYFA) for its Fellowship Program, a \$7,000 cash award, and Special Opportunity Stipend Program (SOS), an up to \$500 grant designed to help artists take advantage of unique opportunities that may benefit their work or career development.

In 1997-1998, the IND Program supported 29 Composer Commissions in amounts ranging from \$2,500 to \$10,000. Commissions covered a variety of genres, including Chamber Music, electronic music, jazz, and scores for theater, dance, and media projects. One commission, Ms.

Melinda Wagner's Concerto for Flute, Strings and Percussion for the Westchester Philharmonic, won the 1999 Pulitzer Prize for Music. IND also supported 30 Film Production projects in amounts ranging from \$10,000 to \$25,000 for documentary, narrative, and experimental films. Several projects were screened at Film Festivals around the world.

In 1998-1999, the IND Program funded 37 Electronic Media Production projects in amounts ranging from \$5,000 to \$25,000 for radio production, multi media installations, web-site creation, and documentary, experimental, and narrative video projects. In 1999, Mr. Robert Levi's radio series on Duke Ellington was aired on National Public Radio nationwide as part of the commemoration of the 100th anniversary of Ellington's birth. Two other projects, Mr. Christopher Kondak's Emperor Jones and Ms. Emily Breer's Classics Exposed, were featured at the 1999 New York Video Festival. IND also supported 23 Theater Commissions in amounts ranging from \$1,500 to \$10,000 for playwrights, directors and designers across New York State. In addition, NYFA was provided support to expand the SOS Program to the Adirondack and Western New York regions, which

completed the expansion of the program to cover every county in New York State with the exception of those in New York City.

Two special projects were supported in 1998-1999. The S.U. Theatre Corporation (Syracuse Stage) was supported to create a new play for family audiences. Kidnapping Kipling resulted in a residency by playwright David Zellnick, a production in Syracuse, as well as a script and educational program that was made available for theaters nationwide. The Volunteer Lawyers for the Arts was supported to develop and implement a series of focus groups and workshops addressing issues of ownership, copyright, and distribution for artistic collaborations and for new technology projects.

During the past two years, The Individual Artists Program has continued to maintain a commitment to providing critical support to a diverse group of individual artists. Emerging artists and first time applicants as well as veterans of their genre received support for their efforts to generate new and original work. At the same time, the Individual Artists Program began to more fully address the work of artists that has been transformed by the growing availability and use of new technologies.

## Literature

'he Literature Program was established to support the creation, publication and dissemination of important literary writing (fiction, poetry, literary non-fiction and drama) throughout the State and to encourage appreciation of literature by a diverse public. The Program is committed to insuring that the Council's literary funding reflect the aesthetic, ethnic and geographic diversity of readers and writers throughout the State. The Program has directed its assistance to non-profit literary centers and presenters, to literary magazines and small presses, and to individual writers through support of literary translation, writers' residencies and the programs of our regrant partner, Poets & Writers, which funds readings and workshops in all of the State's 62 counties.

In FY97-98, the Literature Program received 127 requests totaling \$1,567,095. Public service contracts totaling \$784,183 were awarded across the state in amounts ranging from \$1,000 to \$128,400, reflecting a 23% increase over the FY96-97 budget of \$637,270. Three initiatives undertaken in this

year were Phase II of the Al Poulin Jr. Independent Publishers Project, which sent collections of NYS- published literary magazines to public library systems around the state; the compilation of a literary funders'database: and the establishment of a technical assistance program for literary publishers (NYSTAP) through the Council of Literary Magazines and Presses. The Program also initiated its statewide literary curator's website, www.nyslittree.org, which is managed by Bright Hill Press in Treadwell. Four individual writers were awarded residencies at the Crown Heights Youth Collective in Brooklyn and at Writers and Books' Gell Center in Canandaigua. The literary regrant program at Poets & Writers funded an additional 888 literary events providing appearances by 498 writers and served 59,496 audience members. Also in this year, Just Buffalo Literary Center, funded for General Operating Support through the Literature Program, was a recipient of the New York State Governor's Arts Award.

In FY98-99, the Literature Program received 144 requests totaling \$1,586,092 and

awarded funding totaling \$940,612. The Program worked with representatives of the literary community in the North Country and Adirondack regions to establish the new Adirondack Center for Writing, headquartered at Paul Smiths College in Paul Smiths, New York. Translation support became an everyyear category, and support was awarded for translations into English from the Chinese, German, Japanese, Spanish, and Ukrainian language. Poets and Writers made 523 grants for 918 literary events statewide in this year. In St. Lawrence County, North Country Public Radio (WSLU), long-time recipient of Literature Program funding for its Readers and Writers on the Air series, received the New York State Governor's Arts Award for outstanding public service.

As commercial book producers and bookstores have consolidated within the publishing field, a larger share of the burden of supporting emerging and mid-list writers has fallen to the nonprofit literary sector. Both publishers and literary centers traditionally have experienced a lack of resources for operating support. In FY97-98

and 98-99, the Literature Program remained firmly committed to providing NYS audiences with access to outstanding contemporary literature and literary programming by increasing operating support as well as technical assistance to the State's nonprofit publishers and literary organizations.

# Museum

he Museum Program was established in 1966 as the Council's first disciplinebased funding Program. It has always supported museums of all kinds, including art, history, science and children's museums. For three decades the Program has been steadfast in its commitments to foster responsible stewardship of collections. encourage education as a fundamental dimension of museums, and support exhibitions exploring new topics. It has served as a motor for professional development during most of its history. During the 1970's and 1980's the Program created a museum services infrastructure unparalleled in the nation, centered upon four regional and two statewide professional service organizations that provide consultancies and workshops for collections management, museum education, management and other professional practices.

Deep funding cutbacks to NYSCA in the early 1990's caused cessation of funding for virtually all of these museum services.

Beginning in the mid-1990's, support to regional service organizations was restored.

A statewide professional development and technical assistance program was initiated in

1996 as a partnership with the Regional Council of Historical Agencies, which administers it. The Program also began convening periodic meetings of service organizations that serve as catalysts for initiatives responding to current needs in the museum field.

Support for exhibitions increased by 311% in FY98. This increase reflected the Program's affirmation of the vital importance of exhibitions and the adoption of a new policy of supporting art exhibitions as well as history and science exhibitions in the same year, which were previously only supported in alternating years. This approach recognizes the common criteria that may be applied to exhibitions in different disciplines, and a trend towards interdisciplinary exhibitions. Support was provided to the Brooklyn Children's Museum's exhibition "Together: Exploring the Meaning of Community," which examined how children from several ethnic groups experience community life. Two exhibitions of contemporary Asian art were also supported: "Uncommon Traits: Re/Locating Asia," at Buffalo's Center for Exploratory and Perceptional Art, and "Out of India," at the Queens County Art and Cultural Center. A special Program initiative

assessed travelling exhibitions mounted at mid-sized and large museums. The study found that the organization of travelling exhibitions is a rapidly growing area of activity for many museums, and would need to be developed for travel both in the United States and abroad.

Museum education involves people of all ages in object centered learning activities, opening new horizons with experiences rarely found in school settings. Funding for Museum Education and Interpretation category in FY99 included projects directed to different age groups as well as intergenerational audiences. The Schenectady Museum Association was funded for a new regional art education program targeted to both youth and adults. Public programming supported for the Hudson River Museum's "Drip, Blow, Burn" exhibition encompassed a wide range of programs interpreting contemporary work by American artists who employ wind, water and fire as integral components of their art. It included participatory workshops for families, presentations by the artists for the museum's ongoing "Seniors and the Arts" program, and tours and gallery activities led by teen Junior Docents who serve as gallery "explainers".

New technologies are transforming cataloguing, research and the dissemination of information about collections beyond the walls of museums. As a special project of the Program in FY99, "Consultant on Call" provided free advice about collections management software and related museum technologies. The New York State Association of Museums administered this project in association with the Program. This initiative is among a number of the Program's endeavors to equip museums to meet emerging challenges of new technologies, professional development, collections management, exhibitions and audience education.

## Music

he Music Program supports the production and performance of musical events of high professional caliber for the people of New York State. The Program also supports music service organizations, radio production and broadcast, recordings, projects in new music technology, technical assistance and a musical instrument revolving loan fund.

The vitality of the Music Program stems from the extraordinary diversity and richness of musical expression found in New York State. Enhancing the quality of musical endeavor and broadening its availability to a large and growing audience continues to be an important goal of the Music Program. Both as a demonstration of artistic potential and as a vital social resource, music has figured prominently in the Council's mandate to improve the quality of life in New York State.

During 1997-98, the Music Program disbursed \$3,429,198 to 218 organizations. Grants ranged from \$2,000 to \$219,647 and provided support for over 10,500 musical events throughout the state's sixty-two

counties. In addition, \$293,954 from the Musical Instrument Revolving Loan Fund resulted in nine low-interest loans to nonprofit music organizations for the purchase of musical instruments.

Approximately half of the grants of the Music Program went to small performing ensembles, which provide a lion's share of musical performances in the state. Most of these groups, which include traditional chamber music, new music, early music, jazz groups and small opera companies, are artistrun, and employ some of the most innovative musicians in the world. Many of them are taking music in new directions.

As the relationship between art and technology grows steadily closer, music technology has become increasingly common in the composition, production and presentation of music. To function within this changing environment, composers need education, direction and personal time on well-designed systems. To this end, the Music Program provides funds to Harvestwork, Inc. and Lear Studios of Rensselaer Polytechnic

# Music Music

Institute for composers interested in instruction and experimentation on electronic and computer music systems.

During 1998-99, the Music Program disbursed \$3,627,950 to over three hundred music applicants. An additional \$212,143 in low-interest loans was awarded to seven nonprofit music organizations for the purchase of eight musical instruments. In the same fiscal year, the Music Program presented two regional conferences. The gatherings, were held in Buffalo and Uniondale, Long Island. Musicians, board members, volunteers, and supporters of all groups producing or presenting music in those locations attended. The theme of the conferences was Art Music in an Age of Pop: Meeting the challenges of presenting music at the end of the 20th century.

In summation, through its various services to its field, the Music Program has reached organizations and the general public in every county, and has made it possible for more New Yorkers to take part in our exceptional cultural life.

# Presenting

ince its earliest years, the Council has strived to provide the residents of New York State access to a rich range of exciting, innovative, adventurous, and culturally diverse performances by the finest performing artists in the world. In 1962, the Touring Program was established to provide support for six outstanding companies as the New York City Opera and Ballet to tour over 46 upstate communities. In 1971-72. presenters began to receive support through the Council's newly established Dance, Music and Theatre Programs while the Touring Program, renamed the Presenting Organizations Assistance Program (POAP). remained as a seeding program for emerging or limited request presenters. POAP was administered by the New York Foundation for the Arts. In 1977-78, POAP was reabsorbed by the Council in accordance with legislative mandate, and to respond directly to the distinct needs of the growing number of the state's presenters.

Over the years, the purpose of the Presenting Program has been to develop, nurture, support and strengthen presenters through grants, initiatives and services. Support has been directed to the state's large, internationally distinguished institutions as well as to the numerous small volunteer organizations in underserved rural areas crucial to the cultural lives of their

communities. Thousands of performances of exciting work by leading and emerging classical, contemporary and culturally diverse artists have been supported over the past thirty years in almost every county of the state. Some of the highlights include tours by the New York City Ballet and American Ballet Theatre, a 20 site tour by Syracuse Stage, a 9 site tour by Dance Black America, the International Festival of Puppet Theatre in Manhattan, DanceAfrica in Brooklyn, Latino and Old Songs Festival in Queens and Albany counties respectively.

In FY98, a total of \$1,889,261 was awarded to 137 organizations in 37 counties for the presentation of over 3,000 performances. Over 70% of the funding was directed to presenters outside Manhattan. Priority support was given to organizations presenting balanced seasons of outstanding quality, and to those that incorporated into their seasons the presentation of lesser known artists, women, or artists of color, new work, and unique programming that carried higher financial risks. First time support was given to The New 42nd Street on behalf of the diverse, creative and excellent quality presentations for young audiences at The New Victory Theatre while Franklin Furnace was supported for introducing its presentations over the Internet. New presenters were supported in Westchester

county for dance and music concerts, and in Essex county for a culturally diverse 3-day Festival of the Lakes which featured dance, music and puppetwork.

In FY99, a total of \$2,166,867 was awarded to 138 organizations in 38 counties for the presentation of over 3,300 performances. As in the prior year, over 70% of the funding was directed to presenters outside Manhattan. The funding patterns continued to focus on organizations with exemplary and adventurous programming. First-time support was awarded to the Harbor Festivals Guild in Oswego county for the presentation of dance and music performances by Asian and folk artists within a major festival, to the Hudson Opera House in Columbia county for a diverse series of performances by contemporary artists, and to the Kitchen Theatre Company in Tompkins county for performance art. The Henson Foundation received support for its unique International Puppet Festival, and American Composers Orchestra received support for its excellent weeklong festival of Latin American Music.

To stimulate the presentation of dynamic programming, the Program has produced artist showcases/conferences as well as marketing workshops focusing on contemporary work. More recently the Program has addressed the need to explore

issues relating to the presentation of quality performing arts for young people. In February, 1999, a Think Tank Retreat resulted in a Report outlining guiding principles and strategies to advance quality work for young people. A Theatre Commissioning Initiative sought to promote the creation of new, affordable, and easily tourable theatre for young audiences while travel funds were made available to assist with expenses related to seeing quality presentations for young audiences at various locations.

In FY98 and FY99, the Program addressed management issues through two initiatives -Technology and Professional Development. In FY98 and FY99, the Program supported over 45 organizations with the purchase of software ranging from development and marketing to box office packages, as well as training. A dedicated Listserver was introduced which allowed presenters to promptly and inexpensively communicate with each other regarding numerous presenting issues. Through the Professional Development initiative, a series of roundtable discussions took place in Albany, Woodstock, Lake Placid, Syracuse, Corning, and Buffalo. Support for consultants was provided to individual presenters as well as to the annual Upstate Presenters Retreat and to the Small Presenters Association of Central New York.

# **Special Arts Services**

he Special Arts Services Program (SAS) advances the Council's commitment to cultural pluralism through its funding to multi-disciplinary arts activities within the African-Caribbean, Latino/Hispanic, Asian/Pacific Island and Native American/Indian communities, as well as other ethnic groups seeking to perpetuate distinct artistic traditions. The Program enriches the cultural landscape of the state by aiding in the development of community-based artists and arts institutions, and fostering the growth and capabilities of other, more emerging arts groups of quality and potential. In addition, the Program fosters outreach to specific communities by improving access to arts training and cultural-heritage education through performances, exhibitions, workshops and special initiatives.

Since its creation in 1967, the Special Arts Services Program has provided arts training and professional showcase opportunities in a variety of arts disciplines. The Program's concern for the institutional health and stability of organizations serving distinct communities is reflected by an ongoing commitment to its mission of embracing a

wide range of artistic expression found throughout New York State.

In keeping with its mandate, the Special Arts Services Program offers categories designed to support critical administrative functions and to further both the artistic capabilities and outreach potential of its multi-ethnic constituency.

For example, the innovative Technical Assistance Program (TAP) developed by Special Arts Services and unique to NYSCA, is approaching a decade of strengthening the managerial operations of small and mediumsized organizations statewide. In New York City's Harlem, Harlem School of the Arts serves as the conduit for this program. Through this vital initiative, numerous organizations greatly benefited by using the Program's customized consultancies designed to assist emerging and developing organizations.

In FY98 SAS continued its investment to New York State's multicultural organizations and artists and addressed the growing need for basic support of programs and activities in neighborhood settings. In Harlem,

organizations such as Frank Silvera's Writers Workshop was given support to help continue its long-standing history of nurturing professional artists and offering a platform for the exposure of new talent. Support was also directed to the Skylight Gallery in Brooklyn's Bedford Stuyvesant Restoration Corporation, a model program and an important showcase for emerging and established visual artists. The organization Centro Civico of Amsterdam, serving New York's Capitol district, presented a popular traditional arts training program focusing on Latino music and dance for young people in the area. Serving as NYSCA's final Upstate Challenge recipient, the Music Conservatory of Westchester continued and expanded their Music Learning for Life Program. In addition, NYSCA's Challenge grant supported Tier II Conservatory scholarships during FY98's academic year (this program's second year of operation).

The FY99 season continued in the same vein, adding luster to an already established record of support to organizations that enrich the daily lives of a rapidly expanding multi-ethnic population. Arts programs responding to these needs can be found in every corner of the State. Buffalo's Neto Hatinakwe

Onkwehowe exhibited the works of Native American artists working in a variety of mediums. The New York Bandura Ensemble in Queens offered a training and performance program focusing on traditional Ukrainian arts. Chinese Musical Arts in NYC's Chinatown, noted for its quality and outreach, offered diverse contemporary and traditional music performances to the Chinese American community.

The growth of community-based arts organizations in the State could not have occurred without substantial NYSCA support over many years. SAS led the way in development of these artists and institutions, at the same time acknowledging their uniqueness and special contribution to the arts community. The Special Arts Services Program continues to offer creative opportunities for this important population by supporting its programs and activities in neighborhood locales and recognizing that art is a formidable tool for transformation and enlightenment.

# State & Local Partnerships

he State and Local Partnership Program (SLP) was initiated in FY90, as the merger of three distinct program areas, to focus the Council's support of community based cultural development activity in New York State. The Program has provided a framework for the Council's partnership with local arts agencies operating throughout New York State that share the goal of enhancing the quality and improving access to the arts at the local level.

Through its support of community arts centers, local arts councils and multi-arts service organizations, this Program has encouraged the long-term cultural development of all the communities or regions of the state and has helped to position the arts as a prominent and important part of community life. SLP support to local arts organizations encourages community involvement in the arts, the development of effective local arts leadership and improved access to high quality, professional arts and cultural activities. SLP encourages local organizations to broaden the base of local support for all artists and arts organizations within a community to improve the climate for cultural development and to increase participation in the arts by all segments of the state's population.

During FY98, the State and Local Partnership Program targeted support to several important areas of development among local arts agencies including staff development, local/regional partnership building, and community arts program enhancement. Council support has encouraged partnership building on a regional basis. Arts North, a coalition of local arts agencies operating throughout the state's North Country, has launched a comprehensive, unified promotional campaign designed to boost the visibility of the arts throughout this rural region. Through SLP support, the Jamaica Arts Center developed a new multi-cultural arts festival in collaboration with the Jamaica Development Corporation. Support was also directed to the Arts Council for Wyoming County who spearheaded a multi county effort to create a comprehensive regional cultural guide for Western New York. As a special initiative, SLP sponsored the fourth annual gathering for New York's community based Multi-Arts Centers. Over 50 representatives of local arts centers came together to build a network of community agencies that will enhance their individual capacity for service to their communities.

During FY99 SLP continued its commitment to support staff and professional development

efforts among local arts agencies. The Program initiated a comprehensive, statewide Service Organization Assessment Project designed to measure the impact of local arts agencies as service providers and catalysts for local arts development in the state. Information generated through this process continues to assist the Council and local arts agencies in efforts to improve and enhance service delivery at the local level. Tonawandas Council on the Arts, serving Niagara County, was awarded first-time support as an emerging community arts center. SLP support was awarded to the Alliance for the Arts for a comprehensive New York City Culture Atlas. In addition, the Program hosted a major Technical Assistance Symposium, which attracted over 60 local arts agency leaders to Saratoga Springs in May, 1999. This event served as an effective vehicle to increase collaboration among arts service agencies to increase access to arts services by artists, arts groups and community residents.

# State & Local Partnerships Decentralization

he Council established the Decentralization Program (DEC) in 1978 pursuant to the mandate of State Legislature to encourage increased participation at the local level in the state's cultural funding process. The purpose of Decentralization is to foster the continued development of local cultural resources responsive to community cultural needs.

Local decision making is the basic principle of the DEC Program. Through a network of more than 40 local arts organizations, DEC delivers Council support, in the form of regrants, to over 1200 grassroots cultural and community organizations throughout the state. Through DEC, the Council is able to extend its efforts to reach every corner of the state with high quality arts programs and to support the development and creativity of individual artists working at the community level. The DEC Program helps to ensure access to arts and culture to the citizens of New York State, especially to areas that are geographically isolated, economically disadvantaged, or ethnically diverse.

In addition to providing re-grant support, DEC sites serve as technical and developmental assistance providers aiding in the growth and

professional development to enhance the cultural climate in communities and neighborhoods where they live and operate. These sites form a statewide network of services, which is integral to the state's continued cultural development.

In FY 98 the DEC Program updated and revised its procedure manual which describes the policies and framework within which each local DEC site must operate. The Program continued its efforts to expand the boundaries of DEC by funding two new categories of local support, DEC Tiers, for individual artists and local organizations. The completion of a statewide assessment of the DEC Program allowed the Council to examine DEC's effectiveness and consider future directions for this Program. The Albany/Schenectady League of the Arts was one of 18 DEC sites that received support for community-based artists grants through the DEC Tier process.

In FY99 the Program continued to expand its implementation of the DEC Tier projects offering support for the establishment of over 25 new Tiers at sites throughout the state. In response to the continued staffing and human resource needs of the DEC field, the Program offered support to local DEC internships on a

In FY99 DEC implemented efforts to streamline its reporting process by making greater use of technology. # Theatre

he Theatre Program supports non-profit professional theatre in New York State. from institutional theatres to nontraditional and experimental organizations. Theatre companies receive General Operating Support for unrestricted use or Professional Performances funding for their production seasons. Special Projects support encourages new ideas and creative initiatives that address artistic and managerial needs. Support in the Services to the Field category is directed to service organizations and to projects that provide managerial, artistic, or information services to individual theatre artists and/or organizations. New Theatre Advancement is committed to supporting the development of theatre organizations that demonstrate artistic potential and accomplishment. The Program's basic goal is to contribute to a healthy balance of the elements that make up a vital community: producing organizations, artists, service organizations, and audiences.

In 1997-98, the Theatre Program's budget was increased by almost 15% to a total of \$2,693,654. General Operating Support was given to 101 theatres, 52 theatres were funded under Professional Performances, and 24 theatres were supported under New Theatre Advancement. Services to the Field

funding went to 17 organizations, including the Non-Traditional Casting Project, Hands-On Sign Interpreted Performances, the New York Public Library for its Theatre on Film and Tape Archive, and Performing Arts Journal for its publications. Among the organizations receiving first-time New Theatre Advancement support were Adobe Theatre in New York City, and Time and Space Limited in Hudson (Columbia County). Special developmental support went to the New York Shakespeare Festival for its Lab Program that helps develop artists and new work, and to the Vivian Beaumont Theatre for its Directors Lab Project.

In FY98, the Theatre Program began to address the needs of theatres that primarily serve young audiences. Support was granted to such organizations as TADA! (The Theatre and Dance Alliance) and City Lights Youth Theatre, both in New York City, and the Theatre of Youth in Buffalo. The Program also continued to support a wide variety of projects through the NYSCA Theatre Program Technical Assistance Fund, which is administered by the Alliance of Resident Theatres of New York.

In 1998-99, the Theatre Program reaffirmed its commitment to maintaining a healthy balance among all of the elements that make

up a vital theatre community: producing companies, artists, service organizations, and audience development. The Program addressed some funding levels by responding to developmental priorities that called for greater support for mid-sized and new theatres. Regrant and Technical Assistance funds were made available for these organizations. The maximum funding level in the New Theatre Advancement category was raised to \$7,500 from \$5,000.

The Theatre Program's allocation in FY99 was \$2,982,796, which represented an 11% increase over the previous year. Unrestricted General Operating Support was awarded to 90 organizations, 56 companies received funding under the Professional Performances category for their theatre production activity, and 22 young theatres were funded under New Theatre Advancement. Special developmental funds assisted mid-sized theatres to help upgrade and integrate computer software, create web sites, and use these new tools for marketing and development. Among the organizations that received support under the Services to the Field category were: The Drama League (for its Directors' Project), High 5 (for its Tickets to the Arts Program for students), and the International Theatre Institute of the United States (for its support of artist residencies).

New Theatre Advancement support went to such first-time funding recipients as Daedalus Theatre Company, the Drama Department, and Voice and Vision, Incorporated. The Alliance of Resident Theatres of New York received support for its Nancy Quinn Fund, which supports technical assistance for young theatres. The Stage Directors and Choreographers Workshop Foundation received support under Services to the Field for its training programs for theatre professionals. Theatre Talk Productions received support for its series of cable television programs about issues in contemporary theatre. The Theatre Program also sponsored a series of roundtables on the status of women in theatre, as part of an ongoing initiative to address issues of diversity.

# Visual Arts

priority of the Visual Arts Program funding is to reflect the wide range of experimental work created by New York State living artists through organizations. Applicants are encouraged to take risks, offer new opportunities to artists and to interpret contemporary art for the public. The Visual Arts Program encourages interactions and dialogue between artists and directly supports the creative process. Workspace programs are seen to be instrumental in advancing this goal. Ongoing exhibition programs bring new work to the public statewide.

In FY98 a major grant was awarded to Robert Blackburn's Printmaking Workshop for the extraordinary significance of the organization's print collection and its valued workspace program. Funding was given to assist with the first intensive inventory and curation of the collection, which dates from 1948 to the present, and contains an estimated 15,000-18,000 pieces. Mr. Blackburns' Workshop has assisted innumerable artists during its illustrious history and continued its support through mentoring, residencies and outreach.

The Council also chose to support stabilization and expansion grants for

workspaces during this fiscal year. Dieu Donné Papermill in Manhattan was able to extend its residency program in FY98 and Islip Art Museum received continuing support for its Carriage House Project, a specifically designed space for contemporary artists to create and exhibit experimental work.

In FY98-99 the Visual Arts Program awarded, on a competitive basis, \$27,500 in technical assistance grants throughout the state. These grants were used to complete short-term projects or tasks and ranged in scope from creating an organizational brochure, to research assistance, to paying salaries of part-time gallery sitters.

Franklin Furnace received funding to advance its archival research project on the history of performance art in the United States from 1971- present. Painting Space 122 celebrated its 20th anniversary and the Lower East Side Printshop its 30th. Funding was awarded to produce a catalogue documenting each of these organization's accomplishments and exhibitions were planned.

Delaware Valley Arts Alliance completed its final year administering the Visual Arts Program's Curatorial Initiatives pilot project.

# Visual Arts

The success of this pilot, intended to support increased professional opportunities for emerging curators, indicated a true need in the field. The goals of the Curatorial Initiatives pilot were subsequently written into the Program's guidelines, published in FY2000.

Program funding in these two years indicated a stabilization and maintenance for ongoing exhibitions, workspace programs and publications pertaining to the contemporary visual arts issues. Long term projects begun and both the Program and its applicants concluded development efforts. Very importantly, the Program, through its funding, made consistent contributions to increasing the dialogue between the public and the creative artist at a statewide level.

# NYSCA and the Regranting Process

As a matter of policy, the New York State Council on the Arts, through several of our programs, supports regrants in order to broaden service and outreach to our constituents. What follows is a brief description of our regrant programs.

The Architecture, Planning & Design Program offers two regrant programs. The Essex Community Heritage Organization in Essex administers regional technical assistance for the North Country. The Program's main statewide regrant effort is a partnership with the Preservation League of New York State to give grants for documentation projects in the field of historic preservation: historic structures and landscape reports as well as cultural resources surveys.

The Electronic Media & Film Program offers several regrant initiatives. Through the Experimental Television Center in Owego, matching monies are made available for artists to appear with their work as well as for the film and video screening expenses; **Experimental Television Center also** administers a Technical Assistance Fund. Through National Video Resources in Manhattan, funds have been awarded to assist in the distribution of completed audio, film and video productions. In addition, an initiative to promote media arts networking upstate with the assistance of Media Alliance in Manhattan has been established, funding a variety of projects.

The <u>Individual Artists Program</u> rotates funding categories on an annual basis. In FY 98, the program supported grants to artists in the categories of Film Production and Composer Commissions. In FY 99, the program supported grants to artists in the categories of Media Production and Theatre Artist Commissions. In addition to these sponsored project grants, the program regrants a portion of its allocation to the New York Foundation for the Arts for its statewide Fellowship program and Special Opportunity Stipend program.

The <u>Literature Program</u> funds Poets and Writers of Manhattan which, in turn, sponsors workshops and readings in all sixty-two counties of the state.

The Technical Assistance Program of the Special Arts Services Program assists the institutional development of art organizations of color and those serving distinct ethnic communities throughout the state. With ongoing support from the National Endowment for the Arts and renewed support from the Council, the Technical Assistance Program is now a two-tiered initiative. Grants are made to emerging and developing multicultural arts organizations to improve critical managerial and organizational development issues with the assistance of a professional consultant or consultant team.



# Funding by County

1997-1998

The Council's appropriation act mandates that "the residents of each county receive arts services proportionate to at least 40 cents per capita of population in each county, except the Council grant standards of artistic quality and administrative competence must be met." In 1997-98 and in 1998-99 the Council awarded grants to organizations in the state counties in the amounts detailed below. The required amount is based on the 1990 census figures. The Council's response to the mandate is made through grants to organizations that apply to any and all Council Programs through the normal application process.
