

Governor's Foreword



The State's steadily growing support to the New York State Council on the Arts has allowed more and more New Yorkers to discover the impact that the arts can have on the quality of their lives. The Council funds programs from Niagara to Manhattan and from Montauk to Massena. The arts are as much a part of New York as the mighty falls of Niagara, the economic vitality of Wall Street, and the fertile agriculture of central New York.

More of our children are becoming involved in the arts as schools and arts organizations develop innovative new approaches to art education. In 1985 we created the Arts in Education Program. Since that time, some 600 cultural organizations throughout the State have been funded to deliver arts programs to almost 3,000,000 students. During these three years, more than 5,000 artists have conducted residencies in schools, bringing children into direct contact with the process of creating art and the diverse artistic heritage of our State.

In 1987-88, the Council continued an initiative to encourage the development of cultural activities for minority audiences Statewide. This past year also marked the first year of the Capital Funding Initiative which the Legislature drafted and I signed in August of 1987. This bill allowed the Council, for the first time, to fund arts organizations for the improvement of their facilities—the concert halls, the galleries, the theatres and

dance studios, and to thereby make the arts more accessible to the citizens of our State.

The New York State Council on the Arts, under the talented and graceful leadership of Kitty Carlisle Hart, has added immeasurably to New York's success in expanding and strengthening the arts all across the State. I applaud Chairman Hart, her fellow Council members, the Council's staff and panelists, for their dedication and efforts in assuring the continuation of the State's extraordinary accomplishments in the arts.

Chairman's Review



The New York State Council on the Arts maintained its record as the largest state arts agency in the nation during fiscal year 1987–88, with a budget of \$47,300,000. The Council received requests for assistance from 1,947 organizations and awarded support to 1,445 groups.

1987–88 also marked the launching of a new Capital Funding Initiative which enabled the Council, for the first time, to assist its constituents with the expansion and improvement of their facilities. The Council received 101 requests for capital aid and funded 62 projects that ranged from the installation of an air conditioning system that will allow a film presenter to program throughout the summer, to the addition of handicapped accessible doors for a performing arts center upstate. The Council's goal in this first year of funding was to help arts organizations make their facilities more accessible to all New Yorkers.

The Governor, to the delight of the arts community, again hosted the Governor's Arts Awards. The ceremony was held at the Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York City. Governor Cuomo's eloquence, as usual graced the occasion. Fellow New Yorkers were again able to view the awards ceremony over Public Television Stations with the cooperation of New York Network.

I would like to applaud the Council's staff members. They continue to exhibit sensitivity

and dedication to their fields and to encourage the very best that there is in the arts in New York State. Our peer panelists are to be commended for continuing to provide the balance, insight and good judgement that our review process needs in order to remain in the forefront of public arts funding. My fellow Council members devote an enormous amount of time and hard work to the Council and it is most deeply appreciated. I am extremely thankful that New York State is blessed with a Governor and a Legislature that work toward maintaining New York State as the arts capital of the world. And, I am deeply grateful to the citizens of our State for their continuing support of government funding for the arts.

Executive Director's Statement



During the past year, the Council began its first long-range planning effort. The advice and opinions of the arts community were actively sought through a series of meetings, discussions and surveys. This communication with the arts community gave the Council guidance on which issues were of particular concern to the arts community and which might require increased attention by the Council in the future. It was an opportunity for the Council to bring many of its constituents together to share information and concerns about the arts. It was an opportunity for the Council to listen. All parties benefitted.

It became very clear during these meetings that many events of the past decade have had a cumulative, and in most instances, adverse effect on the artists and arts groups that the Council has helped develop over the past twenty-five years. In particular, revenue sources whether from the public or private sector, have sorely lagged behind essential expenses. Artists and administrators alike have sacrificed salaries, health benefits, time and energy to cover the "income gap" to the point where nothing is left to sacrifice except the endeavor itself. Many groups' continued existence is a precarious one at best. The loss of some of these arts groups would rob this State of the richness and diversity in its cultural treasures that makes New York unique.

The arts community and the public must work together to prevent such occurrences. Now, more than ever, efforts must be made to broaden the plurality of support for the arts. Arts groups must make ever stronger commitments of service to their communities. This service must be translated into public awareness. The Council can help with the education of the public and the private sectors as to their responsibilities to support and assist

the widest possible diversity of arts activities throughout New York. Without, however, a growing recognition by communities, individuals and businesses of their obligations to arts groups, the artistic landscape of the State will be diminished as the State must have active partners in this enterprise of financial support.

In 1987-88, The New York State Legislature enacted a new program of financial assistance addressing the serious capital need of cultural organizations. New Yorkers once again can be proud in knowing that their elected representatives respond imaginatively and with dispatch to their concerns.

Chronicled in the pages that follow is a remarkable range of support for the thousands of arts activities provided to New Yorkers during 1987-88. It is a record in which the people of New York can take enormous pride. This achievement was accomplished through the extraordinary dedication to public service of the Council's staff, peer panelists and Council members.

Highlights of Program Funding Activities



Architecture, Planning and Design Program

The Architecture, Planning and Design Program (APD) received 254 applications in 1987, an all time high for the Program. Of these, 175 organizations and 7 sponsored projects were funded for a total of 220 projects. This was a 13% increase over the previous year.

10 The \$1,435,000 APD disbursement was spent on a very diverse assortment of activities from every corner of the State. 60% of the year's grants were awarded to upstate groups, and 40% to the five boroughs of New York City. All of APD's eleven disciplines were represented: architecture; architectural history; landscape architecture; urban and rural planning; urban design; historic preservation; graphic design; industrial design; interior design; and architectural documentation. In general, support usually fell under one of three basic areas: institutional funding to organizations providing design services; architecture and design as an art form; and public education about architecture and design.

The Program is especially interested in giving strong support to innovative developments in all of its disciplines, from contemporary design to historic preservation. To encourage this, five design issues of special concern—Contemporary Architecture and Design, Housing, The Rural Landscape, Urban Design and Planning, and Waterfront Development—were put forth in the guidelines and attracted 154 requests statewide, of which 94 were funded.

Contemporary Design projects continue to represent a growing percentage of the Program's

grants. \$203,750 was spent on this area, a 109% increase over last year. Some highlights included the Burchfield Art Center's retrospective on Harold Cohen, and the Clocktower's *Pop Architecture* exhibition. Among the many interdisciplinary contemporary projects funded were Creative Time's artist/architect collaboration for the landscape design at Hunter's Point, Queens, and an international competition sponsored by East Meets West, which will emphasize the cross-fertilization between contemporary American, Western European and Japanese designers. Design and adaptive use studies across the State also explored an intriguing variety of contemporary design problems. In Buffalo, the Langston Hughes Institute began work on the conversion of an early 20th century car dealership showroom into a multi-arts center for the City's minority youth. In Lexington, Art Awareness commissioned an installation by architect Michael Kalil, and in Pine Plains the Triangle Arts Association created a temporary "laboratory" environment which allowed architect William McDonnough to collaborate with a host of other artists and designers in the creation of an experimental, contemplative structure and landscape.

Housing continues to be a primary concern of the Program. In 1987-88, \$162,800 was awarded to a broad cross-section of groups working on innovative designs, planning and research, neighborhood rehabilitation, and public education efforts, all with the aim of raising the design quality of affordable housing for New York's residents. For example, the Architectural League held a design competition which resulted in an outstanding exhibition of infill housing proposals for New York City. In a poor, predominantly Black and Hispanic section of Yonkers, SWAP (Stop Wasting Abandoned Property) is developing a unique approach to the redesign of tenements which will result in a model "sweat equity" project.

As a special initiative related to Housing, the Architecture Program mounted an exhibition at the Paine Webber Gallery called *Reweaving the Urban Fabric: International Approaches to Infill Housing*, in partnership with the New York Landmarks Conservancy. The exhibition presented both European and American projects demonstrating excellence in contextual design, the participation of communities in their own

rehabilitation, and the recognition of a city's complex architectural history. Staff also worked with other agencies to help move the winning design of its 1985 "Inner City Infill Competition" to construction. The West Harlem Community Organization, the New York City Division of Housing Preservation and Development, and the State of New York Mortgage Association and private developers have all shown a great deal of interest in building this design.

Eleven Rural Landscape planning and preservation projects were funded to help conserve the unique character of the State's countryside. Among these were the Yates County Office of Public History's rural landscape plan and a hamlet design study conducted by the Dutchess County Environmental Management Council. Rural historic district surveys were funded for the Marbletown Historic Preservation Commission and the Landmark Society of Western New York. The Landmark Society's project in

Urban Design and Planning issues attracted applications from all kinds of communities—from small towns to major urban centers. Twenty-five were funded for a total of \$131,787. Grants were awarded to the Village of Ellicottville in Cattaraugus County for a survey of possible National Register landmarks and a master design plan, and to the towns of Gloversville

and Croton-on-Hudson for signage guidelines. One of the most notable projects of the year was led by the Women's Interart Center, in an exemplary community-based effort to create a master plan for preservation and development in the Clinton neighborhood of New York City.

The last incentive area, Waterfront Development, was represented by several interesting projects. One of these was in the Town of Callicoon, where conceptual designs are being developed to orient the Main Street to the Delaware River, and to create a new riverfront park. The Geneva Historical Society mounted an exhibition which explored the history of the town's lakefront development. New York City's Department of Planning was funded for a survey of publicly accessible waterfront properties.

Sponsored Projects was launched as a new funding category in 1987. Under this category, architects, designers and scholars competed for grants which allowed them to explore innovative ideas outside of traditional practice. \$34,125 was awarded to seven projects. Among these were: Marta Gutman and Gene Sparling's study of Broadway as an urban corridor; and John Hejduk's *Russian Trilogy*, a visionary exploration of three cities. The Council is now the only state arts council in the nation giving project support to individual architects, designers and scholars.

The largest of APD's funding categories, General Operating Support, accounted for 31% of its total allocation, or \$450,900. 21 grants were distributed in amounts ranging from \$4,500 to \$48,000, to a diverse array of groups including the Heritage Foundation of Oswego, the Catskill Center for Conservation and Development, and the New York Landmarks Conservancy. In addition, \$49,500 was awarded in Institutional Development to help seven organizations strengthen their fiscal and administrative bases. Historic Saranac Lake, the Landmarks Society of the Niagara Frontier, and Storefront for Art and Architecture in New York City were among the recipients. Storefront is the only alternative gallery space in the State solely devoted to the presentation and exploration of the work of truly avant-garde architects and designers.

Another large proportion of the Program's budget went to educational programs, which are geared to both design professionals and the general public. \$374,940, or about 24% of the budget was spent on films, videos, exhibitions,

slide shows, tours, lectures, workshops, publications and conferences taking place throughout the State. Included were such outstanding projects as: a film series on architecture in film by the Gallery Association of New York; an AIA lecture series on art and architecture collaborations; a video documentary on the Bronx River Restoration project; and a series of building trade apprenticeships offered by the Essex Community Heritage Organization. Notable exhibition grants went to Cooper Union's series on contemporary graphic designers, a collection of Otto Wagner drawings shown at the Drawing Center, and Monroe County's exhibit of historic autochrome photographs of Rochester's Olmsted parks.

In summary, the Architecture, Planning and Design Program has experienced significant growth in both the sophistication and quality of its applications, as well as an ever-broadening geographic distribution of its funds. APD clients include both leading names in the design fields and "emerging voices" whose work is not yet broadly known. Many underrepresented communities and populations, both rural and urban are also served. There is no "typical" APD applicant; grantees include small town halls and regional metropolitan agencies, alternative gallery spaces and world-famous museums, traditional preservationists and designers working with space age technologies. As the design fields continue to grow and develop, the Program has expanded its outreach and activities to meet the needs of its constituencies. Tying all of this together, however, are the Program's three reasons for being: to support those institutions that provide design and planning services; to fund the work of artists in the design fields—the architects, planners and designers; and to encourage the education of the general public about design issues through public programs.

Capital Funding Initiative

The Council launched a major effort to address the capital needs of its constituents in 1987-88 with the institution of its new Capital Funding Initiative. In early 1987, the Architecture, Planning and Design Program had documented an urgent need for capital aid funds for cultural facilities with the completion of its space survey, *Room to Move: An Arts Facilities Survey*. This survey spurred the Legislature in

the summer of 1987 to pass legislation, which was signed by the Governor in August, empowering the Council on the Arts to create the Capital Funding Initiative. The program's intent was to make available capital funding to improve, expand and rehabilitate cultural facilities owned or leased by nonprofit organizations.

In the first year of the initiative, organizations were eligible if they were current (87-88) applicants and if they had received funding from the Council in each of the three prior years. Of the 1,028 eligible organizations, 101 submitted applications by the October deadline. Funding requests reflected a diversity of cultural organizations located in 32 counties across the State including museums, dance companies, theatres, music and film organizations.

In the first year of the program, the Council paid particular attention to capital projects that would enhance public accessibility and serve minority and rural populations. The Schoharie County Arts Council in rural Cobleskill was awarded a matching capital grant to renovate a floor of their new quarters on Main Street and install an exterior lift for the handicapped to better serve its community. The Bardavon 1869 Opera House in Poughkeepsie will be able to replace the theatre's glass entrance doors and introduce an automated feature for the handicapped. The construction of a new reception

and gallery space was supported for the The Center for Photography at Woodstock which will incorporate a handicapped accessible ramp and create a stronger identity for the organization on Woodstock's main street.

Two examples of minority organizations aided by the Capital Initiative to strengthen their services to their communities are the Association of Community-Based Artists in Westchester and Mind-Builders Creative Arts Company in the Bronx. The Association of Community-Based Artists was awarded Council funds to launch the first phase of an ambitious capital program to rehabilitate a commercial building in Mt. Vernon's downtown district as an arts center and artists' housing complex. The first phase of this work is the renovation of the facade to upgrade the facility as well as promote downtown revitalization. Mind-Builders was awarded funding for the replacement of a roof, weatherproofing of the building and selected interior work. This is the final phase of a two year capital campaign to transform a former school building into a multi-arts training center.

A number of capital projects of a much more discrete but equally significant nature were funded this year. The Thalia Spanish Theatre in Queens received funding to upgrade its electrical system and install an air conditioning unit to achieve its goal of year-round programming. Harlem School of the Arts, located in a relatively new building but faced with a malfunctioning HVAC system, received support to eradicate the problem. In upstate New York, Buffalo's Studio Arena Theatre will improve its HVAC system to increase energy conservation and to correct health and safety deficiencies, and the Little Theatre of Jamestown will install a sprinkler system to meet local building codes.

A small amount of money for technical assistance projects was also available this year for organizations located in rural and minority communities. The purpose of this funding category was to assist organizations in the initial planning and development stages of capital projects. Eight requests were funded in this category. A space evaluation will be undertaken by an architectural firm for the Yates County Arts Council located in rural Penn Yan. The report will evaluate the benefits of improving and expanding the Yates County Arts Council's existing facility instead of relocating to a nearby

building. The Oswego Art Guild will hire a local architect to design an extension to its present facility to accommodate expanding educational programs. Integral to the design of the extension will be a handicapped accessible ramp which will provide access to the entire arts facility. Another project addressing the issue of accessibility was the stair relocation project undertaken by Concerned Black Filmmakers of New York. The group, located in a Harlem brownstone building, will hire an architect to redesign its interior stair to make its screening facility more functional.

Sixty two of the 101 applicants were funded in this first year with the majority receiving the largest grants possible within the programs guidelines. Of the \$1,004,936 spent, 47% was granted to 33 upstate organizations and 53% to 29 downstate organizations within the five boroughs of New York City. The strong upstate distribution of funds reinforced the Council's initial assessment that capital funding was not a problem endemic to the metropolitan area but an issue of critical statewide importance to its arts constituency.

Arts in Education Program

The Arts in Education Program was initiated in 1985 as a joint effort by the Council and the State Education Department. Through the partnership of these two agencies, cultural institutions have been funded to create collaborative arts and environmental science programs throughout the State for students in grades pre-kindergarten through twelve.

The major goal of the Program continues to be the inclusion of the arts as an essential subject for every child's personal and academic development. During the Program's third year, 1987-88, this mission was broadened to include statewide and regional planning, advocacy, new directions in the annual Arts in Education Conference in Saratoga Springs, and a comprehensive analysis and report on the 1986-87 program year for the State Legislature. An example of the statewide planning efforts was the series of three meetings (co-sponsored with the New York Foundation for the Arts) with local arts councils from around the state to examine their role in arts in education. Regionally, AIE staff worked with a consortium of organizations in the Adiron-

dacks to explore ways of sharing resources and to plan a regional conference for organizations, artists, school personnel and BOCES staff.

A statistical profile form which was sent to all organizations funded in 1986-87 resulted in an in-depth analysis of the distribution, funding, staffing and student involvement in funded programs. This report was made available to the State Legislature and revealed some startling facts: For every NYSCA dollar, an average of almost two dollars in local funds was leveraged; in 1986-87 alone, 13.5% (417,000) of the State's student population participated directly in AIE funded programs along with 23,000 teachers; over 3,000 artists worked in AIE programs; and schools contributed over \$2,000,000 directly toward programs.

The Arts in Education Program was one of 16 state AIE programs to receive a "Plan-to-Plan" grant from the National Endowment for the Arts. The Program received \$19,800 to begin planning in four areas: statewide dissemination of AIE information, communication among professionals, the investigation of alternative funding resources for schools, and the role of higher education in curriculum development and teacher training.

In 1987-88 the Program's allocation increased to \$2,900,000. About 60% of all requests were funded and the total amount requested by applicants was \$6,061,361. Based on the review of the two previous funding cycles (85-86 and 86-87) several changes were made in AIE funding categories. The Professional Consultants category was subsumed under Planning and Development. The General Operating Support (GOS) category was added for those organizations whose primary mission is school-based AIE programs, and the Services to the Field category was added to respond to requests for the funding of conferences, seminars and publications for the AIE field. For the sake of clarity, the Collaborative Programs category was changed to Implementation. The most noticeable change in the distribution of requests was the increase in the Implementation category, which received 234 requests, 62% of the total number of requests. This reflects the progress many organizations and schools have made as they moved from planning to the implementation of programs. While the implementation of projects received the majority of funds, the Planning and Development category continues to aid the development and evaluation of programs. In this category 60 requests were received, about 15% of the total.

In the Implementation category, 190 projects were funded with an average request of \$16,000 and an average grant of \$9,000. In this category, the Adirondack Lakes Center for the Arts received \$6,000 for artists residencies in six school districts in Essex, Hamilton, and Herkimer counties in the central Adirondacks. In the Minerva, Newcomb, Long Lake, Johnsburg, Webb and Indian Lake schools this program reached an isolated and underserved school population where the student enrollment has decreased in the last decade and is among the smallest in the State. The New York School for Circus Arts (The Big Apple Circus) received \$20,000 for its circus arts training program at Harbor Junior High School for the Performing Arts in East Harlem. This rigorous program taught by circus professionals integrates the circus arts—juggling, acrobatics, trapeze, spanish web and unicycle into the junior high curriculum. The students in the program perform frequently at the school, in hospitals, at street fairs, and some go on to perform with the Big Apple Circus. Project UNIQUE in Rochester is one of the oldest arts

in education programs in the State. Project UNIQUE received \$21,000 in multi-year funding for multicultural artist residencies and museum experiences in the Rochester schools. This collaborative program brings together artists, museums and schools to promote intercultural understanding among students of different racial/ethnic backgrounds. Wave Hill in the Bronx received \$12,000 for its collaboration with Community School District 10 in the Bronx to implement the *Descubre Program*, a bilingual environmental science program for Spanish language dominant students in 5th through 8th grades. The program's four main components offer a comprehensive approach to environmental education and the improvement of English language skills: staff development workshops for teachers that take place at Wave Hill, Pelham Bay Park and the American Museum of Natural History; student field trips to these three sites; parent meetings and attendance at workshops and field trips; and several concerts of Latino music held on the grounds of Wave Hill for *Descubre* students, parents and teachers.

In the Planning and Development category 35 requests were funded; the average grant was \$4,537; the average request was \$9,887. The Williamsburgh Arts and Cultural Council for Youth (El Puente) has been providing a variety of youth programs for Latino youth in the Williamsburgh area of Brooklyn for several years. With the \$8,000 Planning and Development grant they worked with the Community School, an alternative high school, to develop an arts and cultural heritage curriculum for "at risk" Latino students. Also funded in this category was the Seneca-Iroquois National Museum in Cattaraugus County, the Southern Tier. The museum received \$5,000 and piloted a project with the Salamanca School District to expand the existing Native American artist in residence program to include a carver, painter and silversmith. The expansion and enhancement of the residencies will allow more students to work directly with the artists in programs related closely to the curriculum.

In the Special Projects category 16 organizations were funded. Some worked with multiple educational partners over a broad geographic region, with students in hospitals, prisons or other institutions or provided programs for children with special needs. The average

request in this category was \$23,859 and the average grant \$7,954. The International Art of Jazz received \$5,000 to extend its jazz residencies into several new schools in the Adirondacks in Clinton, Essex and Franklin counties. IAJ's program will reach schools that have never had jazz performers in their schools offering performances and interacting with students in the classrooms. Hospital Audiences brings performances and workshops to patients in hospitals in the New York City area. With \$15,000 from the AIE Program they will address the needs of chronically ill children in pediatric wards in St. Mary's Hospital for Children, Bellevue Hospital Psychiatric Pediatrics Ward and New York University Medical Center—Institute for Rehabilitative Medicine. Because of the nature of their

illnesses these children are in long-term or extended care and have few opportunities for arts experiences. Film artist Susan Stoltz worked with these children to create their own stop action animation films. Children worked independently and in groups to create their short films which they shared with their parents and hospital staff.

The Commission and Sponsored Projects categories received 28 requests to commission artists to create new works of art specifically for children. Fifteen commissions in the performing arts were funded for artists to create new works for dance, music and theater. The average request in this category was \$6,557 and the

average grant was \$4,263. Jacques d'Amboise's National Dance Institute received \$10,000 toward *Children and the Performing Arts Celebrate Literature*, which will bring together writers, composers and visual artists in a collaboration between the humanities and the performing arts to create new works performed by and for children. The artists commissioned include choreographers Amy Lehman and Michael Owen; composers David Amram and Martin Charnin, visual artists Susan Crile, Red Grooms and Keith Haring; and authors Gwendolyn Brooks, Toni Morrison and Leslie Marmon Silko. The Buffalo New Music Ensemble received \$2,800 to commission composer Ferruccio Germani to create a new composition for the ensemble to be premiered in the Buffalo Schools.

In response to suggestions from the arts in education field to fund publications, seminars and conferences of general interest to the field, the AIE Program established the Services to the Field category in 1987-88. Twenty organizations requested support in this category and eight were funded. The average request was \$10,970 and the average grant was \$9,000. Projects funded in this category included regional planning projects by local arts councils, a report on AIE programs in the NYC schools, a resource manual on pre-kindergarten learning programs in Tompkins County, statewide technical assistance provided by the New York Foundation for the Arts, and a documentary film on an inter-generational arts project. As part of their county-wide services, the Dutchess County Arts Council received \$17,000 to provide assistance to organizations, artists, and the local BOCES in needs assessment, implementation and evaluation of arts and environmental education programs. The arts council will help to connect organizations and artists who can provide school programs; aid organizations to assess and improve their programs; and advise individual artists on how to integrate their AIE programs into school curricula. The New York Zoological Society (Bronx Zoo) received \$7,000 to offer a three-day seminar to teams of science teachers and administrators on how the use of living collections from zoos and nature centers can enhance the science curriculum. The ten teacher/administrator teams were selected from applicants around the State and spent three days at the Bronx Zoo working with zoo staff on topics such as the use of living

animals in the classroom, the use of scientific equipment for studying living collections, using zoos and nature centers as resources, and working with the school administration and parents to implement programs.

Dance Program

On one day in the Fall of 1987, a major modern dance company went through final rehearsals for a large retrospective work on the choreography of Katherine Dunham. Meanwhile, in lower Manhattan, a small avant-garde dance troupe made use of low-cost rehearsal space even as a major ballet company readied a six-week workshop designed to groom new ballet choreographers. On this same day, a Black modern dance company completed a home-season run of performances at a theater in Rochester, and a jazz dance company began a three-week residency in Oneonta. What united these diverse events was the Dance Program funding which help to make them possible through, respectively, the funding categories of Commissions, Performance and Rehearsal Space, Incentive Support: Building Ballet Repertory, Professional Performances-Home Base, and Long-Term Residency in New York State. Overall, 104 dance organizations received a total of \$3,664,000 in funding under 12 categories in the 1987-88 year.

Historically, one of the main aims of Dance Program assistance has been the live performance of dance for the general public. At the same time, an effort has been made to insure that dancers are professionally compensated for all periods of rehearsal and performance. Two funding categories, Professional Performances-Home Base and General Operating Support, have particular relevance to this mission and more than two-thirds of all Dance Program funding was expended under them in 1987-88. Within the General Operating Support category, twenty-seven dance organizations, including the Merce Cunningham Dance Company, the Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater, the American Ballet Theatre, the Trisha Brown Company, Performance Space 122, the New York City Ballet and Dance Theatre of Harlem, were awarded a total of \$2,336,600 in funds. Although General Operating Support has been defined as unrestricted support for ongoing in-

stitutional activities, live performances in New York State have been interpreted as one of these activities. For example, well over 500 performances were offered during the year by the organizations receiving General Operating Support. A criterion in the consideration of these requests was a demonstrated history of paying artists' salaries or fees. The funding category of Professional Performances-Home Base was responsible for the funding of 53 dance companies in home-season appearances. Major engagements by the Paul Taylor Dance Company, the American Ballroom Theater, the Lar Lubovitch Dance Company and Bill T. Jones/Arnie Zane & Company were assisted. The category embraced an exhilarating artistic breadth of projects,

making possible, for example, a five-week season by the Feld Ballet at the Joyce Theater as well as a first-time appearance by Dinizulu's African Drums and Dancers at PS 122. Also addressed were home-season appearances by Berkshire Ballet (Albany), the Buffalo Ballet Theatre, and Garth Fagan's Bucket Dance Theatre (Rochester), among other upstate dance companies. A number of organizations received their first awards under the category in 1987-88 including Yung Yung Tsuai and Dancers, David Dorfman Dance, and Victoria Marks Performance Company.

Commissioning projects continued to play a

significant role in 1987-88 funding as a total of \$114,500 was directed towards the fees of guest choreographers for the creation or restaging of 38 works. Perhaps one of the most significant restagings was that of Vaslav Nijinsky's *Le Sacre du Printemps* by the Joffrey Ballet. The restaging was celebrated by audiences and critics alike for making possible a reevaluation of the ballet that ignited a storm of controversy upon its 1913 premiere. \$10,000 assisted with the restaging fees. Another reconstruction, entitled *The Magic of Katherine Dunham*, threatened to bring down the house when the Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater unveiled this full-evening work at City Center in December, to clamorous praise. \$25,000 in Dance Program assistance was directed towards Miss Dunham's fee. In the Spring, the New York City Ballet premiered new ballets by Paul Taylor, Laura Dean, Lar Lubovitch, and William Forsythe in its American Music Festival with a commissioning award of \$25,000. Some of the other recipients included the Jelon Vieira Dance Brazil (Capoeira Foundation), Dance Theatre of Harlem, Ballet Hispanico (New York City Hispanic-American Dance Company), Westchester's Rondo Dance Theater, Dance Theater Workshop, and Performance Space 122. A complete listing of choreographers and commissioning organizations appears on pages 60-61.

During the year, the Dance Program also worked to improve the environment for dance in metropolitan and rural areas in upstate New York. In addition to funding resident dance companies (under Professional Performances-Home Base) in those regions, the Program offered support for touring upstate in three funding areas. The Long-Term Residency in New York State category helped to make possible a total of 18 weeks of residencies by five companies with \$122,000 in support. Otsego County was visited by two companies, the Danny Buraczeski Dance Company and New York Baroque Dance Company, for a total of six weeks; soloist Dana Reitz was in residence for four weeks at Rochester's Pyramid Arts Center; the Jose Limon Company visited Purchase for four weeks, while the Twyla Tharp Dance Company settled in for a four-week residency at Skidmore College during the Summer, 1987. Funds were directed towards dancers' salaries and administrative costs relating to each residency. The companies realized essen-

tial goals of the funding category: the building of audiences for upstate dance events and a sustained period of creative rehearsal time. Professional Performances Touring helped to send six companies to upstate locations with a total of \$30,000 in support. As one example, Ruby Shang and Company offered the premiere of a site-specific work at the Islip Art Museum in October. Of particular interest in 1987-88 was the inauguration of a new funding category, the New York State Touring Plan, an enterprising effort to offer multi-year support and videotape marketing assistance to dance companies undertaking a three-year plan of touring to upstate locations. Six dance companies, including the Lar Lubovitch Dance Company, Kei Takei's Moving Earth, and Ballet Hispanico (New York City Hispanic-American Dance Company), were assisted with a total of \$73,000 in support.

The Long-Range Development category offered support, totalling \$30,000 to two dance companies who had designed three-year projects to spur artistic and administrative growth, without the need to mount an annual performance season. Codanceco received first-year support while the Elisa Monte Dance Company used its second-year support to mount a week of performances at the Joyce Theater during the Winter.

Affordable rehearsal space for dance companies continued to be a major concern during 1987-88 and the Dance Program more than doubled its support of studio spaces offering low-cost rentals. Fifteen sponsoring organizations received a total of \$66,000 in support covering 23,633 hours which served 417 dance companies. Among the organizations assisted under the Performance and Rehearsal Space category were Pentacle (Danceworks), the New York Dance Center, P.S. 1 in Queens (Institute for Art and Urban Resources), and the Ethnic Folk Arts Center.

The Dance Program continued its strong investment in helping to secure a future for the classical ballet repertory through awards totalling \$87,000 to three organizations under the category, Incentive Support: Building Ballet Repertory. Two of the award recipients, the Foundation for the Joffrey Ballet and the American Ballet Theatre (Ballet Theatre Foundation), were also among those supported when the funding category was initiated during the 1985-86 funding season. Then, as now, the

category offers support to workshops designed to develop new ballet choreographers. The American Ballet Theatre used its \$45,000 award to conduct a workshop of four weeks duration involving four choreographers and nearly 20 dancers from the company. The Joffrey II Dancers conducted a six-week workshop with \$17,000 in support while the New York City Ballet, in a first such award, worked with five developing choreographers during a rehearsal period of several weeks.

Rounding out the Dance Program's funding activity was the category of Services to the Field, through which eleven organizations received a total of \$230,500 in support to carry out projects having wide ramifications for the artistic and administrative well-being of the New York State dance community. Among the projects funded were a program of discounted dance tickets (Theatre Development Fund), a program of administrative services (Pentacle Management), and an archival undertaking involving the filming and videotaping of several works (New York Public Library).

Decentralization Program

In accordance with its original mandate from the State Legislature to encourage participation in the grant decision making process at the local level, the Decentralization Program remains one of the Council's most dynamic mechanisms for making cultural programs accessible to geographically and ethnically diverse segments of the State's population.

Guidelines for regranteeing funds through the Decentralization Program are set by local leadership, according to basic Council standards, and grants are reviewed by local citizens concerned about the quality of life in their communities and the participation of all segments of the population. Decentralization supported programs reflect strong artistic impulses from individual artists and community arts groups, and speak to issues of importance in local communities from year to year. Funded programs reflect the unique issues of local development in counties such as the Bronx as well as issues of critical importance to communities throughout our State such as the preservation of ethnic traditions and quality of life for an aging citizenry. During its ten year history the Decentralization Program

has significantly broadened the reach of New York State arts funding and has provided a basis for critical cultural development on a local level.

In 1987-88 Decentralization expanded to include sixty-one of the State's sixty-two counties and allocated a total of \$1,600,000 in funds to 45 Regrant Agencies throughout the State. Counties joining the program in this tenth anniversary year included Essex, Putnam, Genesee, Ontario, Oswego, Ulster and Manhattan. In the coming year the New York State Council on the Arts enthusiastically anticipates the inclusion of Columbia County in the Program, making Decentralization support and the local decision making process available in all counties of New York State.

Film Program

In 1987-88 the Film Program oversaw a period of increased stability and expansion in the field of film. The Whitney Museum of American Art mounted the first retrospective devoted to the films of Andy Warhol, in the process making available numerous films that had been lost for years. The Metropolitan Museum of Art organized a film symposium to accompany its Dogon show, bringing the

legendary Jean Rouch from Paris to address the New York audience. The International Museum of Photography in Rochester, which had spearheaded a major funds drive to create a facility adequate for its internationally-important film and photography collection and its scholarly use, broke ground on construction of its new building. And, finally, the Film Arts Foundation (Anthology Film Archive) secured an unprecedented loan that has allowed construction to proceed on its historical courthouse building in Manhattan's East Village.

The Film Program spent its \$2,113,500 budget to fund 168 different organizations to carry out a total of 212 projects, an increase of nearly 10% over the previous year. At a time when so many film organizations are facing tight economic constraints, one of the most positive developments was the creation in Ithaca of a new programming network that aims to tie together film exhibitors throughout Central New York State. A co-venture between Cornell Cinema and Ithaca College, the consortium has already increased communication between established and emerging exhibitors in a region that is ready for improved and expanded film programming. The Central New York Programmers Group places special emphasis upon bringing individual filmmakers into the area.

Three distinct areas of concern are addressed by the Film Program's funding of organizations, projects, and artists. In the area of support for artists, the Film Program in 1987-88 extended its support for filmmakers at the stage of distributing their films. Seventeen filmmakers were funded for such costs as striking prints, designing brochures, and conducting promotional mailings. The Alternative Media Information Center received a grant for Oren Rudavsky's *Spark Among The Ashes*. Funds will allow Rudavsky to develop a study guide to stimulate school use of this documentary of a young American boy who journeys to Cracow, Poland, to celebrate the first Bar Mitzvah since the Holocaust. Through the Women Make Movies organization, filmmaker Peggy Stern received distribution support for her film, *Stephanie*, a documentary that traces a troubled girl's high school years. Made over an extended period of time, *Stephanie* has enjoyed wide success and national broadcast over the public television system. Through the same organization, director

Kevin Conway, and producers Maria Norman and Mila Burnette, were funded to make distribution prints of their film, *The Sun And The Moon*, a dramatic work that explores the divided identity of a successful Puerto Rican woman and her struggle to reconnect with her roots. This category of distribution support has been a successful initiative aimed at addressing the crucial moment when independent filmmakers finish their work, frequently in debt, yet must get that work out to its widest possible audience.

Other funding from the Film Program expanded services to individual artists. A grant to the Hallwalls Contemporary Arts Center in Buffalo allows the organization to make small grants to filmmakers in the Western New York region. A grant to the Film News Now Foundation in New York City supports its provision of consulting services to minority directors and producers. The Foundation for Independent Video and Film

received funds to produce a handbook for independent filmmakers, *Doing It Yourself*, that offers instruction and models for self-distribution.

Of course, the major mechanism for supporting artists within the Film Program is the category of film production funding. Here, a quarter of the annual budget was directed to 29 film projects being made by individual filmmakers and sponsored by nonprofit organizations. See the description of films which received Council funds this year under the Individual Artists Program's section of this report. As it can take a

number of years from the time of funding to the time of completion, 1987-88 witnessed the successful release of a number of films that received support from the Film Program earlier. Filmmaker Brent Owens probably established a record for duration: his documentary on the South Bronx, *A Cry For Help*, was 12 years in the making before it aired on WNET's winter season. Almost just as long, though, was Deborah Dickson's work in bringing *Frances Steloff: Memoirs of A Gotham Bookseller* to the screen. Completed in time for Miss Steloff's 100th birthday, the film was nominated for an Academy Award. Chris Choy and Renee Tajima's feature-length documentary, *Who Killed Vincent Chin?*, was selected to open the prestigious New Directors/New Films Festival at the Museum of Modern Art and was picked up for theatrical release. Deborah Shaffer's *Fire From The Mountain* was selected for the New York Film Festival and set for national broadcast on the new PBS series, *Point of View*. Not all the news was in the documentaries. Sheila McLaughlin's dramatic feature debut, *She Must Be Seeing Things*, opened at the Film Forum after a successful screening on German television.

The Film Program has also, of course, continued its support to organizations, both for general operating support and for projects. In this period, support to the Collective for Living Cinema was increased to allow promotion of a new seven-day-a-week schedule, going far beyond any previous programming volume there. Theatrical film exhibition was also enhanced, with Film Forum expanding into a second screen devoted entirely to repertory at a time when the number of repertory cinemas for which New York City was once famous sharply diminished. In Binghamton, As Is Light began operation of the Art Theatre bringing quality independent and first-run films to town that previously had no venue.

Other projects targeted particular styles and genres of film to focus attention on new trends, underexposed cinemas, or long-lost classics. Camera News received funding for a touring show of new British Black cinema; Amigos del Museo del Barrio got a planning grant for a new festival of contemporary independent Latino cinema and its influences; Exit Art was funded to present New York's first international festival of Super-8 film, with an accompanying catalogue; New York University received funds for an ex-

haustive retrospective and conference on the works of Orson Welles; and the Gallery Association of New York State was funded to convene a special workshop on children's programming, bringing together organizational representatives from throughout the State.

Aside from these notable exhibition projects, Film Program support also went to Squeaky Wheel in Buffalo to provide access and information services to local filmmakers, as well as to the Visual Studies Workshop in Rochester to make available the equipment left by the demise of Portable Channel's facility there. Of special interest to New Yorkers is the circulation of newly preserved films from the International Museum of Photography's archives in a joint venture with the Museum of Modern Art's circulating film library, because this project includes making available for the first time a print of *The Last Of The Mohicans* shot in New York State in 1921.

1987-88 was a banner time for at least one film organization: Camera News (Third World Newsreel) celebrated its twentieth anniversary. The organization, which grew from a producers' collective in the late sixties into a full-service distribution, exhibition and training organization in the late eighties, celebrated with a twenty-year retrospective. Such longevity provides inspiration to a field constantly under pressure to maintain its survival.

Support to both organizations and artists ultimately serves audiences as well, for all three are intrinsically interdependent. Still, some of the Film Program's awards target service to an audience even more straightforwardly and directly.

For example, film preservation has always been an area of extreme importance in terms of saving our nation's heritage of cinematic production for the generations of the future. Access to preserved films, however, has often only been available to scholars. At the YIVO Institute, the Film Program funded a unique project relating to film preservation: historically-important footage of life in Eastern Europe's Pale of Settlement early in this century is being shown to Jewish Americans from those regions to identify people, regions and customs, all documented through an oral history project staged in conjunction with the preservation and dissemination of the film materials.

Audiences in rural areas are notoriously

underserved, so the Film Program has focused funding in a number of projects that redress this problem. The Roxbury Arts Group was funded for the pilot year of a new Nickelodeon program that tours films in the Catskills, bringing the work to more isolated areas not easily accessible to one another. In Wayne County, the library system was funded to develop a new collection of films concentrating on the issue of aging. Up in Plattsburgh, the Clinton-Essex-Franklin Library System has been supported to purchase films for its region, frequently seeking out those titles which can broaden the perspectives of its residents. In Olean, the public library was funded to present its first annual festival of rural films, bringing in independent filmmakers to discuss their work with the local audience.

In Queens, the Library Action Committee of Corona has sought to bring the new independent black cinema to its audiences by acquiring copies of the films which it shows and loans. Thus it supplements what is available through the main public library system for a particular community's needs.

Finally, the Film Program this year funded three new projects aimed at an audience which may not be thought of as underserved—children—but which perhaps fails more than any other to find alternatives to commercial product. Both the Brooklyn Museum and the Collective for Living Cinema initiated children's film series, while the Gallery Association of New York State designed a workshop for those involved in

showing films to children.

These three areas (artist, organization, and audience) are all vitally necessary to the prosperous development of a film culture in New York State. No one can exist without the others. The Film Program continues to devote its attention and resources to all three to ensure the survival of New York's film communities, in 1987-88 and the future.

Folk Arts Program


The Folk Arts Program supports a constituency as highly varied as New York State is culturally diverse. The folk arts are practiced by ethnic, occupational, regional and religious groups throughout the State. They express the sense of beauty, shared identity and values of a community. The Program endeavors to both maintain and revitalize the folk arts within the communities where they originate and broaden opportunities to experience these traditions among general audiences.

During 1987-88 the Folk Arts Program provided a total of \$1,500,000 to 115 organizations, 43 of which were new to the Program.

The regionalization of folk arts activities throughout the State has been a primary objective of the Program since its establishment in 1985. Extensive support has been provided for the development of regional and county-wide programs to systematically document and present ongoing presentations of the traditions of an area. Staff folklorist positions supported by the Program are pivotal to the success of many regional folk arts programs. The Lower Adirondack Regional Arts Council's staff folklorist coordinated a *Festival at the Fair*, consisting of presentations of ethnic and regional traditions at the Washington County Fair. This folklorist also worked closely with the Saratoga County Historical Society, which was supported for a project to document and present the traditions of the Upper Sacandaga Valley, an area which includes parts of both Fulton and Saratoga counties. Southern Tier folk arts are documented, interpreted and presented by the Roberson Center for the Arts and Sciences' Curator of Folklife, whose position is also supported through the Staff Folklorist funding category. During 1987-88 funding was also provided for the Curator of Folklife to create an exhibit of Southern

Tier traditions which will travel to libraries, schools, senior citizens' centers, cultural organizations and hospital and bank lobbies.

Institutional support for folk arts organizations substantially increased in 1987-88. The World Music Institute received first time support in the General Operating Support funding category. A remarkably broad spectrum of traditional

performing arts from throughout the world are presented by this organization. Their programming ranged from Balinese shadow puppet theatre to marimba (wooden xylophone) music from Zimbabwe, to urban blues. First time support for an administrative salary was received by the New York Folklore Society, a statewide organization based in Rensselaer County. Their activities include the publication of the journal, *New York Folklore*, which received project support for a special issue on traditional folk music in New York State.

The value of the folk arts as a living cultural heritage which provides a linkage between the past and present was demonstrated in a number of projects supported by the Program. Polish American visual folk arts practiced among over 30 members of several generations of the Pazda family of Cheektowaga are the subject of an exhibition for which funding was provided to the Arts Council in Buffalo and Erie County. The *giglio* and the *giglio* feast, an event where a 65 foot high, 3,000 pound tower is "danced" through

the streets of Brooklyn will be explored in an exhibition for which support was provided to the Brooklyn Historical Society. The exhibition will deal with both the history of this tradition, brought to Brooklyn from Italy in 1903, and its contemporary manifestations in the Williamsburg neighborhood. The Dutchess County Department of History was supported for a publication, exhibition and workshops on stone wall construction techniques in their county. These stone walls are associated with both Anglo-Dutch traditions practiced over two centuries and the traditions of Italian residents who settled in the county during the twentieth century.

Folk arts apprenticeships continued to represent the Program's principal means for supporting individual folk artists. By enabling a master folk artist to teach his or her art form to a qualified apprentice, the chains of transmission are strengthened and a folk art can be perpetuated with renewed vitality. The *plena*, an improvisatory Puerto Rican song tradition involving commentary on historical and contemporary events, is the focus of an apprenticeship for which support was provided to Los Pleneros de la 21. The Adirondack tradition of rustic furniture making was supported through funding for an apprenticeship undertaken through the Sagamore Institute. Greek Epirot clarinet music will be taught in an apprenticeship for which funds were awarded to Movement Research.

The folk arts field responded imaginatively to the Program's encouragement of Folk Arts Broadcasting for Local and Ethnic Radio and Television. The Program's support in this area included film, video and audio productions in the folk arts as well as programs capturing traditions through live broadcasts of folk artists on radio and television. WSKG in Binghamton was supported for a series of 16 video modules, 3-7 minute mini-features on Southern Tier folk traditions which will be broadcast repeatedly on public broadcasting stations. The Women's Inter-art Center was supported for an audio documentary which will focus on a six block area of Manhattan, documenting the traditions of the residents of the Clinton neighborhood in the context of the changes taking place as their area undergoes accelerating urban development. Live performances by Greek traditional musicians were featured on a radio series broadcast on WNYE-FM in New York.

Folk Arts Program support in 1987-88 included projects of significance to the elderly, who represent many of the State's most valued tradition bearers. The Arts Council of Rockland was supported for a conference and traveling exhibition on the life review process, exploring how elderly folk artists create works expressive of their life experiences. A project of the Lockport Senior Citizens Center which was supported by the Program involved the documentation and presentation of narratives of the Erie Canal which continue in tradition among elderly residents of Lockport.

A variety of approaches to exploring relationships between traditions was evident in projects supported by the Program in FY 88. The Burchfield Art Center was funded for an exhibition on Buffalo area folk artists which will focus on traditions shaped by a variety of factors, including family life, economic situations, occupation and ethnicity. Support was provided to the Kirkland Art Center for a project dealing with the traditional arts of women in Central New York. Sacred Arts received support for a series of lecture/demonstrations on religious folk artists, including a Russian icon painter, Buddhist calligrapher and Sufi musician.

New Yorkers living in restrictive environments with minimal opportunities for arts programming benefitted from projects supported by the Program. Hospital Audiences was supported for a series of lecture/demonstrations held in hospitals and nursing homes. The Geneseo Migrants Project, funded through the Arts Council for Wyoming County, continued to document and present the traditions of migrant workers in Western New York. An exhibition of the folk arts of Algonquin Indians and presentations of the traditions of Caribbean and African American migrants occurred during the 1987 migrant season.

The rapid growth of the folk arts field in the State has been accompanied by a commitment to the enhancement of professional skills. The Program is working closely with its constituency to respond to a widespread interest in professional development activities which involve both specialists in the folk arts and organizations in related fields. The Metropolitan Museum of Art was supported for a workshop on folk arts and folk-life traditions directed towards museum professionals. The Schomburg Center for Research in

Black Culture co-sponsored with the Folk Arts Program *The Arts of Black Folk*, a conference for African-American community organizations on methods of documenting and presenting the folk arts. A technical workshop co-sponsored by the Arts Council at Freeport and the Folk Arts Program contributed to the upgrading of the skills of professional folklorists in audio recording, photography and the presentation of performing folk artists.

Individual Artists Program

New York owes its unique prominence in the cultural life of the nation to its artists. Support for the creation and public experience of new work is an essential responsibility of the Council—one which it addresses through a variety of funding mechanisms. The Individual Artists Program administers funding in five categories of support for the creation of work. The program also serves the creative artist as a constituent of the Council through information services and advocacy both within the Council and on a statewide level. The Individual Artists Program handles three areas of support for artist-initiated projects in film and media (video and audio) production, and visual artists' independent projects (Sponsored Work). These requests are made through the sponsorship of a nonprofit organization that acts as a fiscal conduit for the artist. The program also handles music and theatre commissions. These requests are generally initiated by the ensemble or company that will perform or present the work.

Support for residencies, subsidy of technical facilities and workplaces, other commissioning as well as institutional support that creates venues for the presentation of artists work, are offered in several discipline areas. Refer to the grants listings throughout this book for references to additional funding that benefits artists.

During 1987-88, the Individual Artists Program administered a total of \$1,272,665, for 116 projects involving composers, filmmakers, media artists, playwrights, theatre directors and designers, painters, sculptors, performance artists, and photographers.

This year's allocation to the Film Production category represented an \$89,000 increase in funds from last year. A total of \$505,234 was awarded to 29 projects. This increase in support

emphasizes the Council's commitment to supporting the creation of new work by both established and emerging filmmakers within the State, and responds to an increased need within the field as costs rise and resources diminish for filmmakers. Awards of up to \$25,000 were provided for all stages of production; from research and development through post production. In an effort to assist filmmakers to complete their projects, in a time when independent film has become an increasingly expensive activity, the Council permits applicants who have received Council funding to apply in subsequent years for completion funds. Half of these awards were for filmmakers never before supported at the Council, and over 50% of the awards were to minority and women artists. In addition to an increase in the number of applications for film production, this year the Council reviewed an increased number of pre-production requests, which provide filmmakers with funds to complete research and development, archival acquisition and scripting for projects. The majority of requests are for production support, which this year received 50% of the funding, with the remaining 37% of awards for post production, and 13% for pre-production.

Production funds this year were awarded within all genres of filmmaking. Ayoka Chenzira received \$18,000 as second time funding for completion of *Poets on the Dance Floor*, an animated film that explores the history of African American people through movement and dance. Approximately 43% of Film Production awards this year were for documentary projects. Anne Bohlen, Kevin Rafferty and James Ridgeway received \$25,000 for production support for *Right Thinking*, a feature length documentary about right wing extremists in America. Orinne JT. Takagi was awarded \$16,468 in completion funds for *Koreans Apart*, a documentary that explores the lives of Korean people since the civil war of 1950-53 in both North and South Korea, and here in America. 22% of support this year was for experimental films. Filmmaker Jonas Mekas received \$16,900 for completion of the second part of his autobiographical trilogy *This is My Life on Earth*. Jody Lafond received \$13,125 for production support of her experimental film *Going Places* which explores the use of music and montage in the opening sequences of narrative films. Awards for narrative films comprised

27% of this year's funding. Roy Wilson was awarded \$6,000 for post-production support of *Hunger*, a short narrative film about a contemporary Black man's search for self. Christine Choy and Lilah Kan received \$10,000 in pre-production support for *Shanghai Lil's*, a dramatic future set in the Asian American community during World War II.

This State is home to the nation's most vital and diverse independent media community. The Media Production funding category takes in the full spectrum of creative activity in the electronic arts. The Council held the Production funding category at the previous year's level of \$400,397, but in fact, increased its commitment to artists through another funding mechanism—Regrant. (See the Media Program narrative in this report.) Here again, grants went to emerging as well as more established artists. About half of the recipients were first-time grantees.

Support has been given to artists to explore the technology, and to develop and communicate ideas about the world and themselves. For the potential audiences, these projects present an opportunity for a variety of aesthetic and human experiences. Grahme Weinbren received support for his second major three disc interactive project *Circumstantial Disorder*. The work will draw upon three related narrative lines. The viewer has a creative role—he or she can select among the three sources what is seen and heard via a touch sensitive screen. The Council was an early supporter of the research and development of the interactive technology through its grant for Weinbren's earlier work *The Erl King*. This year the Council also helped launch another artist's exploration of the creative potential of interactive technology. Collis Davis received research and pre-production support for *Elegba's Strategem*, a piece which juxtaposes elements of Yoruba legend with the story of a contemporary Black artist. Documentaries presented a range of topical interests this year, from an exploration of New York City's foster care system by Demetria Royals, to an investigation of the social and economic issues surrounding the AIDS crisis, by Gregg Bordowitz, Hillary Kipness and David Meiran. Support for audio included works for installation and radio broadcast. Bill and Mary Buchen will collaborate on the construction of an interactive work drawing on a variety of acoustical and electronic

sources of sound. *Sound Engine* will be triggered by foot mats, motion detectors, and voice sensors, creating an audio environment unique to each individual passing through the installation. Support was also granted to New Radio and Performing Arts' New American Radio Series. The grant is for the production of three original works for radio by minority artists. The project will bring the unique creative voices of three accomplished artists, playwright Maria Irene Fornes, novelist Diana Chang, and jazz composer Olu Daru, to a new audience. It also presents the artists with the

opportunity to experiment with what had been for them an untried medium, with the help of veteran producers Helen Thorington and Regine Beyers.

The Sponsored Work category (formerly Sponsored Projects) is designed to help visual artists realize a specific project or complete a defined body of work. Visual Artists working in all media are eligible for awards. The grants

provide for 100% of the direct project expenses up to \$10,000, and an additional \$500 for administration of the grant by the sponsoring organization. Priority is given to those proposals which have the potential for making a significant contribution to the development of the artist. The 1987-88 allocation was \$174,776, an increase over last year's level. The 17 awards made this year mirror the complexity and range of the world of the visual arts. The disciplines of performance, installation, photography, craft, book arts and, of course, painting and sculpture are represented among the projects funded.

Topical issues are reflected in the work of photographer Catherine Allport. *Apartheid No!* brings a unique eye to the injustices of the South African government by combining social action, theory and photography. Krzysztof Wodiczko's *Homeless Vehicle*, inspired by his

work with the homeless, adds an artist's voice to the dialogue on solutions. *Beware of the Moving Platform*, an interdisciplinary installation and performance by Olivia Beens, inspired by the New York City Transit System, comments on life in the Big Apple as does Fiona Templeton's performance work *You—The City*. Wayne Toepp's *Capitol Proscenium Series* presents a view of another New York urban center: Rome. These relief paintings, in structure and content, relate to the architecture and history of the Capitol Civic Center.

In 1987-88, \$33,500 was awarded for eight theatre commissions. The goal of the category

is to provide opportunities to expand the creative possibilities for both an individual artist and the theatre company. By providing funds to groups that would be unable to commission outside talents, due to their limited budgets, these grants stimulate new working relationships and encourage experimentation and development. Half of the awards this year were for women and minority artists.


Work that was supported this year represented the broad variety of artists and performance venues that requested commissioning funds. Director Joanne Pottlitzer and actress Joan MacIntosh received \$5,000 to develop a play about the life and work of Mexican painter Frida Kahlo. Valeria Vasilevski was awarded \$2,500 to direct *Song of Lawino*, a collaborative dance/theatre piece derived from the East African poem by Okot p'Bitek, with voice by Yoland Bavan, music by Edwina Lee Tyler and Tiye Giraud, and choreography by Jawolle Zollar. The completed piece was performed at Dance Theater Workshop and garnered praise from reviewers in the New York press. Mac Wellman received \$7,500 to write a new play exploring the formal aspects of language and communication for the Shaliko Company. Juan Alum was awarded \$3,000 to write a new full length play for the African-Caribbean Poetry Theatre in the Bronx.

This year \$163,700 was awarded for 32 Composers' Commissions. This represented an increase of over \$60,000 from last year's awards. The category is designed to provide incentives for the creation of new works for a variety of performance venues. This year, the Council implemented new guidelines which allowed organizations to apply for up to 100% of the composer's fee. Commissions were awarded for a broad range of new works that included orchestral, operatic, chamber, choral, electronic and jazz compositions, as well as scores for films and performance works.

Gunther Schuller received \$6,000 to compose a work for the Da Capo Chamber Players. Ezra Laderman was awarded \$10,000 to compose a double concerto for performers Elmar Oliveira and Nathaniel Rosen. The commission was sponsored by Syracuse Symphony Orchestra on behalf of a consortium including the Buffalo Philharmonic and the Indianapolis Symphony. Cecil Taylor received \$4,000 to compose a work for the New York Woodwind Quintet as a part

of their 40th Anniversary Season. Pauline Oliveros received \$10,000 to compose a score for a full length theatrical work based on the life of Angolan Queen *Nzinga*. The piece will be scored for percussian, woodwinds, strings, voice and synthesized sounds. Tania Leon and Michel Camilo shared a \$10,000 commission to collaborate on a new work for Western Wind Vocal Ensemble. The composition will fuse western classical, latin, jazz and popular styles and will be scored for vocal ensemble, percussion and synthesizers. Half of the awards this year were for minority and women composers, and a majority of both emerging and established composers are receiving Council support for the first time.

Literature Program

In 1987-88 the Literature Program placed new emphasis on strengthening literary organizations around the State. Responding to the need to stabilize and encourage the many institutions which provide literary programming and serve writers outside of the metropolitan New York City area, a new category, Institutional Development for Upstate Literary Organizations, was established. In this category, \$35,000 was awarded to three organizations: the Community Writers' Project in Syracuse to redesign its administrative structure; the Hudson Valley Writers' Guild in Albany to fund its first full

time director; and Writers and Books of Rochester to engage several fundraising and administrative consultants.

Funds in the institutional development category were in addition to the almost \$143,500 which was awarded for General Operating Support and Technical Assistance this year. All of the organizations receiving funds in the General Operating Support category have as their primary goal the support of writers. A category in the Literature Program that provides the most direct funding to individual writers is that of Writers-In-Residence. Outreach to a diverse group of organizations has yielded a significant number of residencies in the upstate region such as those of Page D. Delano in Saratoga Springs, William Hathaway in Lake George, Ray Young Bear in Olean, William Rosenfeld in Old Forge and Leigh Allison Wilson in Oswego. Many of the writers awarded residencies such as Frances Chung at Henry Street Settlement and Wesley Brown at the Library Action Committee of Corona will facilitate outreach to a variety of minority communities.

Other channels by which the Literature Program offers support to writers include funding the development of playwrights in the Staged Readings category, introduced two years ago; as well as awards to translators who will be translating new work for publication as well as plays for theatrical production.

The Literature Program supports public readings of writers' work in a number of ways. The NYSCA-funded organization, Poets & Writers Inc. sponsors workshops and readings in all 62 counties of the State. One of the largest categories in the Literature Program, Writers Appearances, provides additional direct support of individual authors as well as offering audiences the opportunity to hear a variety of poets and fiction writers, playwrights and essayists read their work. The range of organizations that regularly present reading series is equally broad, including Yomoma Arts Literary Salons and Frederick Douglass Creative Arts Center in Manhattan, the Polish Community Center in Buffalo, the Rome Art and Community Center in Oneida County and the Woodstock Guild of Craftsmen in Ulster.

Another way that the Literature Program aids in bringing writers to audiences is the support of New York State magazines and non-commercial presses. Publications such as *Blatant Arti-*

fice (Buffalo), *Grand Street* (Manhattan) *Lake Effect* (Oswego), and *Parabola* (Manhattan) publish the poetry, fiction and non-fiction of new as well as established writers for a local and national readership.

While there are a significant number of ongoing programs funded by the Literature Program, each year has seen special projects receive first-

time awards. This year the Literature Program supported two important events—*Expanding the Audience for Independent Publishers*, a conference on marketing and distribution, and the establishment of a Latin American Writers Institute. The three-day Distribution Conference, held in Rochester, brought together over 50 publishers, distributors, agents and editors of both literary and visual arts publications to discuss the ways they might improve the dissemination of their publications and work cooperatively with one another. Attendees included those from both the non-commercial and commercial fields. This event will yield a publication that will be distributed to all New York alternative presses and magazines to help them work toward strengthening their sales networks and administrative structures.

Following the overwhelming success of the

NYSCA-funded Latin American Bookfair for the past two years, the Literature Program awarded a grant to establish the Latin American Writers Institute. This organization, the first of its kind in New York State, will represent writers from all countries in Latin America and the Caribbean and will be housed at the City College of New York. The Institute has embarked upon an ambitious series of lectures, readings and workshops involving Latin American writers from around the world as well as Spanish-speaking writers and audiences in Manhattan.

In the 17 years of its existence, the Literature Program has balanced the needs of individual writers, audiences and organizations across the State. Recent outreach to rural, upstate and minority communities over the past few years has greatly enriched the literary landscape of New York State.

Local Arts Organizations/ Service Organizations Program

Since its inception, one of the prevailing goals of the Local Arts Organizations/Service Organizations Program (ASO) has been to foster the long term cultural development of communities throughout the State through its support of the artistic and administrative development of local arts agencies. In 1987-88 the Program supported local arts councils and community and contemporary art centers in localities as varied as Coney Island and Cortland, and the Bronx and Broome County. In total, support was provided to ninety-seven local arts agencies representing the breadth of cultural and geographic diversity that is New York State. This constituency is a fundamental component of the arts delivery system of our State and each year expands the critical role it plays in providing financial resources and cultural services to local artists and arts organizations as well as programs in folk arts, arts in education and in the visual, literary and performing arts for the community at large.

In addition to an aggressive commitment to flexible administrative support through the provision of General Operating Support, which represents approximately 80% of the Program's core allocation, the ASO Program has also moved to address the institutional needs of its constituents

through the categories of Institutional Advancement and Professional Consultants. Both categories are designed to encourage organizations to examine their internal and external operating environments and to plan for appropriate change and expansion in the future. In 1987-88 the program supported third year Institutional Advancement awards to Volunteer Lawyers for the Arts and the Jamaica Art Center; second year support to Bronx Council on the Arts and the Rensselaer County Council on the Arts and first year support to Chemung Valley Arts Council, Rockland Center for the Arts and the Alliance of New York State Arts Councils. Grants for the utilization of professional consultants were awarded to seventeen organization to address specific organizational concerns such as financial management, computerization and long range community planning. Each category requires extensive participation from the organization's board of directors, and funds awarded through Institutional Advancement must be matched on a two-to-one basis over three years of participation.

The Local Arts Organizations/Service Organizations Program also supports a network of multi-disciplinary arts service organizations operating throughout the State. These unique organizations provide direct services to individ-

ual artists as well as to arts organizations and share a common goal of providing critical support services to the comprehensive cultural community of the State. No organization more

appropriately represents this dedication to service than the New York Foundation for the Arts. In 1987-88 the Foundation provided fellowship awards to more than 250 individual artists in fourteen categories, granted critical bridge loans to approximately 180 arts organizations, coordinated more than 500 residencies by artists and arts ensembles in schools and community sites, and sponsored new works by more than 170 media and film artists throughout New York State. The New York Foundation has become a State and national model for its innovative partnerships with government and private sector resources and for its support and promotion of the critical role of creative artists in our society.

Special Council initiatives coordinated by the ASO Program in 1987-88 included a new category called Stabilization and Planning designed to assist in the development of multi-art centers. This highly experimental category awarded salary support and consulting fees to three organizations (Coney Island USA, Art Awareness and Oswego Art Guild) in order to stabilize their administrative structure and develop multi-year financial and programmatic plans. The category will continue in 1988-89 and 1989-90 and then be assessed by the Council for its impact on the advancement of participating organizations.

During 1987-88 the ASO Program collaborated with the Special Arts Services Program to create a special initiative in Harlem. Recognizing that the availability of quality arts services is vital to the stability and survival of arts organizations and individual artists in any locale, the Harlem Arts Services Initiative was launched in June of 1988 to address the needs of this unique and culturally rich community. The initiative was designed to increase collaborative efforts and to promote greater sharing of resources among Harlem based arts groups and generated applications from eighteen arts organizations operating in the greater Harlem community. The requests were reviewed by a panel composed of members of both the ASO and SAS panels. A total of \$85,000 was awarded to six organizations for a variety of service projects which included: joint purchase of print advertising to promote the activities of uptown arts organizations and the establishment of a product marketing training project to help boost the fundraising potential of Harlem arts groups.

In 1987-88 the Council also extended its

commitment to marketing the arts of New York State through a special Marketing Training Initiative coordinated by the ASO Program. Training programs are designed to assist participating organizations in identifying and increasing their audiences through in-depth work with marketing experts and professional consultants. A total of \$150,000 was awarded to nine organizations for marketing training for the following constituencies: individual artists working in the schools; emerging dance, theatre and performing arts groups; producers of independent radio programming; independent video and media artists and emerging cultural organizations in numerous localities throughout the State.

Local Incentive Funding Test/LIFT

The Local Incentive Funding Test Program (LIFT) was initiated by the New York State Council on the Arts in 1983-84 to encourage county governments to play an integral role in the delivery of arts programs and services to the citizens of their counties and to encourage cooperation and collaboration among arts organizations based within each county. Through the LIFT Program, funds are awarded to counties on a matching basis with two dollars of State funds matched by three local dollars. Of the matching amounts, a minimum of 60% comes from the local county government budget. The remaining 40% of the local match may come from any other local source including municipal governments or local business.

Over the last five years, the LIFT Program has generated a unique variety of local initiatives on behalf of county-wide cultural development. LIFT has proven to be an effective vehicle for entrepreneurship throughout the State with programs suitably reflecting local priorities.

In Rockland County for 1987-88 State and county LIFT support was used to finance a county-wide advertising campaign titled *Arts Odyssey* and to train county groups to improve their own marketing techniques. In Westchester, county government and the local arts leadership developed a program to increase employment opportunities for individual performing, visual and literary artists through a special Visiting Artists Program. Approximately 75 sites participate in this program annually including senior

nutrition centers, day care facilities specializing in assistance for teenage parents, small town libraries, community centers and a wide range of county school districts. In Schenectady County the LIFT program was the catalyst for the development of a motel/hotel tax dedicated to the support of one of the county's premiere arts institutions (Proctors' Theatre) and for the redistribution of funds to a host of developing arts organizations enhancing both the local economy and the quality of life in Schenectady County.

In 1987-88 twenty-three counties were awarded a total of \$195,540 in grants ranging from \$1,200 to Herkimer County to \$20,000 for Monroe County. Local funds generated to match state support in 1987-88 will exceed \$290,000.

Media Program

In 1987-88, the Media Program received over 500 requests from 160 different organizations for support of both organizational activities and individual productions throughout the State. Of its total allocation of \$1,570,000, more than 25% (\$400,897) was earmarked for productions by individual artists and independent documentary producers.

Within its twin priorities of production and audience development, the Media Program simultaneously sought to address the needs of emerging, minority and upstate artists and organizations. A grant was made to Black Filmmaker Foundation to help underwrite its 10th Anniversary fund-

raising events, with the goal of strengthening this important film and video distributor. Support was given to the World Institute of Black Communications to plan a major exhibition of the work of black video makers. A new Special Project, sponsored by Women Make Movies, aimed at the double purpose of making an advanced new video facility (at Starrett City in Brooklyn) available to artists while at the same time training minority women in video production techniques. Film News Now was awarded \$20,364 to complete its *Minority Action Project* report on the current status of media makers of color in the State. With this grant, Media Program commitment to this important project totals over \$40,000.

Exhibition activities continued to represent the largest portion of the Media Program budget (after production), reflecting the Program's ongoing commitment to developing new audiences for video, audio and radio, especially in underserved communities throughout the State. Several new applicants, among them the Arts Council of Wyoming County, Crandall Library (Glens Falls), and Cornell Cinema (Ithaca) were awarded grants to establish video exhibition programs.

Another new applicant, the New York City Hall of Science in Queens, was awarded a first-time grant for a major audio installation (by Yoshi Wada) to celebrate the re-opening of the Museum's Great Hall. Broadcast TV was represented by WNET's *New Television* series, which is both broadcast in New York City and offered free of charge to New York State public television stations for rebroadcast upstate. The Media Program will continue to support efforts to identify, educate, and entertain new audiences with the best in video and audio art.

A wide range of activities intended to assist, inform, and train media artists was supported through the Services to the Field category. Highlights in this category include: a second-year grant to the newly formed Association of Independents in Radio, an organization which represents and provides services to independent radio producers; awards to the Experimental Intermedia Foundation to explore the use of video projection systems at seven presenting sites in Lower Manhattan; and to Hallwalls in Buffalo to assemble and exhibit the 1988 edition of *Infermental*, an international video "magazine" in tape cassette form.

The Media Regrant category, a very effective way to both increase the amount of money available to artists for production and to identify and encourage the work of upstate emerging artists, continued to grow last year. The Niagara Council of the Arts received support for four media regrant awards to local artists; the Center for Exploratory and Perceptual Arts (CEPA) was awarded funding for its regrant program for Western New York video artists; a regrant program at Rochester's Visual Studies Workshop was established with a new grant; Funding Exchange was funded for its regrant program to support work in alternative issue-oriented media; and continuing support was made for regrant programs at Educational Broadcasting Corporation (WNET), the Checkerboard Foundation, and Writers Guild of America. These awards leveraged an extra \$54,500 in outside matching funds given by the organizations directly to artists for the production of new work.

General Operating Support was awarded to nine organizations which continue to offer ongoing services of significant importance to the media art field. Among them, Downtown Community TV Center, Asian Cinevision, Locus Communications, Media Alliance, Media Bus, Harvestworks, Experimental Intermedia Foundation, and Film News Now. The Program's first three-year multi-year award was made to Owego's Experimental Television Center for its unique and valuable services to video artists.

Awards in the Writing on Media Art category went to three established writers—Berenice Reynaud, Micki McGee, and David Trend. A fourth award was made to Haleakala to commission six articles on media art by major writers from other fields. This project was undertaken to expand the boundaries of discourse in critical writing on media art.

Other highlights of the year included a first-time grant to Albany's WAMC-FM to host a conference centering on public radio and its place in the arts. The State Office of Cultural Education is a co-sponsor of the conference. Bread and Roses Cultural Project received a grant for its touring video installation and single-channel exhibit *Between the Lines*, addressing "social, political, cultural and ecological issues in ways that provoke critical thought without abandoning art for polemics or propaganda". New York University was funded to construct a small temporary lis-

tening room as part of its major symposium on the work of Orson Welles. The listening room will exhibit all Welles' major radio works of the 1930's and '40's, the first time all this work will be heard together. Film/Video Arts received support for a residency for seminal film and video artist Shirley Clarke. As part of the residency, Ms. Clarke offered workshops for emerging film and video makers at FVA.

The coming year will see continued efforts by the Media Program to strengthen the field in three significant areas: by expanding audiences across the State through increased exhibition and promotional activities; by continuing to support the work of individual artists through production awards, regrant programs and artist residencies; and by increased outreach efforts to emerging artists, upstate artists, and artists of color.

In addition, in extending its commitment to both artistic excellence and technical development, the Program will encourage the exploration of high quality small format equipment for artists' use, along with the development of systems to expand interformat compatibility, both to enhance the continuing role of media arts centers and to increase the flexibility and options of media artists in producing their work.

The Program, while continuing its tradition of supporting video and audio as distinct art forms, will begin to explore how they can combine with other arts disciplines, and how the media can expand the availability of the arts to more of the State's people. The Program will also continue to encourage the development of a comprehensive plan for preserving and archiving video and audio tapes, a need which is made especially urgent by the inexorable decay of important work which is vital to the history and heritage of the field.

Museum Aid Program

T This past year, through its funding process, the Museum Aid Program renewed its commitment to encouraging high quality interpretive exhibitions, well planned collections care and effective educational programming, and to fostering institutional stability for museums throughout the State. The program disbursed \$6,925,000 to a total of 180 organizations in 50 counties. The awards reflect the large and diverse museum

community of New York State and the Council's commitment to fund a broad spectrum of museum-based activity. Awards were given to a range of museums from community-based historical societies, to statewide service organizations, to some of the nation's largest museums.

Traditionally, the highest percentage of the program's funding is directed towards General Operating Support. This past year was no exception, with 66% (\$4,791,158) of the total budget devoted to general operating support for 69 museums. In response to the ever increasing needs of the field, General Operating Support increases totaling \$107,500 were awarded to 32 organizations. In addition, first time General Operating Support was awarded to three organizations: Old Fort Niagara, Corning Museum of Glass and Buffalo and Erie County Historical Society. The balance of the program's 1987-88 budget—some \$2,133,842 or approximately 33% of the program's allocation—was disbursed in eight support categories.

In the Exhibitions category, the panel reviewed numerous innovative art, history and science requests that attest to the cultural pluralism of New York State. Of these, eighty exhibitions were funded—for a total of \$819,320—in museums throughout New York State. Among the more notable exhibitions were: *History of Four Upstate Black Communities*, presented by the Chemung County Historical Society; *The Dreyfus Affair: Art, Truth and Justice*, at the Jewish Museum; *The Original People*, focussing on the history of Native Americans in the Champlain Valley, at the Clinton County Historical Society; *Committed to Print*, at the Museum of Modern Art; *On the Home Front in the Rural North*, presented at the History Museum of the D.R. Barker Library; and *Image and Sound of Writing*, at the Solomon R. Guggenheim Museum. Other unique exhibitions funded include the *Ana Mendieta* exhibition at the New Museum of Contemporary Art and *Latin American Presence* at the Bronx Museum of Art. In the interest of ensuring the physical survival of the State's material heritage, the Program awarded \$466,156 for Collections Care and Documentation. A limited number of multi-year awards were made to museums whose goals are to develop comprehensive collections management programs. One award, to Museum Village of Orange County, provided funds to upgrade and stan-

standardize collections records and improve storage conditions. The Museum holds collections in a broad range of subjects including archaeology, agriculture, industrial artifacts, medical technology, toys, games, and costumes. Another award, to the Hyde Collection in Glens Falls, New York, was to develop a long range plan for the conservation and treatment of its paintings and decorative art collections.

The Program continued its support for Internships in the museum field, awarding \$94,500 for ten internships. In recognition of the need to encourage minorities in the museum field, five of the awards were granted to organizations committed to the recruitment of Black, Asian, Hispanic and Native Americans.

The categories of Museum Education/Interpretation and Planning for Museum Education encourage museums to respond to the needs

of their community and to provide access to a museum's collections, exhibitions and scholarly research through educational programming. A total of \$247,156 was awarded in these two categories. Model projects included after-school "latchkey" programs at the Bronx Museum and the Brooklyn Children's Museum. Other unique activities include a program at the New Museum of Contemporary Art to develop a series of lectures and seminars which will examine the issues of "marginalization", the process whereby certain groups are excluded from access to the cultural mainstream. The Rochester Museum and Science Center received a grant to hire a full-time, per-

manent community coordinator. The YIVO Institute for Jewish Research was awarded funds to present a series of bilingual lectures to accompany the exhibition *A Century of Ambivalence: Russia and the Jews, 1880-1980*, which was installed at the Jewish Museum.

New Audiences for the Year 2000 is a Council funding initiative created last year to expand access to audiences that are not currently reached by established arts organizations. Under this special allocation the Program funded seven museums, five more than the previous year, for a total of \$94,500. Of particular note were the projects proposed by the Buffalo and Erie County Historical Society and the International Center of Photography. The Buffalo and Erie County Historical Society is planning a major new permanent exhibition called *Neighbors*, which will examine how the succession of immigrant groups in Buffalo has shaped and has been influenced by the history of the city and the county. The International Center of Photography has planned a collaborative project with Seward Park East High School in Chinatown which will have students document the downtown Chinese community. The students will learn about photo journalism through photography and by interviewing residents and then writing about the Chinese community.

Throughout the year the Museum Aid Program has maintained an active dialogue with its constituency. It is through this communication and Council support that museums and other art organizations throughout New York State educate millions of our citizens.

Music Program

The Music Program awarded a total of \$6,400,000 in grants to applicants in each of the State's 62 counties. These grants were made to 318 organizations that produced and/or presented 799 projects. The broad range of support categories is indicative of the aesthetic plurality that exists in New York State: Grants ranging from \$1,000 to \$650,000 were awarded to opera companies, orchestras, jazz ensembles, choruses, chamber music, early music and contemporary music ensembles, service organizations and publishing concerns.

During 1987-88 nearly 90% of the Program's budget was awarded in two categories. Applicants


in the General Operating Support category received a total of \$3,858,770 in grants (60% of the Program's allocation); the Professional Performance—Home Base category awards totaled \$1,432,461 (22% of the Program's allocation).

An important part of the Music Program's work is the support of recording projects. In 1987-88 a total of \$102,000 was awarded to nonprofit recording companies and independent recording projects initiated by music ensembles throughout the State.

Organizations which provided valuable services to the field were awarded a total of \$329,660 in 1987/88; these encompassed a broad range of services, such as Meet the Composer's re-granting activities.

The importance placed on the creation of new works is evidenced by the \$167,631 awarded in the Composers' Commissions category, as administered by the Individual Artists Program (a complete listing of those awards may be found under that program heading). With these grants—an increase of 58% over the previous year—composers will write scores for various media, including orchestral, operatic, jazz, chamber

music, dance, theater and film. In each case, the commissioning organization guarantees performances of the new work.

In addition to the Music Program's regular list of funding categories, support was provided through a number of special programs, among them the third New York New Music Network tour, the Pocket Orchestra project, the New Audiences for the Year 2000 initiative and the

Musical Instrument Revolving Loan Fund.

The Music Program's third New Music Network tour, slated for the fall of 1988, will serve as a model for collaborations between the public and private sectors. The co-sponsor of this significant project is Hallwalls Contemporary Arts Center in Buffalo. This year's tour will bring a roster of talented and innovative artists to five communities throughout the State. When completed, the tour will have brought a wide variety of new music to a major segment of New York's population.

Yet another noteworthy example of successful public-private sector collaborations is the Music Program's Pocket Orchestra project, co-sponsored by the Mary Flagler Cary Charitable Trust. An increased commitment from the Cary Trust this year (\$100,000) and level support from the Music Program (\$50,000) made possible 20 grants to dance and opera companies. These awards, which ranged from \$3,000 to \$20,000, are the result of a long-standing dedication on the part of the two sponsoring institutions to the support of live music for dance and opera performances. The grants allow companies that currently use taped music to engage musicians and provides those companies already employing live music to augment their pit orchestras.

The Council's abiding concern over the issue of audience development is in part addressed through the New Audiences for the Year 2000 initiative. This is in direct response to the State's dramatically changing demographics. NYSCA enthusiastically supports those organizations that have identified potential new audiences and devised appropriate plans of action for building those audiences. This year the Music Program awarded a total of \$150,000 as part of this important project. Grants supporting the planning and implementation of audience development projects were awarded to the American Composers Orchestra, the New York Philharmonic, the Queens Symphony Orchestra and the Syracuse Symphony.

The Music Program continues to play a vital role in the Musical Instrument Revolving Loan Fund, a project that provides long-term, low interest loans to music organizations. These loans, made for the benefit of individual musicians, allow ensemble members to purchase instruments of a higher quality than would otherwise be possible. The Fund grew substantially both

in number of requests and total amount of loans (\$71,870 in 1986-87; \$333,283 in 1987-88). This project's success is further evidence that the highest possible quality of work continues to be a statewide goal.

Presenting Organizations Program

The Presenting Organizations Program provides support to a wide variety of organizations presenting performances of high artistic quality and cultural diversity to residents across New York State. In 1987-88, the funded presenters included organizations ranging from internationally distinguished institutions in New York City and regionally known performing arts centers to small volunteer organizations in underserved rural areas. Cultural centers, museums, arts councils, libraries and municipalities all participated in fulfilling the Program's mission to foster greater awareness of and appreciation for the live performing arts. This past year presenters treated audiences to performances of a variety of folk, ethnic, classical, and early music concerts. Such 20th century American developments as jazz, new and electronic/computer music were also widely supported. The Program was equally dedicated in funding the presentation of all forms of dance and theater so as to guarantee that the beauty and classicism of traditional performances are retained and the vitality and energy of the freshly created is nurtured.

A total of \$2,742,000 was awarded to 220 organizations in 55 counties, 75% of which went to non-Manhattan organizations. Ninety-five percent of the Program's budget was expended on presentation through the categories of General Operating Support, Presentation, and New Presenter Development. The 3,521 funded performances represent an increase of 295 performances over the previous year and were made possible because of a \$267,000 increase in the Program's allocation over 1986-87. The additional allocation was used to support institutional development through the General Operating Support and Presentation categories; to support the presentation of the work of contemporary artists through the Incentive Programming category; and to support a new initiative—New Audiences for the Year 2000—designed to in-

crease and diversify audience attendance at cultural institutions. Grants in all categories ranged from \$500 to \$324,800 with the majority of the awards between \$1,000 and \$6,000. In addition a \$74,370 grant from the National Endowment for the Arts (Dance/Interarts/State Programs Presenting Touring Initiative) was awarded to 35 organizations for the presentation of out-of-state dance companies.

The Thunderbird American Indian Dancers were presented by the Theatre for the New City in Manhattan.

Priority support was given to upstate and minority organizations, and those that presented lesser known and minority artists, new work by living American artists, and innovative programs that carried high artistic and financial risks. While the majority of funded organizations received support for providing public access to the performing arts through the Presentation category, it was through the General Operating Support category that the Program was best able to shore up institutions whose primary mission is concentrated in the presenting field. This category provided unrestricted support for on-

going institutional activities.

The Program continued to encourage the creation and development of new presenters in underserved areas. Through the New Presenter Development category, 16 organizations in their first or second year of presentation were supported in the following counties: Albany, Bronx, Dutchess, Essex, Niagara, Oneida, Onondaga, Orange, Queens, Warren and Westchester.

The development of minority presenters continued as a high priority in the Program. First-time support was given to Bedford-Stuyvesant Restoration Corporation for *Arts in the Plaza*, an outdoor performing arts festival in Brooklyn; to Bronx River Art Center for the *High/Low Performance Series*; to New Heritage Repertory Theatre for performances by gospel singer Lady Peachena and Sounds in Motion Dance Company; and to Pregones for performances by Spanish American Dance Theatre, Grupo Orientacion, and Mass Transit. These new presenters augment a growing group who are committed to the ongoing presentation of minority performing artists. Of special note are: the Festival Latino by the New York Shakespeare Festival, a three week festival which featured international music and theatre companies; the residency of the Ralph Lemon Dance Company in Perry by the Arts Council of Wyoming County; the performances by the Thunderbird American Indian Dancers by Friends of the Davis Center and Theatre for the New City; the Harlem Cultural Council's Dancemobile performances in Nassau and Orange counties and the five boroughs of New York City; dance and world renowned jazz artists at the Afrikan Poetry Theatre in Queens; the Alvin Ailey Dance Company at Proctor's Theatre in Schenectady; and the D'Asia Vu Dance series by Asian American Dance Theatre.


The Program increased its support in categories designed to stimulate the presentation of innovative and contemporary programming. Through the Commissions category a total of \$44,500, with grants ranging from \$1,100 to \$7,000, was expended for new works by such artists as Anne Warde, Elisa Monte, Susan Marshall, Yoshiko Chuma, Marta Renzi, Michael Moschen, Robbie McCauley, Terry Riley, Cecil Taylor, and a collaboration between Arto Lindsay and Vito Acconci. Increased support was also given for the Incentive Programming category. This cate-

gory provides funding to non-New York City presenters of traditional programming to engage a non-traditional artist for a half-week residency. A total of \$75,727 was granted to 11 organizations (including a consortium of 4 presenters) from the counties of Chautauqua, Chemung, Chenango, Clinton, Monroe, St. Lawrence and Suffolk. Artists presented in these residencies included The Adaptors, The Alchemedians, Continuum and David Cale.

The Presenting Organizations Program was given \$80,000 for first-year participation in a Council initiated project called New Audiences for the Year 2000. Two major upstate presenters and one on Long Island were selected participants. The Bardavon 1869 Opera House in Poughkeepsie and Proctor's Theatre in Schenectady presented new series of non-traditional performances in alternative spaces developed especially for this initiative. Inter-Media Art Center in Huntington developed presentations to attract new audiences from the minority

populations of Nassau and Suffolk counties.

Some highlights of the presenting year included the inaugural season of Lincoln Center's *Serious Fun*, a two week festival which presented performances by an array of innovative dance, music, theatre and performance artists including Robert Wilson, David Van Tieghem, ISO, David Parsons, and Julius Hemphill; the return of Creative Time's *Art on the Beach* at

its new location in Hunters Point, Queens; the opening of the Majestic Theatre in Brooklyn featuring the epic theatre work *Mahabharata* as part of the Brooklyn Academy of Music's Next Wave Festival; the opening of Mandeville Hall, a new alternative theatre space at the Clemens Center in Elmira in which jazz, performance art and chamber music are reaching new audiences; the new contemporary dance series featuring performances by Lar Lubovitch Dance Company, Momix, and Joffrey II, by QRS a major music presenter in Buffalo; the participation of a dozen presenters in the First New York International Arts Festival which featured the presentation of internationally acclaimed as well as innovative experimental artists from various countries around the world; and the annual residencies of the New York City Ballet and Philadelphia Orchestra at Saratoga Performing Arts Center.

Special Arts Services Program

Funding from the Special Arts Services Program enabled minority/ethnic artists, administrators, and organizations to pursue their diverse goals and thereby continue to enrich the vigorous cultural pluralism of New York State which the Program is mandated to nurture and perpetuate. In 1987-88 the Special Arts Services Program awarded \$4,197,000 to 220 organizations throughout the State.

These 220 applicants included fifteen organizations which received funding from the Program for the first time, and eleven others which received support in special incentive, competitive categories only. These competitive categories: administrative internships; visual artist residencies; and choreographer development commissions; are designed to address the need for expanded professional opportunities for minority artists and administrators.

Generally, the funding categories of the Special Arts Services Program are designed with a threefold purpose: to promote the institutional stability and well-being of diverse minority/ethnic organizations; to provide direct support to ethnic artists and to art programs which address the needs of multicultural communities; and to encourage more qualitative, relevant programming for ethnic community audiences.

The two funding initiatives introduced in

1987-88 reflect these concerns: the Special Projects and the Administrative Support categories. The former was conceived in response to the Program's constituency's urgently expressed need for specific, incentive funding to encourage applicants to undertake experimental and/or innovative projects. The Special Projects funding initiative invites innovative, experimental, inter-disciplinary and/or inter-ethnic artistic proposals from artists and organizations working collaboratively. In 1987-88 three proposals were

funded from among the sixteen requests which were reviewed competitively. Amauan Workshop received \$9,000 for a collaboration among diverse Asian American artists to create and present *Makibaba*. This is a multimedia, performance art tribute to the *manongs*, the pioneering laborers who constituted the first wave of Filipino immigrants to the U.S. Kenkeleba House was awarded \$9,000 for a project structured to include the participation of ten Black visual artists and writers with the goal of creating a body of interrelated works that represents genuine creative responses between the two disciplines as opposed to literal, graphic, or illustrative interpretations from one discipline to the other. The Smithtown Township Arts Council in Suffolk received \$3,799 toward the completion of *The Stony Road*, a multi-disciplinary collaboration between painter, Alice B. Johnson and several poets, story tellers, and musicians. The project is to culminate in a travelling exhibition of Ms. Johnson's paintings accompanied by an audio-visual presentation, and an educational workshop opportunity for children. *The Stony Road*

depicts the experiences and feelings of Black Americans in their struggles for freedom and survival in America from slavery to the present.

The Administrative Support category was the Program's other funding initiative introduced this year. This category represented the reformation of two former funding categories (Administrative Salaries and Administrative Development) in the hope of being able to respond more effectively to the fast changing needs of the multicultural constituency which includes many young organizations at many different stages of institutional development. In 1987-88 \$139,000 was awarded to thirty organizations. Individual grants ranged from \$1,000 to \$14,000 but the average Administrative Support grant was just under \$5,000. Most of the funds awarded through this category provide partial subsidy of salaries for principal administrative personnel of organizations with well established funding histories within the Program. These administrative support grants are renewable, generally at diminishing

levels of funding, for a maximum of five years' support. A complete list of all organizations receiving Administrative Support awards in 1987-88 can be found on page 146.

Institutional Advancement is another funding category designed to foster the well-being of the many developing institutions in the Program's

multicultural constituency. Institutional Advancement invites applicants to submit a three year plan which specifically addresses artistic and/or administrative concerns vital to the organization's ongoing progress. This category is also competitive. Second and third year participants must demonstrate satisfactory progress on their approved plans in order to be assured of funding in subsequent years.

1987-88 was the third year the Institutional Advancement program was in effect. The six organizations that inaugurated the program in 1985-86, all successfully completed their participation. Included in this "graduating class" were: The Irish Arts Center (An Claidheamh Soluis) which implemented a very successful direct mail solicitation membership campaign; the Visual Arts Research and Resource Center Related to the Caribbean (Caribbean Cultural Center) which developed more effective promotion/marketing systems for its extensive and innovative presentation programs; and the Pan Asian Repertory Theatre which hired a full-time production manager in order to more efficiently coordinate its expansive production agenda.

Altogether, fourteen organizations were awarded \$197,204 through the Institutional Advancement competition for 1987-88. Among the five organizations which won first-year entry into the program were the Frederick Douglass Creative Arts Center (for a plan to establish a fundraising/development office) and the Bronx based, Mind-Builders Creative Arts Company (for a plan to reorganize and expand its administrative structure in order to enhance its fundraising and earned income capabilities). A complete list of the Institutional Advancement grantees can be found on page 149.

The three other competitive categories, visual artists residencies; minority choreographer development commissions; and administrative internships, provided new professional opportunities for minority individuals. Among the twelve visual artists awarded residencies (ranging from four to nine months) with diverse organizations throughout the State were: sculptor, Jorge Luis Rodríguez; printmaker, Tomie Arai; photographer, Dawoud Bey; and ceramicist, Tama Tarbell. Among the nine emerging choreographers who won commissions for new works were: Kevin Wynn, Hikaru Baba, and Ariel

Herrera. The Internship category provided modest stipends for six fledgling arts administrators to facilitate internship experiences at various institutions as diverse as the Cooper Union and Women Make Movies, Inc.

The Special Arts Services Program's participation continued for a second round of funding in the Council initiated pilot program called New Audiences for the Year 2000. This funding initiative was created to begin addressing the demographic changes, and the growing presence of new audiences throughout New York State; also, to give established institutions currently funded by NYSCA an opportunity to reach those audiences they may not normally be serving.

As in the past, the largest part of Special Arts Services' allocation was dispensed through the various categories addressing general operating support; instruction and training programs; performances, exhibitions and presentations. General Operating Support was extended to organizations which have a proven track record of exemplary service, a high measure of administrative efficiency, and a profound commitment to the Program's constituent communities. The total allocation for General Operating Support awards increased by 29.9% over 1986-87. Altogether, \$1,493,572 (35.6% of the SAS allocation) was distributed among 43 organizations.

Upcoming generations of artists are currently being trained in a variety of arts disciplines. Special Arts Services continues to be firmly committed to extending support to training programs that enable aspiring and talented minority and ethnic individuals to receive training in their communities and enhance their capabilities and opportunities to pursue art as a career. Funds awarded through the instruction and training categories totalled \$1,009,475 (24% of the SAS Allocation) which was distributed among 111 programs.

Total funding for performances and exhibitions targetted for diverse minority/ethnic community audiences amounted to \$801,400 (19% of the SAS allocation). These funds were distributed among 120 programmatic grants.

The funding initiatives described above provide examples of how the Program supports New York State's rich cultural heritage. As the demographic character of New York State changes, the Special Arts Services Program will continue to keep abreast of developments and trends that

affect the field and take a leadership role in providing the kind of support to artists and arts organizations that will enable them to maintain high quality arts activities and continue to serve the myriad communities of New York State. Special Arts Services takes great pride in the rich cultural diversity of its constituency.

Theatre Program

With a wealth of theatre organizations notable for their number and diversity, New York State remains the theatre capital of the nation. The Theatre Program seeks to increase the stability of professional producing organizations while encouraging artistic experimentation and excellence. During the 1987-88 funding year, a total of \$4,180,000 (an increase of \$260,000 over 1986-87) was awarded to 164 organizations in 30 counties. Support was provided to off-Broadway and off-off-Broadway theatres, large institutional and regional theatres, ethnic theatres, experimental theatres, children's theatres, mime, performance art, service organizations, a limited number of semi-professional theatres and professional theatre publications. Twenty six organizations were funded for the first time.

The Theatre Program's 1987-88 funding profile included support for two new initiatives. In recognition of current economic difficulties, the Program offered incentive funding for young organizations under the New Theatre Advancement category. Four young theatres received first-time support ranging from \$2,000 to \$5,000.

The new Special Projects category was created to allow for the realization of unique projects of high artistic merit. Six awards were given in this category including support to the Hudson Guild for development of an outdoor Chelsea Mystery Cycle, to Otrabanda and the Talking Band for a collaboration on Bertolt Brecht's theoretical writings and to Soho Rep for three unproduced operas by Marc Blitzstein.

Ongoing institutional support continued to be provided through the Program's two primary categories: General Operating Support in which awards last year totaled \$2,188,000 or 52% of the total allocation and Professional Performances Home Base which accounted for \$1,530,050 or 36% of the allocation. In addition to the direct support given to producing organizations, assistance to the field is provided through the funding of service organizations such as Theatre Communications Group and the Alliance of Resident Theatres/New York.

Funds were also awarded to organizations whose primary focus is support of the theatre artist and to organizations that direct their efforts to the State's audience members. In the first category, funding was provided to the Drama League which offers career opportunities to young directors, to the Dramatists Guild which encourages novice playwrights through an annual festival and to the Theatre on Film and Tape Collection of the New York Public Library which gives theatre professionals access to tapes of productions from the past. Theatre artists are also supported through the Program's Artistic Development category which is designed to further the career development of artists of exceptional talent and through the Individual Artists' commissioning program. In 1987-88 eight theatre artists were awarded commissions totaling \$33,500. In general, support of artists' fees remains a central goal of Theatre Program funding with most project awards directed toward artists' fees and salaries. In the second category (the support of organizations which provide services to audience members), funds were awarded to the Theatre Development Fund for its ticket and voucher programs, to the New York Shakespeare Festival for its free Shakespeare in the Park, to the Joyce Theatre for the American Theatre Exchange which brings the work of major regional companies to New York City and to scores of companies throughout the State

which provide thousands of public performances annually.

The 1987-88 funding year reflected the Program's concern for a number of underrepresented constituencies. Funding for ethnic theatres included support of the New Federal Theatre, the Pan Asian Repertory Theatre, INTAR, Spanish Repertory Theatre, the Negro Ensemble Company, Black Spectrum, Amas, National Black Touring, the Billie Holiday Theatre and the Puerto Rican Traveling Theatre. Other special constituencies were also supported. The Vietnam Veterans Theatre Company received funding as did Theatre by the Blind. Women's concerns were addressed through support to the Women's Interart Center and the Women's Project and Productions. Funded theatre activity reached beyond the metropolitan districts to rural areas across the State. Theatres in rural areas which received support included the Depot Theatre in Essex County, Das Puppenspiel in Chautauqua

County, the Theatre Barn in Columbia County, the Theatre for Young People of Herkimer in Herkimer County and the Mettawee Theatre Company in Washington County.

The State's theatrical activity is rich, bountiful and diverse. Yet, the escalating expenses of a labor intensive art form, the difficulty of securing affordable space and the high cost of risktaking and experimentation combine to produce an uncertain and fragile environment for theatre organizations. The Council seeks to provide support and encouragement to these producing organizations and to New York State's theatre artists.

Visual Artists Program

The Visual Artists Program (VAP) continues to serve the contemporary visual arts field through its support of artists (fees and materials) and organizations whose primary mission is to provide support to visual artists through the consistent production, presentation and documentation of high quality programs and projects. In addition to the quality of the requests, the primary funding criteria in the program, projects that featured artists in mid- and/or advanced stages of their careers who have not received exposure or recognition for their work, artists working in the various craft media, and artists who are disabled, minorities and women received special consideration. Furthermore, projects which focused on new developments in the field, experimentation, interdisciplinary activity and those requests that emphasized process rather than product were also supported by the program.

In fiscal year 1988, the Visual Artists Program's allocation reached \$1,643,055, approximately a 5% increase from the previous year. These funds were disbursed in the form of 195 grants in 16 categories representing the breadth of the field.

Direct support for artists (fees and materials) accounted for 36.6% (\$601,420) of the program's allocation and 46.15% (\$758,300) was awarded as operating support to organizations. The remaining 17.25% (\$283,335) helped applicant organizations with other miscellaneous production costs of programs (including catalogues, shipping, insurance, etc.) as well as staffing needs.

Highlights of the funding year included, *Fotonovela*, a collaboration among artist Pepon Osorio, choreographer Merian Soto, writer Lourdes Torres Camacho and photographer Beatriz Schiller, which was presented at Performance Space 122, in Manhattan. This work fur-

ther explores the juxtaposition of images and language in a traditional Latin American format. Ronald Gonzalez' residency at the Roberson Memorial in Binghamton, one of 6 residencies funded by the program, will allow the artist to experiment with new armatures for his large

scale sculptures. Individual Exhibitions, a new discrete subcategory within the broader exhibitions category, which was established this year in response to the field's desire to more closely examine artists' careers, proved quite successful. Thirty-six such proposals were funded, for a total of \$133,023, and many of these were for one or two person presentations featuring the work of minority, craft, and women artists. With the assistance of an Individual Exhibition grant, for example, the Burchfield Art Center in Buffalo, will present a 10-year retrospective of the work of local photographer Biff Henrich. The Jamaica Center for Performing and Visual Arts in Queens mounted an exhibition of the work of mid-career artists Vivian Browne and William T. Williams, and Exit Art, in Manhattan, presented a comprehensive show of sculptor Ursula Von Rydingsvard's work, among others.

The Special Projects category, designed to allow maximum flexibility to projects that do

not fit clearly within the program's current guidelines, continued to attract numerous requests. This year, \$52,175 was awarded to 8 projects, and \$50,275 or 96.4% of the total monies was slated for artists' fees. Examples of projects funded through this category included a "hands-on", informational, island-wide conference for artists sponsored jointly by the Huntington Township Art League and the Islip Art Museum, both of Long Island, a major performance event by Survival Research Laboratory


in Queens, presented collaboratively by Creative Time, The New Museum of Contemporary Art and The Kitchen and the Fund for Performance Art, a statewide regrant program, administered by Franklin Furnace Archive, which provides funds to artists in all the performing disciplines to develop new works for presentation. Periodicals which contribute to the ongoing critical and theoretical dialogue in the field also continued to be supported by the program in 1988. Twelve magazines received a total of \$67,000, including periodicals such as *Heresies*, a feminist publication; *October*, a theoretical journal; *High Performance*, one of the only publications providing critical reviews on performance art; *Nueva Luz*, a publication of En Foco, in the Bronx, that features the photographic work of minority artists; and *Art Hazard News*, a newsletter which disseminates information on the many health hazards that can be present in various artists materials and working conditions.

As a result of our continuing interest in the

development and stabilization of organizations aiming to serve the needs of professional artists and to produce, present and/or sponsor quality programs in the visual arts, \$758,300 or 46.15% of the program's allocation was awarded to 26 applicants. This amount represents a \$67,800 increase in General Operating Support over the previous year. These organizations, such as Hallwalls in Buffalo, Pyramid Art Center in Rochester, LightWork/Visual Studies in Syracuse and many others throughout the State have demonstrated an ongoing commitment to serve the needs of artists and continue to produce and present programs of the highest quality to broad audiences. Additionally, this year applicants were able to request up to 50% of a salary for the development of new staff positions. In fiscal year 1988, 3 organizations received such support: The Chenango County Council for the Arts in Norwich and the Oswego Art Guild were able to hire visual arts coordinators for their programs and Cityarts, a New York City based organization, added a much needed Development Director to its staff. Other awards which helped stabilize programs while providing fees to participating artists were also granted in the various categories under Services to the Field. Notable among them was a multi-year grant to the INTAR Gallery, New York City, for their exhibition program, which this year was based on site-specific installations by minority artists and, Dixon Place, an experimental laboratory for interdisciplinary performances, on the Lower East Side of Manhattan, which received support to increase fees for artists participating in its programs.

The program's funding in fiscal year 1988, both in institutional and project categories reaffirms the Visual Artists Program's commitment to the diverse world of New York State's contemporary visual arts.
