

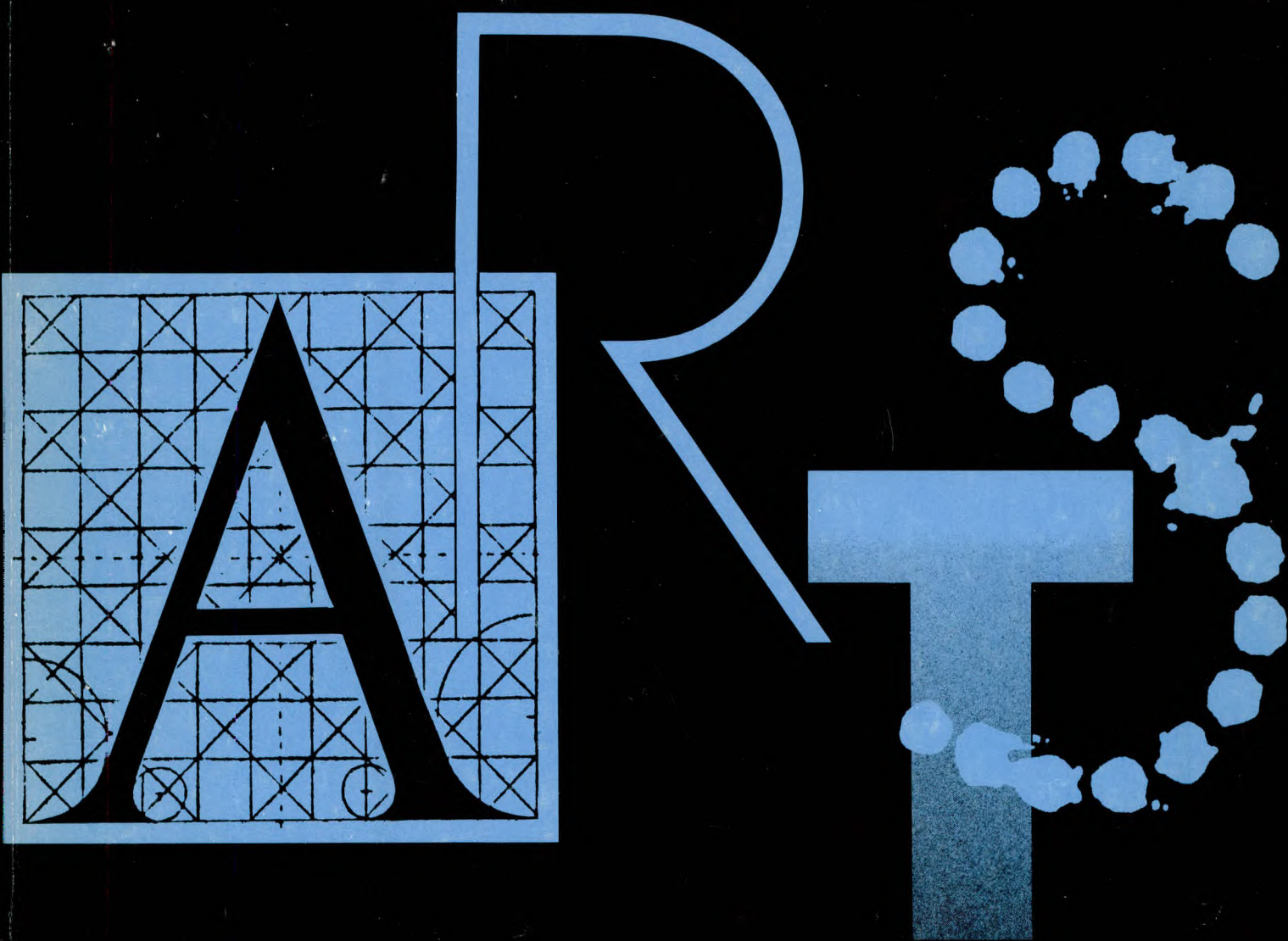

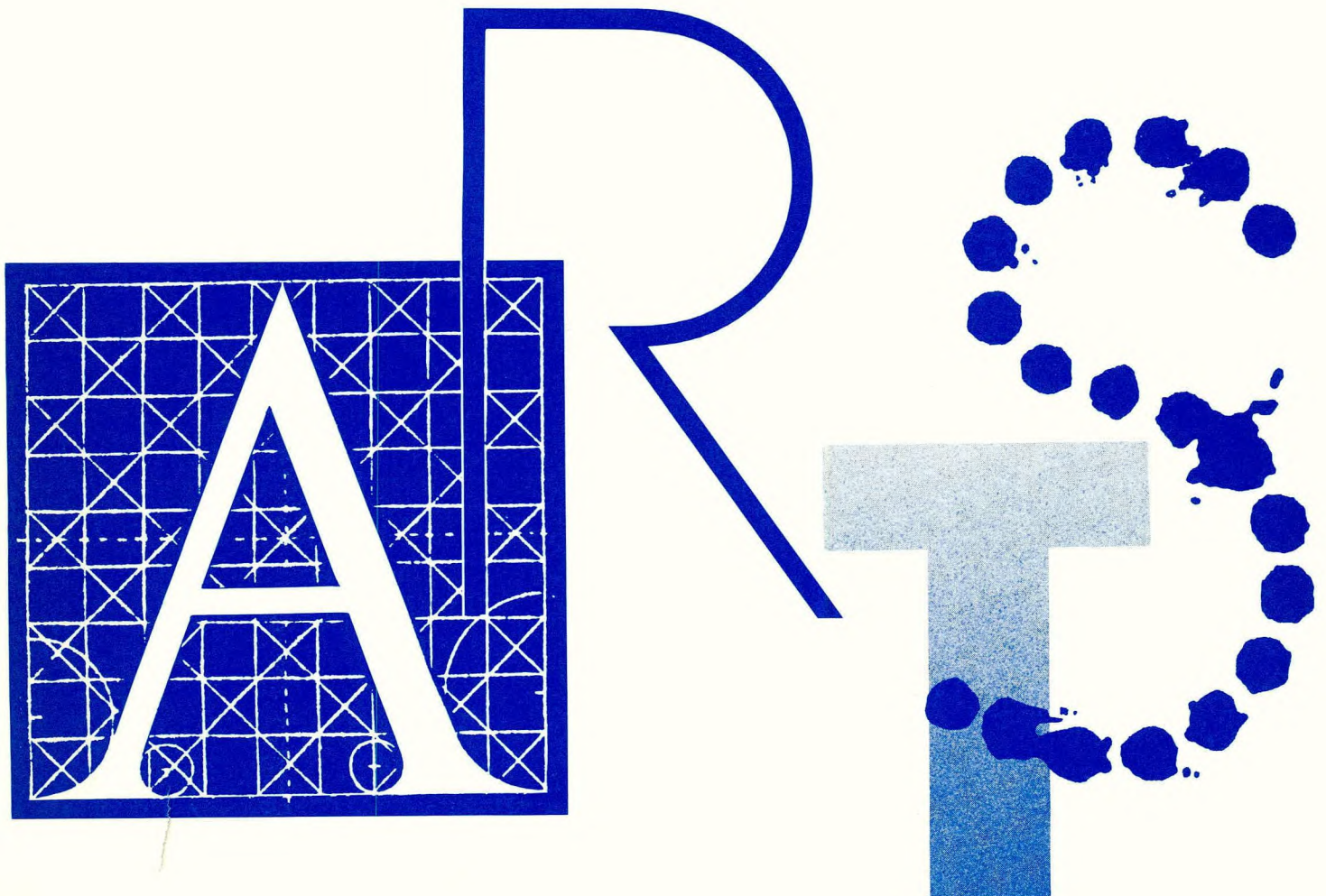

This 1983-84 funding report of the New York State Council on the Arts demonstrates, once again, our unswerving commitment to the artists and arts organizations in the Empire State. We are proud of the fact that our State has the largest arts agency in the nation. We are proud of the historical note that our efforts to assist the arts predated the nation's by five years. Indeed, we are proud that our State is the arts capital of the world and we have no intention of relinquishing that position which so many individuals and groups have helped us to achieve.

The 1983-84 fiscal year began with the State facing an unprecedented budget deficit. However, by the end of the fiscal year, we were able, with the assistance of the Legislature, to announce that the State Arts Council's budget for the ensuing 1984-85 fiscal year would be the largest for any state in the nation's history. Clearly, we had turned a corner and em-

barked upon a new era of artistic growth and development.

On a personal level, the high point of the 1983-84 arts funding year took place on March 13, 1984 in Albany. On that snowy evening, I presided over the 1984 New York State Governor's Arts Awards ceremony. These awards were discontinued in 1976 in the midst of the State's fiscal constraints. I was delighted to be able to announce that our State would again honor those very talented artists, generous patrons, and art appreciation groups that work so tirelessly to satisfy the creative needs of the Family of New York State.

I reminded those assembled of what art and artists mean to all New Yorkers. Their work, and genius, and dedication, and creativity, and magic help make all of our lives more enlightened and fulfilled. Artists and arts groups are among our State's most important natural resources. As New Yorkers, they guide us to see the world differently; to understand its dignity and fragility; to help us capture and recapture the wonder that time so often wears away. They please us and entertain us and teach us. But, perhaps most importantly, they help draw us closer together to

one another and closer to the truths that matter.

My feelings about the arts did not end with the awarding of the last award that evening. They are strengthened each day as I travel around our great State and see the richness and variety of the spirit of our people embodied in their creative genius. The artists and arts organizations listed in this report are to be commended, one and all, for the part they play in maintaining our tradition of artistic excellence.

Finally, I would like to acknowledge the excellent work that the New York State Council on the Arts performs under the leadership of Chairman Kitty Carlisle Hart, her fellow board members, and the Council's panelists and staff. Together, we shall work to enhance artists and arts groups throughout the State; and, in doing so, to help enrich the lives of all New Yorkers.



It has been over eight years since I was first appointed as Chairman of the New York State Council on the Arts. Each of these years has had its own changes and challenges. And, each year, I have travelled all over this great State to meet with arts organizations and civic groups to discuss our Council's current and future goals. The 1983-84 fiscal year was no exception as our Council moved forward in new areas and improved upon existing programs and procedures.

During the year outlined in this funding report, the Council received requests for assistance from 1,844 organizations and, by the end of the year, support was awarded to 1,239 of these groups. Utilizing our funds, as well as those from other sources, arts organizations and institutions in each of the State's 62 counties were able to continue our State's proud tradition of excellence in the arts. The creative needs of the Family of New York State, which Governor

Cuomo alluded to in his foreword, are enhanced by our Council's efforts as we maintain our world-renowned position of arts leadership.

The 1983-84 funding year was a most exciting one for our Council. Folk arts apprenticeships and minority internships were awarded to organizations all across the State. The grassroots Decentralization Program continued to expand. The Council sponsored the first New York State New Music Network Tour which provided scores of New Yorkers with the opportunity to hear first-hand some of the finest contemporary musicians in the world. The Council initiated its Local Incentive Funding Test (L.I.F.T.) which helped stimulate local government support for the arts in many varied communities. In addition, the Council expanded its categories of general operating support, while also adopting a policy of multi-year support which will be extremely beneficial to many eligible arts groups in the days and years ahead.

Despite its limited funds, and the ever-increasing requests for assistance, the Council adopted a position during the 1983-84 fiscal year to provide more funds than ever before (\$1.1 million) for individual artists fellowships

in the ensuing year. But the best news regarding fiscal concerns occurred at the end of the year when the Governor and the Legislature agreed to increase the Council's Local Assistance budget (or, "grants budget" as it is more often called) to a record high \$35.3 million for the 1984-85 funding year. This is the largest amount any state has ever made to its state arts agency in our nation's history. A great deal of credit for this increase is due to our constituency—representatives of arts groups of all sizes—both in New York City and all around the State, who exhorted their elected officials to increase public funding of the arts in the Empire State.

Finally, as Governor Cuomo also mentioned, this current year saw the revival of the Governor's Arts Awards. The gala ceremony in Albany served notice to everyone that New York State truly appreciates its artists, patrons, communities, and arts organizations that continuously provide the best there is in the arts for our fellow New Yorkers and for the multitudes of visitors to our great State.

Looking back over the 1983-84 fiscal year, I find that it was one filled with difficult funding decisions, exciting new initiatives, and positive changes which, in the final analysis, are some of the many reasons that the arts are alive and prospering in New York State. Accordingly, I would like to take this opportunity to thank everyone who has helped to make our

agency such an effective one. My fellow board members provide their time, energy, and advice in a most constructive manner. Our peer panelists bring to their task a wealth of knowledge that is quite unparalleled. And, our staff, under the capable leadership of our Executive Director, Mary Hays, is the most diligent, hard-working, and energetic group one could ever hope to assemble.

Finally, I would like to especially thank Governor Mario M. Cuomo for his encouragement and support of our Council, as well as our State's many talented artists and arts groups. Similarly, I would like to thank the leadership and membership of the best Legislature in the

land for their constant support. Their concern, and the Governor's, is mirrored by our enlightened fellow citizens and taxpayers who constantly remind their representatives in Albany that the arts help bring us all closer together. The Council and its beneficiaries are blessed, and extremely grateful, for the confidence we receive from so many people.

1983-84 signaled a year of significant challenge and achievement for the New York State Council on the Arts. Severe economic stringencies left the Council with both diminished grant funds and administrative resources. These circumstances demanded creative responses which would insure that the Council responsibly fulfill its obligations in disbursing public funds while providing the most appropriate forms of support to the arts constituencies it serves. The Council undertook a variety of initiatives which formed the basis of a concerted effort to assist the State's arts groups and the public's accessibility to them. Many of these initiatives have been the result of several years of discussion and deliberation.

1983-84 also marked the thirteenth year of the Council's substantial grants program through local assistance funds. Over that period of time the Council has supported and nurtured thousands of arts groups of all

natures and sizes. Indeed, the overwhelming majority of these groups have become familiar, reliable and constant constituents of the Council. Many of them perform services to the citizens of New York from a creative desire to achieve their own educational, cultural and artistic goals. Their record of performance is extraordinary. In 1983-84 the Council decided that it was time not just to acknowledge this record informally, but to recognize it in its funding policies and practices. The Council realized it was counterproductive to the constituents and wasteful of its own resources to offer support, contract for that support and monitor the supported activity, as if it would not be undertaken and completed without such scrutiny, when in fact the opposite was substantially closer to the truth.

The Council determined to avoid the increasing governmental tendency to excessive regulatory specificity and monitoring. The Council, therefore, expanded the availability of general operating support and began to offer multi-year applications to parts of its constituency. The Council hopes to expand this type of support over the next several years.

Through these actions the

Council recognized the very special nature of the arts constituency. It is a constituency that wants to serve the public, to create works of art for the public and to be seen and heard by the public. Inherent in any artistic endeavor is a symbiotic relationship with the public. The Arts Council can encourage the expansion of this relationship. The Council must offer support, however, in a manner that does not create barriers in the path of its constituency's operations and activities. The Council hopes, through its leadership, to demonstrate to other governments and others in government that the State can perform a valuable service to its citizens and its direct constituency without overwhelming either of them in regulation or direction.

The Council reexamined the needs and development of the arts constituency over the past several years. The Council recognized that arts activity was growing in diverse areas and communities around the State, but that its growth was taking place without a concurrent growth of support for the activity from other than governmental sources. The Council also recognized its continuing obligation to fulfill Legislative mandates concerning per capita targets and "primary" institutions. Funding for the arts entails a never-ending struggle to strike a balance between support for the large, established organizations and the small, experimental and developing arts organizations in which the

Council now finds an increasing number of minority, ethnic and small local arts groups. The Council decided, in view of the issues raised and the reduction in its 1983-84 appropriation that it would channel more of its funding to those quality arts groups serving the diverse communities of the State and also to channel more of its funding to individual artists' activities.

The Council also took stock of its role in the philanthropic fabric of support for the arts. As a result of its examination, the Council determined to increase its efforts and programs to stimulate and expand certain other sources that contribute to the pluralistic pattern of giving in this country. The Local Incentive Funding Test offered a new programmatic means of encouraging county and local governments to expand their commitment to local arts activities. The Council also began exploring methods by which it could assist and stimulate greater corporate involvement in support of the arts.

It is hoped that these initiatives will continue and expand in the coming years as the Council, through its leadership and actions, strives to provide the greatest assistance to the arts community while increasing the accessibility of quality arts activities to all the citizens of this fabulously diverse State.

In the pages that follow, the reader may gain an extraordinary insight into the variety and richness of the arts taking place through New York State. The Council's support of these activities is substantially due to the unsurpassed dedication, hard work and devotion brought to the Council by its staff, its advisory panels and the Council members themselves. The citizens of this State are truly fortunate to have such individuals participating in its public service.

Introduction

The Council's twenty-third year began on an austere note. The agency's Local Assistance Budget was reduced from \$32.5 million for 1982-83 to \$32 million for the 1983-84 fiscal year due to the State's severe fiscal restraints. Local Assistance funds are those by which the Council contracts with nonprofit arts organizations and institutions in each of the State's sixty-two counties to provide arts services to citizens of the Empire State.

The Council received 6,193 requests for assistance totaling \$84,434,294 from 1,844 applicant organizations during 1983-84. Of this total number of applicants, 1,239 (or 67%) were funded. Given its reduced budget, the Council made a sincere effort to provide funds to those organizations that displayed the most need by channeling more of its funding to the small, experimental and developing arts organizations. Many of these organizations serve minority, ethnic, local and rural communities. The

Council also acknowledged its responsibility to the larger, established organizations, while also considering that Council support represents a minor percentage of the overall revenue of these groups, and that these groups are most capable of fundraising.

Ultimately the awards made by the Council in 1983-84 went to large and small organizations in every county of the State. The lists on the following pages and the photographs illustrating this book are indicative of the variety of artistic programming. In each of the Council's programs, awards are listed within funding category. Lists of artists supported through nonprofit organizations for specific projects, a list of "primary" organizations and a list of total amounts awarded by county, also appear in this book. The Council's support in the following areas: increased support for the individual artist, folk arts apprenticeships and first-time awards to counties through the L.I.F.T. program is described below.

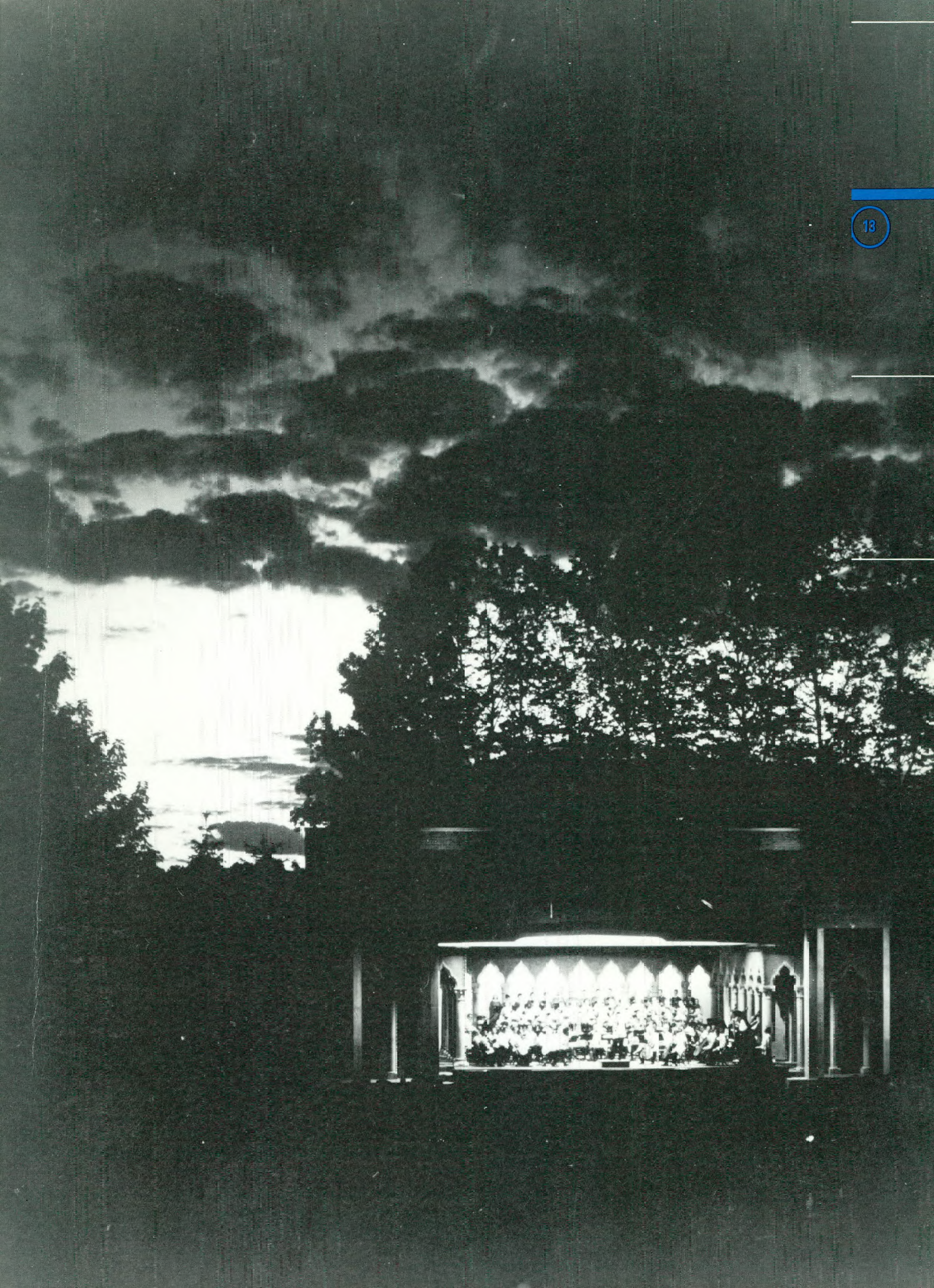
Support for the Individual Artist

Despite its decreased appropriation, the Council increased its support for individual artists' fellowships.

In August 1983, the Council provided \$925,000 for fellowships in six categories, administered by the Creative Artists Program Service (CAPS) program. It was the largest amount the Council had ever made available for fellowships in the categories of choreography, film, fiction, multimedia, playwriting and video. The Council provided a total of \$67,500, for fellowships in architecture and design, to two organizations: the Educational Facilities Laboratory Division/Academy for Educational Development and the Innovative Design Fund.

At its December 1983 meeting, the Council announced that it would increase support for fellowships to \$1.1 million, in fourteen categories, during the 1984-85 fiscal year. Those categories are architecture, choreography, crafts, fiction, film, graphics, inter-arts, music composition, painting, photography, poetry, playwriting, sculpture and video. The Council selected the New York Foundation for the Arts to administer the Individual Artists Fellowship Program after receiving proposals submitted by 11 organizations.

In addition to its appropriation for fellowships, the Council made numerous awards which supported artists' projects: apprenticeships, commissions, productions, residencies and sponsored projects. The names of the artists and their sponsoring organizations are listed on pages 146 through 150.



Folk Arts Apprenticeships Awarded

During the past four years, the Council has placed a special emphasis on support of folklife activities. In the 1983-84 fiscal year, upon the recommendation of its Folk Arts Advisory Panel, the Council awarded twelve folk arts apprenticeships for a total of \$24,300. These awards were made possible by a grant from the National Endowment for the Arts' Folk Arts Program. The apprenticeships allowed individuals experienced in folk arts to study intensively with a "master" of traditional folk arts. Some of the activities included: wampum bead and belt making on a Mohawk reservation; wooden boat building in a maritime community on Long Island's South Fork; the singing of Sicilian work songs in an Italian community in Western New York; and, ash splint basketry in Central New York's Chenango County. A complete list of the recipients of apprenticeships and the masters with whom they worked is included on page 149 of this book.

The Local Incentive Funding Test L.I.F.T.

Designed by a special advisory committee supported by a generous grant from the Robert Sterling Clark Foundation, the Local Incentive Funding Test (or L.I.F.T., as it is more commonly known) was initiated by the Council during the 1983-84 fiscal year. L.I.F.T., a matching fund program, encourages local government support for the arts in the fifty-seven counties outside of New York City. It is also aimed to reinforce the impact of the arts on local communities and to encourage closer relationships between local arts or-

ganizations and their respective county governments. (New York City was excluded from the program because the arts are already heavily supported by the city). Twenty-eight counties applied to the program. After review of applications, seventeen counties were awarded a total of \$47,915. Each participating county must match three local dollars for every two State L.I.F.T. dollars. A minimum of 60% of each local dollar had to derive from the county's 1984 budget and had to represent new program dollars. The remaining 40% of the local match could come from other local sources, including municipalities.

The counties that received L.I.F.T. funds during 1983-84 and the names of the local coordinating organizations may be found on page 151 of this report.

In addition to its funding activity, the Council planned and carried out two major events: the Governor's Arts Awards, and the New York State New Music Network, a tour of new music groups. The Council also expanded its developmental work in meetings with constituent organizations around the State, continued its work with other state arts agencies in the Mid-Atlantic region, and approved a change in the Council's application process to allow some organizations to apply for multi-year funding.

Governor's Arts Awards

The New York State Governor's Arts Awards program was revived this year by Governor Cuomo. The 1983-84 awards were presented at a gala ceremony in Albany on March 13, 1984. The awards, which have not been presented since 1975, were made possible by a grant from Philip Morris Incorporated. The award itself was a limited edition sculpture in polished aluminum, entitled "Trine." It was created for the occasion, and donated, by the prominent artist and sculptor, Alexander Liberman.

Nominations were solicited from the public, and an award jury made the final selections. Mrs. Matilda Cuomo served as the jury's Honorary Chairperson. Governor and Mrs. Cuomo hosted the Albany ceremony.

Awards for individual artists went to author William Kennedy and sculptor Isamu Noguchi. Lincoln Kirstein received the award for individual patron of the arts. The award for a local government supporter of the arts was shared by the City and County of Albany. For corporate support of the arts, the recipient was Fay's Drug Company in Onondaga County. Arts and Education awards went to the Staten Island Children's Museum and to Mark Schubart and the Lincoln Center Institute for the Arts and Education. Arts organizations receiving awards were the Pierpont Morgan Library, the Catskill Conservatory, the Spanish Repertory Theatre Company (El Repetorio Español), and the Harlem School of the Arts. Special citations went to Brendan Gill for his contri-

butions in many art forms, particularly in architectural preservation, and to the Deaf and Hearing-Impaired Programs of the Museum of Modern Art's Education Department and other New York City institutions that have participated in the program.

New York New Music Network Tour

Many of the best known names in contemporary music took part in the Council-sponsored New York New Music Network Tour. The musicians appeared in six cities around the State during November 1983: Buffalo, Rochester, Syracuse, Ithaca, Albany, and New York City. The tour was designed to support the performance of American contemporary music and to serve as a major audience development effort for such music.

The tour was presented by the Council with the cooperation of Meet the Composer, a nonprofit organization devoted to the appreciation of creative artists and their works. At each location on the tour, local arts groups assisted with the presentation and local musicians played, in addition to the touring musicians. Groups and soloists on the tour were: Steve Reich and Musicians; the World Saxophone Quartet; the Group for Contemporary Music; piano soloists Ursula Oppens and Muhal Richard Abrams; the performance artist/percussionist, David Van Tieghem; the Harmonic Choir; and the New Music Consort, a percussion ensemble. The artists and sites were selected through the

Council's regular panel selection process. A first-time effort, the tour was a huge success.

Workshops Held Across the State

In 1983-84, Council staff members met with more applicant and prospective applicant organizations than ever before in order to share information about the Council, its funding programs and priorities. For example, the Performing Arts Fiscal Department alone met with representatives of 102 organizations in one-to-one meetings to offer technical assistance in the areas of management and organizational survival. These meetings were held in Glen Falls, Lake George, Plattsburgh, Albany, Schenectady, Troy, Islip, Rochester, Binghamton, Ithaca, Elmira, Corning, Skaneateles, Utica, Oneida, Canastota, Syracuse, Herkimer, Oswego, Rome and Auburn. The Visual Artists Program staff travelled to Alfred, Woodstock, Cortland, Rochester and Saratoga Springs to meet with artists and craftspeople. The Film Program held two meetings. One held in Manhattan was intended for minority film presenters. The other was held in Syracuse. Finally, the Council's Executive Director, Deputy Directors and other staff members gave an overview of the Council's guidelines and application process in Staten Island, Queens, Albany, Syracuse, Plattsburgh, Binghamton, St. James (Suffolk), Freeport, Middletown, Rochester, Yonkers, Buffalo, the Bronx, Brooklyn and Manhattan. All of these efforts, and others, allowed more of the Council's constituency the opportunity to ask questions of the staff and of-

fer suggestions for improvement in the Council's grantmaking process.

Mid-Atlantic States Arts Consortium

The New York State Council on the Arts is a member of the Mid-Atlantic States Arts Consortium which is composed of the state arts agencies of Pennsylvania, New Jersey, Delaware, Maryland, West Virginia, Virginia and Washington, D.C. and New York.

Funded solely by the National Endowment for the Arts with matching support from the member arts councils, MASAC was founded five years ago to foster programs that encourage the sharing of cultural resources across state borders within the mid-Atlantic region.

During 1983, MASAC made major strides toward developing a variety of programs and services to benefit the arts of the region. These include:

Sponsor/Presenter Directory—A computerized resource directory was developed which includes useful information regarding the region's sponsors and presenters, such as programming preferences, booking information, budget information, audience type and space/facility information. Printouts of selected sponsor/presenters are available by state or for the region which can assist performing groups to find bookings or link sponsor/presenters together for block-booking purposes. A similar resource directory of

performing arts groups is in preparation and directories for visual and media arts are planned.

Performing Arts Touring Program—The Performing Arts Touring Program provides support to sponsor/presenters within the region to present performing arts groups from outside the state of the presenter, but from within the region. In 1983, the guidelines were changed in response to the constituency. These changes have significantly improved the program by 1) eliminating the roster of performing groups approved for touring; 2) providing funding one year in advance to facilitate the actual booking schedules that exist for sponsor/presenters; 3) removing the maximum grant amount stipulation; and 4) encouraging block-booking.

During the first year of funding under the new guidelines, the dollars requested tripled, one-third of the applicants were new, the average grant tripled and only 2% of the performances funded were run-outs as opposed to 95% in the past. New York State performing groups received \$87,154., 79% of the \$145,000 awarded through presenters throughout the region (up from 40% the preceding year).

Computer Information Services—In addition to the resource directories mentioned above, MASAC provides computer services to New York and Pennsylvania for their grants management systems, and to the other member states for their mailing lists. Through the shared use of a computer housed at the MASAC offices in Baltimore, the member states have been able to enter the computer age for internal ad-

ministrative functions as well as for improving their ability to respond to the constituency and the public with useful and often vital information about the arts of the region.

Finally, the Consortium has undertaken several special projects aimed at addressing specific issues facing the arts in the region. In cooperation with the Arts and Business Council of New York City, MASAC has initiated the Business Volunteers for the Arts program in the metropolitan Washington, D.C. area. Also, the Consortium has provided funds for technical assistance for marketing to assist performing arts presenters. And last, with the President's Committee on the Arts and the Humanities, the Consortium is publishing a handbook and developing a national data base to serve as a clearinghouse for arts organizations and communities interested in sharing arts resources, and in particular, establishing multi-based companies, a concept also known as second homes. Through regular interaction with the other regional arts agencies in the nation, the mid-Atlantic region and its cultural community are linked to a national network of information, programs and services that have great potential for the years ahead.

Multi-Year Support

During the 1983-84 fiscal year, the Council approved the development of multi-year support, which will begin with the 1984-85 fiscal year. The Council hopes that this procedural change will be most beneficial to its con-

stituency. In the future, the Council also hopes to expand this support mechanism.

Multi-year support allows eligible organizations to apply at the beginning of one funding year for two consecutive years of support. Support in the second year will be conditional, depending on the Council's appropriation remaining relatively constant and on the submission of a final report on the first year's activities by the organization.

In order to be eligible, the following requirements must be met. First, an organization's activities must be based in New York State. National organizations are ineligible. Second, to be eligible, an organization must have been funded consecutively by the Council for the three prior years. Third, the Council's support in the prior year must have been no greater than 15% of the organization's operating budget. And, finally, the organization's budget in the prior year must have been \$500,000 or more. Requests for multi-year support must be for ongoing programs, not for a specific one-time project. The Council's Decentralization Program pilot-tested multi-year support during the 1983-84 fiscal year and found it to be quite helpful to the groups involved.



Architecture, Planning and Design Program

In 1983-84, 199 organizations, a record number, applied to the Architecture, Planning and Design Program. In response, the program demonstrated its support of quality in the built, natural and designed environment of New York State by disbursing \$890,000 to 106 organizations in 38 counties. 131 projects in the diverse disciplines of architecture, architectural history, landscape architecture, urban planning, historic preservation, industrial design, interior design, and architectural photography were supported.

Traditionally, general operating support accounts for the largest percentage of the Architecture, Planning and Design Program's allocation, and this year was no exception. Approximately 40% of the funding was directed to groups whose primary focus is the enhancement of the State's built and natural environment. Design and feasibility studies—proposals

through which architects, planners, landscape architects and designers create specific schemes for buildable projects—accounted for 23% of the allocation. Another 30% was awarded to exhibitions, publications, slide shows, films, tours, and other public awareness programs. The remaining monies were earmarked for fellowships, which encourage independent projects for the public benefit in the various disciplines of the architecture and design field.

Dance Program

In 1983-84 the Dance Program reaffirmed its goal of fostering artistic development and excellence by supporting 87 organizations representing the whole spectrum of New York's richly diverse dance world. Seventeen of the 87 organizations and/or dance companies received support for the first time. The 87 groups represent 41% of the 212 applicant organizations. They were awarded the program's allocation of \$2,753,000 (including \$28,000 in Federal funds).

The applicants ranged from the large and mid-size, traditional, national and international, ballet and modern companies to small, ethnic groups and emerging, avant-

garde experimentalists. They also included theatrical, historical and folk dance companies, as well as dance service organizations and publications. However, 80% of these awards were provided to assist the artists' rehearsal and performance salaries for home-based seasons, in recognition of the priority request of the constituency.

A new category of funding—Long-Term Residency in New York State—was also inaugurated by the Dance Program in 1983-84. The residency was envisioned as having three express goals:

- to develop audiences for dance outside of New York City;
- to enrich the art form through collaboration with artists living in the area where the residency takes place; and
- to provide a dance company with the financial support necessary for a sustained period of work and creative time.

One organization, the José Limon Dance Company, was the recipient of the grant award, which resulted in a 6-week residency in Saratoga Springs during the summer of 1984.

Decentralization Program

During the 1983-84 funding year, the Council's Decentralization Program included 20 rural, suburban and urban regrant agencies serving 29 of the State's 62 counties and 60% of the State's population. One regrant site, Wayne County, was added in 1983-84. The regranting agency for

Wayne County is Wayne County Arts in Action. The regrant agencies—17 local arts councils, two county governments and one library system—received applications from 728 organizations, a figure equivalent to 39% of all applications to the Council itself. Of these, 531 were supported for an average grant of \$938. The program allocation for 1983-84 was \$578,000.

Film Program

During 1983-84, the Film Program disbursed \$1,644,300 to a total of 111 different organizations to carry out 168 different film projects.

Exhibition continues to be the major focus of Film Program support. More than \$500,000 went to this category, making possible year-round exhibition programs, special festivals, the use of independent sites for showing new and experimental work and the film exhibition programs of major institutions. Touring exhibition programs continued to expand film offerings statewide. More awards were made to upstate film exhibitors than ever before, with many first-time awards for community-based programs.

Support for film production was increased, in recognition of the filmmaker's increasing difficulty in practicing this expensive craft. Twenty awards were made for film production in all genres of filmmaking, totalling just under \$300,000. For a list of filmmakers and projects funded through sponsoring organizations see page 148.

A special initiative was taken in the area of film distribution this year, with the creation of a pilot program aimed at giving distribution monies to films that had originally received Council production support. Ten such projects were funded, all with the intention of increasing the visibility and marketability of independent film. In addition, two different projects were funded to make this country's heritage of preserved films available to the public through distribution of prints of these restored works.

Finally, library acquisition reached a new stage of development with the funding of a project to create an ongoing electronic Union Catalogue listing all film holdings in the public library system of New York State.

Literature Program

By continuing to enlarge the number of organizations it supports, the Literature Program has increased the quality and variety of groups now receiving funding from the Council. In 1983-84, a total of \$941,000 was awarded to 121 organizations throughout the State. Approximately 50% of that amount was directed to the support of individual writers through the funded organization's sponsorship of workshops, readings, residencies, translation projects and folklife endeavors.

The Literature Program has successfully expanded over the past few years to include new categories and areas of

support. Translation, storytelling, play development and direct support of literary magazines have all been recognized as areas in which the program must be involved. In addition, nonfiction work has received Council support for the first time.

While more traditional literary activities—small press publishing, readings, workshops, workspaces—continue to receive substantial support, the program has begun to encompass the full range of activities that Literature engenders in this State. Examples include everything from a storytelling project on the Akwesasne Mohawk Reservation in Franklin County to the documentation of the personal histories of Holocaust survivors in New York City.

The program's staff also continues to help develop literary programs in minority and upstate communities. This is reflected in the high percentage—21% of first-time applicants among the organizations having received support in 1983-84.

Local Arts Organizations/Service Organizations

Recognizing the importance of developing the cultural resources indigenous to communities throughout the State, the Local Arts Organizations/Services Organizations Program supports local arts councils and multi-arts centers which demonstrate a long-term commitment to the cultural development of their communities. The program also has a concurrent commitment to the State's multi-disciplinary arts service organizations.

In 1983-84, 114 organizations were funded for a total of \$3,272,000. An award of \$925,000 was given for the support of a statewide fellowship program for individual artists, and a grant of \$225,000 was given to a statewide arts and education program that provides employment opportunities for professional artists while enriching the lives of over 100,000 young students in counties all across the State. In total, support was given to 57 local arts councils, 19 multi-arts centers, 19 arts service organizations and 17 multi-arts community programs.

General operating support continued to be the major category of support within the program, with approximately 41% of the total funds awarded to it. Throughout 1983-84, the program emphasized support for those local arts organizations that provided quality programs to community audiences and local arts groups having limited access to traditional sources of non-government support.

The program also increased involvement in the documentation and presentation of local folklife traditions. Folk arts programs ranging from boat building to break-dancing provided a dynamic source of quality indigenous programming for local arts organizations. In addition, a permanent record of the rich cultural composition of New York State is being created through regional surveys and slide/tape documentation.

Within the field of multi-disciplinary arts service organizations, the program helped introduce special projects designed to acquaint organizations with the survival trends of the future. These innovative programs included

the development of a computer club for small arts organizations and a comprehensive conference exploring profit-making endeavors and sources of earned income for both large and small cultural institutions.

Media Program

The Media Program's constituents are concerned with the creation and dissemination of the electronic arts. Throughout the Council's years of support to the medium, this new art form has gained steadily increasing recognition. In the past year, the Media Program continued to support organizations that have demonstrated a strong leadership role in the emergence of the field and to encourage new projects and artists just entering this area.

In 1983-84, the Media Program made awards to 80 organizations for 145 projects. Of the program's allocation of \$1,200,000, \$300,000 was directed toward production and post-production of video and audio art, documentary and narrative projects. Substantial levels of support were awarded for exhibition, distribution and services. It was a year of expanded activity in all three of these areas.

Support was given to several organizations for first-time exhibition projects; organizations that received funding for providing distribution services developed new clients here and abroad;

and the Media Alliance, the principal service organization for the field developed new cooperative programs with industry. The program continued to provide funds for 3 state-wide regrant programs in which institutions match Council funds that are then made available to individual artists. Development support was given for the creation of a new rough-edit facility in New York City. Support was continued for service organizations that have created collaborations with commercial fine-editing facilities that offer substantial reductions in their hourly rate for media artists.

Music Program

The Music Program experienced a year of challenge and change in 1983-84. It awarded a total of \$5,299,805 to 284 applicants representing 62 counties in the State. The awards were made in the areas of orchestral music, opera, jazz, chamber music, early music, contemporary music, publications, services to the field, administration, commissions and recordings.

The awards for commissions and recordings increased dramatically over the last year as a reflection of the Council's priorities. Commissioning funds jumped from \$20,000 in 1982-83 to \$89,250 in 1983-84, while recording awards increased from \$34,000 to \$71,451.

Another notable change in funding was the presentation of the first New York State New Music Tour, a program designed by the Music Program and sponsored by the Council with the cooperation of Meet the Composer and presenters in six cities

around the State. Eight groups and individual musicians, representing a broad diversity of musical styles, performed to substantial audiences during weekend festivals in November 1983. Praise from the press, sponsors and audiences was universal.

Other new programs, including a pilot program of workshop training for professionals and music education for children, were funded in response to panel suggestions.

Museum Aid Program

As a result of the Council's decreased appropriation in 1983-84, the Museum Aid Program was faced with an important challenge. The Council mandated a cut in the program's allocation while specifying that funding be slightly reduced to most of the largest museums in the State and increased to smaller, ethnic and minority, and rural organizations. Of the \$5,847,500 allocated, 55% was awarded to thirteen major museum organizations, (a 5% drop from last year), and 45% was awarded to 168 organizations. Of those 168 organizations, 23 organizations received first-time support totalling over \$100,000.

General operating support dropped from 72% in 1982-83 to 69% in 1983-84, while support for exhibitions increased from 9.5% to 11%. This allowed for some exciting exhibitions around the State. Among them: a major international loan exhibition, *Ancestors: Four Million Years of Humanity* at the American Museum of Natural History; Embroidered samplers at the Cooper-Hewitt Museum; a major reinstallation of agricultural artifacts at the Dela-

ware County Historical Association; and a traveling exhibition of jacquard coverlets organized by the Jefferson County Historical Society.

The Museum Aid Program also attempted to provide strong support in two Project Categories of Special Concern: Exhibitions of Works by Living American Artists and Interpreting the Twentieth Century. The Council supported a particularly diverse group in the Living American Artist category. Some of these included Frank Espada (El Museo del Barrio), Hollis Frampton (Albright-Knox Art Gallery), Wilhemina Godfrey (Center for Positive Thought) and Gyorgy Kepes (International Center for Photography). Interpreting the Twentieth Century was introduced into the Council's Program Guidelines in 1983-84 and the strong response from the museum field attests to its potential for stimulating activity relating to contemporary historical and environmental issues. Major awards in this category were made to the Center for Community Studies for an exhibition on *Old Chinatown Streets* and to the Roberson Center of Arts and Sciences for *Starting Over: Ethnic Communities in Broome County*.

Funding also increased in the Cataloguing and Research category. Notable awards in this category went to the Buffalo and Erie County Historical Society for a collections inventory, to the Long Island Historical Society for first-time support of a cu-

rator of collections, and to the Cooper-Hewitt Museum for photographic documentation of its collections.

Presenting Organizations Program

In 1983-84, the Presenting Organizations Program continued to focus on the development of presenters and the availability of performing arts activity to the people of New York State. Its allocation of \$1,920,000 was awarded to 152 organizations (eight more than in 1982-83), in 54 counties for the presentation of 1,964 performances.

As in previous seasons, more than 80% of the Presenting Organizations Program funds were directed outside of Manhattan to local upstate presenters, minority presenters and organizations presenting contemporary, non-traditional and minority artists.

Some of the highlights of these presentations were the Brooklyn Academy of Music's *Next Wave Festival*, Creative Time's *Art in the Anchorage* and the upstate tour of *Dance Black America*.

In an effort to encourage this kind of dynamic programming, the program instituted a new category for commissions. This category fosters the creation and presentation of new work by living artists, as well as answering presenters' needs for innovative programming. In this first year, six organizations were funded for twenty commissions, with grants ranging from \$200 to \$3,500. A list of artists who were commissioned appears on page 148.

The New Presenter Development category continued

to encourage the emergence and development of new presenters in those regions of the State where there is a scarcity of performing arts activity and/or lack of a particular art form. Presentations ranged from a contemporary music and theatre series offered in a converted barn in Greene County to a Ukrainian Folk Music Festival in the foothills of the Catskill Mountains. All in all, twelve organizations received first-time support in a total of eight counties.

Long-term technical assistance was offered to presenters through the Professional Consultants category. Additionally, a number of presenters received support for administrative salaries to help with organizational growth, expansion of programming and long-term managerial needs.

Special Arts Services Program

In its continuing effort to support the preservation and promotion of ethnic and minority, folklife and cultural expressions, the Special Arts Services Program awarded \$3,100,500 to 231 organizations in 1983-84. These awards were given to organizations whose community-based activities spanned the performing, visual, communication and media arts disciplines. Puerto Rican Santos, Ukrainian embroidery, Irish step-dancing, Chinese traditional and folk music and African drumming and dancing were among the art forms supported.

Administrative Development, a competitive category designed to stabilize and strengthen developing organizations, was offered for the second time. Funds were awarded, on a matching basis, toward salaries for key administrative positions. It is possible for this support to be renewed in a subsequent year pending a satisfactory review. Several organizations that had received support in this category last year returned for consideration in 1983-84. Eight such awards were renewed, while eight more received first-time support.

Three new competitive categories were established in response to the growing needs of individual artists and developing institutions: Artist-in-Residence, Commissions for Minority Choreographer Development, and Internships. Nine awards ranging from \$4,500 to \$9,000 were approved for the Artist-in-Residence category. Forty organizations received \$5,000 each in the Internships category and fourteen organizations received \$1,500 each for commissions of work by minority choreographers. A list of choreographers who received commission awards appears on page 150.

Theatre Program

The Theatre Program had several special highlights in 1983-84. Its allocation of \$3,372,000 (including Federal funds) was awarded to 143 organizations representing a diversity of not-for-profit theatres in 25 counties of the State. 90% of the funds were used for the salaries and fees of artists, while nine commissions (ranging from \$1750 to \$3,000) were awarded for a variety of projects including

the collaboration of an Asian designer with an Hispanic theatre and the creation of a score by a multi-media artist for a small experimental theatre ensemble.

The Theatre Program also provided a higher percentage of its 1983-84 funds to minority and experimental groups, individual artists and theatres located upstate and on Long Island. At the same time it sponsored such hits as Michael Brady's *To Gillian, On Her 37th Birthday*, a production that was developed and produced by the Ensemble Studio Theatre; *Cinders*, by Polish playwright Janusz Głowacki at the New York Shakespeare Festival's Public Theatre; Roundabout's revival of Pinter's *Old Times* with Jane Alexander, Marsha Mason and Anthony Hopkins; and Manhattan Punch Line's revival of Lardner and Kaufman's *June Moon*. Work in the experimental arena included *Galas* at Charles Ludlam's Ridiculous Theatre and Mabou Mine's and Women's Interart co-production of *Through the Leaves* by Franz Xaver Kroeta. Noteworthy productions in childrens theatre included First All Children's Theatre's *The Trip* based on a book by Ezra Jack Keats with music by Stephen Schwartz, and Theatrework's (formerly PART) *Playing to Win*, the story of Jackie Robinson, book and lyrics by James DeJongh and Charles Cleveland with music and lyrics by Jimi Foster. Regional theatre around the State was well-represented

by efforts including GeVa's production of *Quilters* by Molly Newman and Barbara Damashek and Capital Rep's production of Brian Friel's *Translations*.

Service organizations supported by the Theatre Program for specific projects and activities maintained programs for discount tickets, a costume collection, playscript publication services, and a variety of administrative and technical aids for theatre companies and artists.

Visual Artists Program

In 1983-84, the Visual Artists Program supported many diverse organizations that offered a broad range of opportunities for individual artists.

32% of the \$1,256,500 (including \$11,500 of Federal funds) allocated to the program was awarded for artists' fees and materials in the categories of Artist-in-Residence, Collaborations, Performance Art, Regrants, Sponsored Projects and Temporary Installations. An additional 44% was awarded for programs that provide artists opportunities for increased public exposure of their work. These included Exhibitions and Publication. The remaining 24% went specifically toward operating support of organizations that provide a broad range of services to artists and that are uniquely important to the field of contemporary visual arts.

The projects funded varied immensely, both regionally and in the type of work produced. A comprehensive exhibition of low-fired ceramics in Suffolk County, a major exhibition exploring artists' views on nuclear disarmament

(which will tour the country, then open in Albany at the State Museum in 1985), and an exhibition of sound-generating sculpture in Brooklyn, are but a few examples of the variety in program funding.

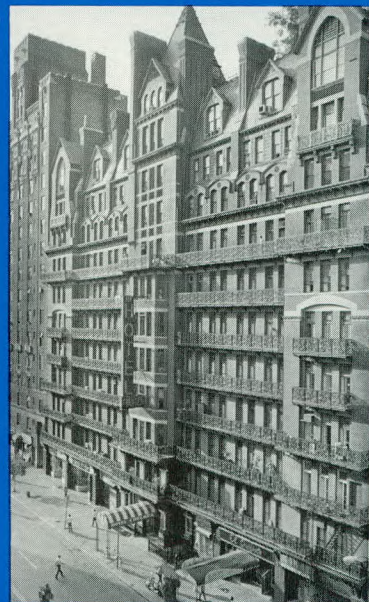
In total, 79 exhibitions on a variety of themes were funded by the Visual Artists Program throughout the State. In the more experimental categories of Performance Art and Collaboration, the program also funded some innovative projects. Among them were *Wind Devil*, a collaboration by artist Judy Pfaff and choreographer Nina Weiner which premiered at the Brooklyn Academy of Music's *Next Wave* festival.

Several exciting and diverse awards were made in the Artist-in-Residence category. For example a stone sculptor in Orleans County, a theatre/performance artist in Greene County, a ceramic artist in Oneida County, a quiltmaker in Chemung County and a painter in Chenango were supported by the Visual Artists Program. A complete list of artists and the organizations where they will reside appears on page

Sponsored Projects was another category through which the program provided support to artists. Awards were made to 22 organizations on behalf of artists. A list of the artists, their sponsoring organizations and the titles of their projects appears on page 150.

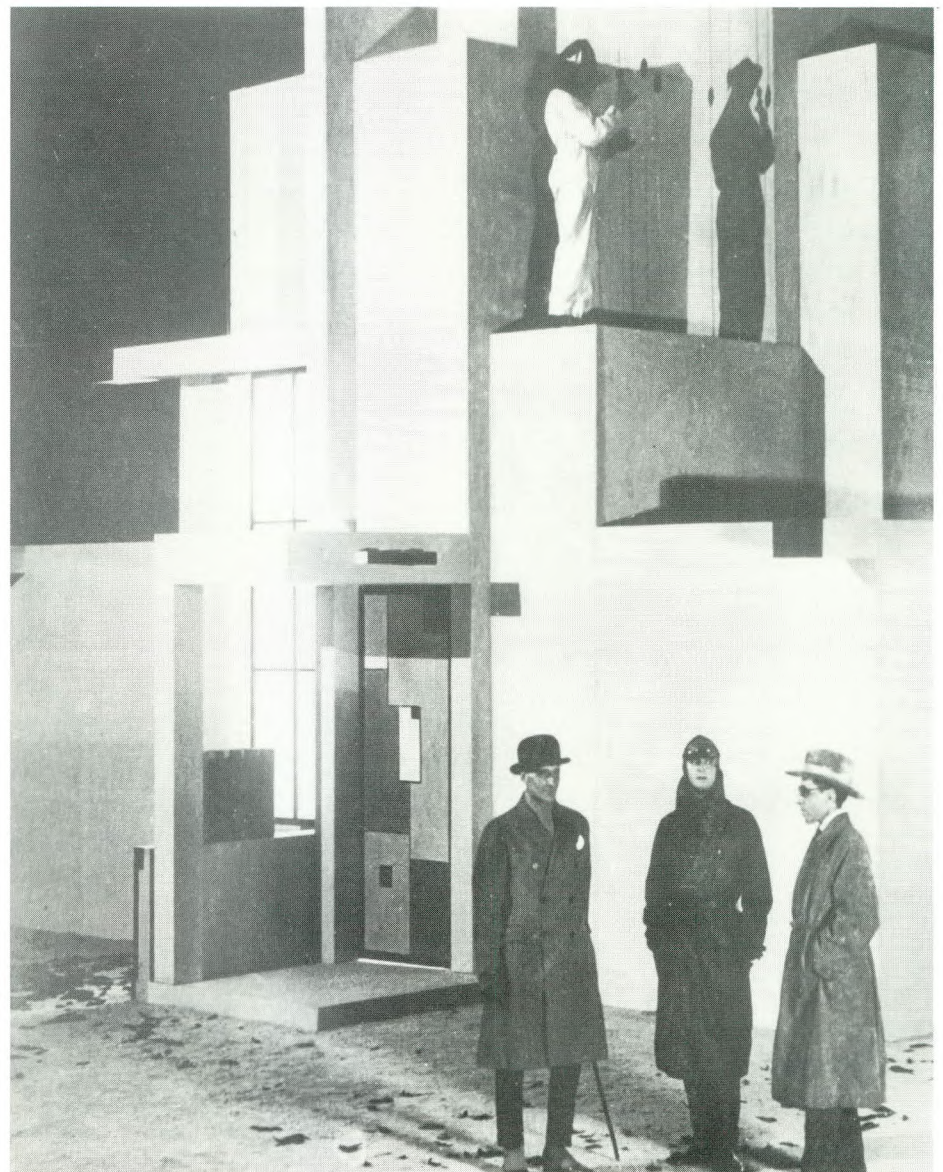

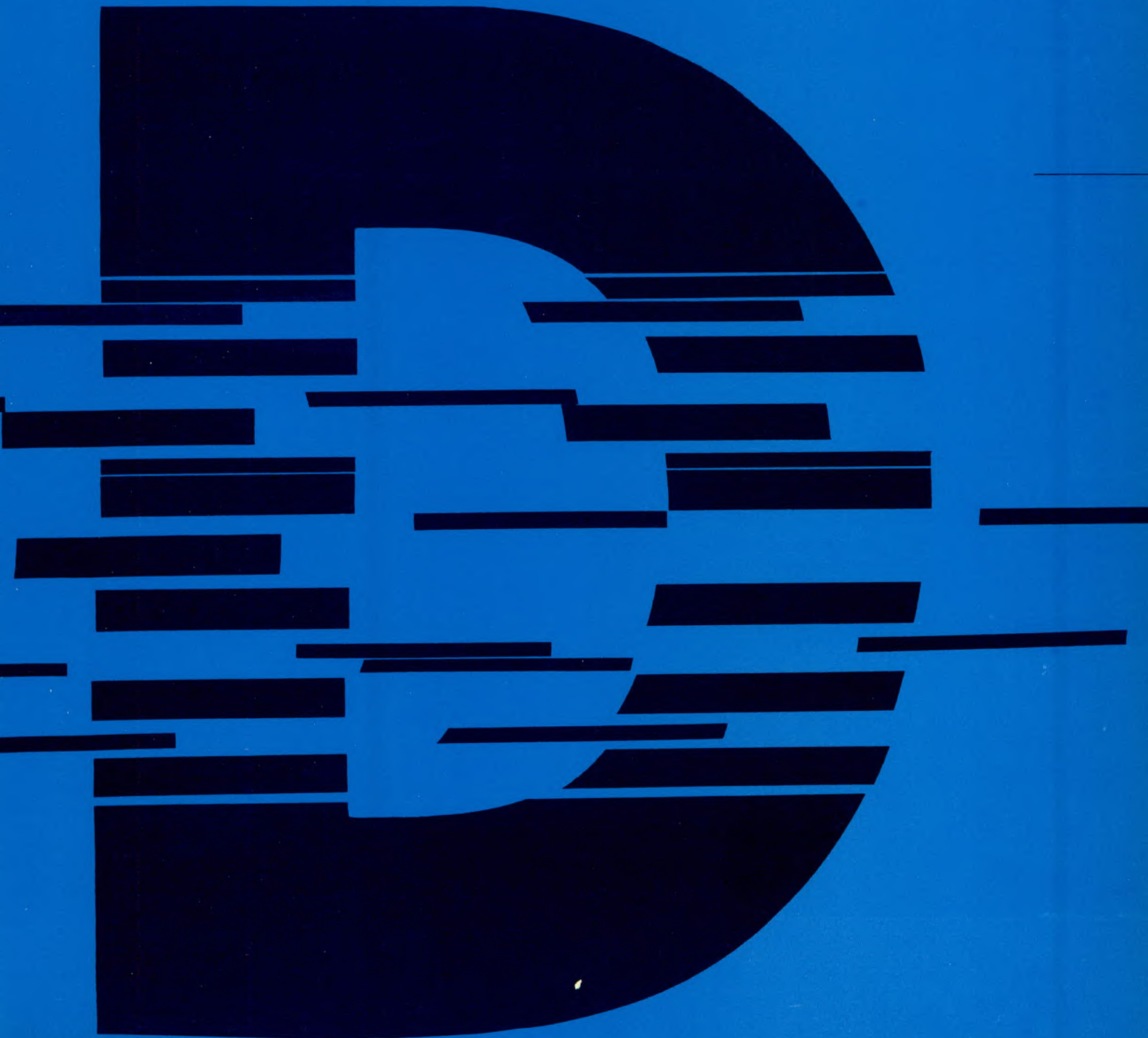

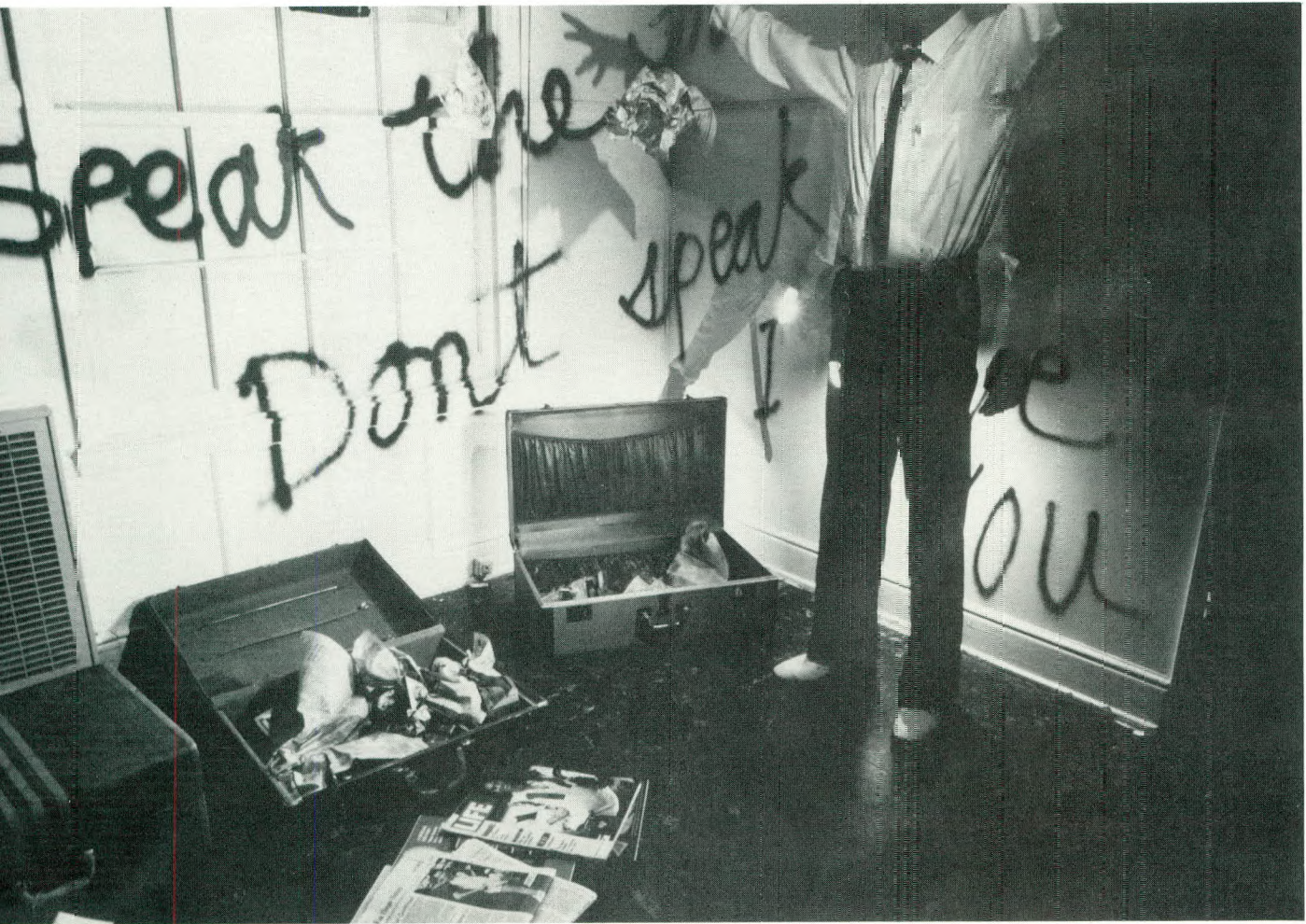

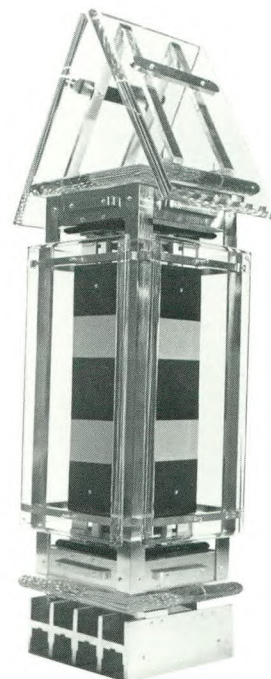
