# Chairman's Review

FISCAL YEAR 1988-89 WAS AN EXTREMELY difficult one for the New York State Council on the Arts, and for the State itself. The year began well, with a budget of \$54,300,000, which represented a \$6,000,000 increase from the New York State Legislature. However, more than a third of the way into the funding year, the increase was frozen due to the State's fiscal crisis and budget gap. Even later into the year, one half of those frozen funds were withdrawn, leaving the Council with a budget of \$51,300,000. Hard as it was to lose part of our budget, that it happened in mid-year might have caused havoc in our grants-making procedures. But, thanks to the extraordinary efforts of our staff, we managed to stay on track.

During the past year, the Council focused much of its energies and resources on rural, minority, and non-traditional arts activities. This effort, which was reflected in all of the Council's programs, came about due to the Council's concern for these smaller arts organizations. It is our desire to see them flourish all across the State, without our losing sight of the larger institutions.

1988-89 marked the second year of our Capital Funding Initiative, and was the first time the Council made loans from its capital revolving loan fund. Seven loans were made including one to the New York Experimental Glass Workshop, toward the installation of gas and water lines in a new facility located in the New York City-owned former Strand Theatre in Brooklyn. This unique organization operates glass-blowing, molding and neon studio facilities for artists as well as offering classes and demonstrations, and operating a glass art gallery.

The Governor, to the delight of the arts community, again hosted the Governor's Arts Awards. The ceremony was held at the Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York City. Governor Cuomo's eloquence, as usual, inspired the occasion. New Yorkers were again able to view the awards ceremony over Public Television Stations with the cooperation of New York Network.

I would again like to applaud the Council's staff. They are tireless in their dedication to their fields and to encouraging the very best in the arts in New York State. Our peer panelists continue to provide the balance, insight and good judgement that our review process needs in order to remain in the forefront of public arts funding. My fellow Council members devote an enormous amount of time and hard work to the Council and it is most deeply appreciated. I am extremely thankful that New York State is blessed with a Governor and a Legislature that strive unceasingly toward maintaining New York State as the arts capital of the world. And, I am deeply grateful to the citizens of our State for their continuing support of government funding for the arts.

# Executive Director's Statement

IN 1988-89, THE NEW YORK STATE COUNCIL on the Arts led a seven state coalition in obtaining an \$800,000 Challenge Grant from the National Endowment for the Arts to increase financial support for individual artists. The New York State Council on the Arts was instrumental in the formation of this national partnership as an essential act of leadership in encouraging greater funding for working artists. This coalition was founded to create a national model of sustained support for individual artists.

The individual artist is the rock upon which the deepest thoughts and emotions surrounding the human condition are expressed. For American culture to thrive, a myriad of wonderful and diverse artistic voices and visions must be heard and seen. It is the stated responsibility of public arts agencies to insure these opportunities through both direct and indirect support for the individual artist. From its inception, the New York State Council on the Arts has also been staunchly committed to implementing this State's public policy of insuring artistic freedom in effecting such support.

The New York State Council on the Arts realizes that artists, like any other creative professionals, must be encouraged to explore new forms of expression. They must be allowed to work without the constraints of preconceived expectations or the onus of producing art with immediate marketplace potential. Public funds should support opportunities and options, as well as the possibility of both success and failure, for exemplary artists and projects. It is the Council's responsibility to give the public the greatest possible access to a wide spectrum of exemplary artistic and cultural expressions. Each member of that public can then choose what to see or hear and respond accordingly.

As this State and nation progress toward the twenty-first century, the public, as well as its representatives and civil servants, must be aware of the profound demographic changes affecting population compositions. Widely diverse perspectives are forming individual artists' creative psyches. The results occasionally will be art that may be profoundly enlightening although possibly disturbing. As public agencies, however, we must continue to support the most exemplary efforts within this diversity. To do less would be to abandon our public duty.

The New York State Council on the Arts maintains its concerns for the communities of this great State as well and works continually to insure responsibility and accountability as a public agency in all its actions. In this regard, the people are well served by a wide variety of professionals serving on peer panels, a 20-member Council composed of citizens representing the general public and the finest professional staff exigent in government service. All of these individuals work diligently through a system of checks and balances to insure the public interest is protected in the disbursement of funds supporting New York State's art groups and artists.

## HIGHLIGHTS OF PROGRAM FUNDING ACTIVITIES

# Architecture, Planning and Design Program

THE DESIGN FIELD IS EXPERIENCING unprecedented activity within the arts with design arts representing the most rapidly growing program area in arts councils nationwide. Most of these new programs turn to NYSCA's Architecture, Planning and Design Program as the pioneer. The Architecture Program awards grants in the fields of Architecture, Architectural History, Landscape Architecture, Urban and Rural Planning, Urban Design, Historic Preservation, Graphic Design, Industrial Design and Architectural Documentation.

Architecture is everyone's art, and even those who never step inside a museum or theatre confront daily — gladly or sadly — their city, main street, public buildings, and the place they call home.

1988-89 was a very successful year for the Architecture, Planning and Design Program as the staff worked toward achieving three primary goals — supporting the operations of those institutions that provide ongoing services or public programs in the design arts; encouraging the development of design literacy throughout the general population of the State; and stimulating the evolution of the art form itself. APD received requests from 235 groups — another very large and very rich applicant pool that attests to the program's continuing importance to the Council's constituents and to the State. Requests came in from every corner of the State with many

first-time applicants to the Council. Sixty-nine percent of these organizations were funded, and of the \$1,645,000 awarded, \$802,610 or 49% went upstate and \$842,390 or 51% was spent in New York City's five boroughs. The program was also very successful in getting dollars to underserved populations — the elderly, the handicapped, inner-city school children, extremely rural communities, and the homeless. Easily 46% of our allocation is having a direct impact on these constituents who are receiving little if any other cultural funding.

To meet the growing needs of this constituency, APD has initiated several projects which reach beyond the funding of groups and projects. A major exhibition on infill housing opened at the PaineWebber Gallery in March, 1988 and then travelled to four New York locations. The Architecture Program is also an increasing resource to the field. The Technical Assistance Program served 33 organizations, in 23 counties, primarily upstate, by providing short-term professional consultations, both architectural and administrative. These modest interventions have already succeeded in averting crises, strengthening design projects, and enlightening arts organizations statewide.

On the other end of the funding spectrum \$534,600 (or 32% of APD's Allocation) was awarded to 26 organizations in unrestricted General Operating Support. For the first time, all of these groups were

granted multi-year funding, ranging from \$6500 to the Heritage Foundation of Oswego to \$51,250 for The New York Landmarks Conservancy. Institutional development grants, designed to provide stability to younger developing organizations, totalled \$23,000.

Project funding reflected the diversity of the field, through exhibitions, publications, tours, workshops, conferences and lectures. The design activity, in all regions of the State, resulted in awards to 106 varied projects including an exhibition on Eero and Eliel Saarinen's 1940 design for Kleinhans Music Hall in Buffalo; documentation on the history of Geneva's waterfront; a photographic essay about rural housing in 30 upstate counties; and a visionary project by architect Steven Holl at the Museum of Modern Art. These efforts represent the program's commitment to raising public awareness and visual literacy regarding the built environment.

Increasingly, as APD has grown, important areas of special concern have received funding. In 1988-89, \$722,740 of our total allocation was allotted to diverse projects addressing contemporary design, housing, waterfront development, rural landscape, and urban planning. These incentive areas, identified because of their importance to the field and the State, have attracted an ever-growing pool of organizations. Notable projects included a site plan for Snug Harbor in Staten Island, a design study for the conversion of The Battery Maritime building into a new home for Dance Theater Workshop and Creative Time; and several strong research projects on the design of affordable housing, both rural and urban. These projects represent some of APD's most critical outreach efforts, in parts of the State where no other funding sources exist and which might not otherwise receive Council funding.

As always, the Architecture Program, together with the Capital Aid Program, offered financial and technical support for the locating and designing of appropriate facilities and the securing of Capital Funding. By awarding grants for feasibility, design and adaptive-use studies (\$353,525, this year) as well as research and Historic Structures Reports, (\$113,285), 54 organizations receiving Council sup-

port from other programs including Museum, Film, Visual Artists, Special Arts Services, Local Arts Organizations/Service Organizations, Theatre, Dance, Music, and Presenting Organizations were assisted by APD. Through these channels, the Architecture Program helps statewide arts organizations design for the future. Outstanding examples include the conversion of a building for the Roxbury Arts Guild in the Catskills and a competition for the design of new facilities for the Shaker Museum in Chatham.

The Architecture Program has traditionally been closely involved with preservation organizations throughout the State. This year, \$726,660 in grants (or 44% of APD's budget) was awarded in support of 103 preservation projects. 81 of these grants went to upstate organizations and municipalities.

Along with APD's strong commitment to preserving New York's rich architectural heritage is the program's desire to encourage innovative work by individuals in the field. The second year of the Sponsored Project category drew 32 interesting applications, of which 4 received project-specific grants totalling \$41,990. This will help such ideas as the development of a new urban building system by Lebbeus Woods and the design of a series of small architecturally provocative structures by Taeg Nishimoto to be brought to the public. Work by independent architects and designers represents an area of rapid growth in the program and APD looks forward to a continuation of creative development in design.

APD also had the unprecedented opportunity to support efforts which helped expand participation in the field, through educational projects, such as an adult education preservation curriculum developed by the Preservation League; and children's environmental workshops in Prospect Park. Funding to community design centers — including Pratt Institute Center for Community and Economic Development in Brooklyn, TAP (Troy Architectural Program), Capitol Hill Improvement Coalition in Albany and Urban Homesteading Assistance Board in lower Manhattan, allowed APD to subsidize architectural services to low-income neighborhoods.

A total of \$761,690 of APD's allocation was awarded in these areas.


APD, the longest-standing architecture program within a state arts council nationwide also continues to be a leader, encouraging others to provide technical assistance and support for innovative work. The results are most gratifying — the design arts are flourishing in New York State.

## Capital Funding Initiative

Space. Without it any art form is just an idea, an impulse without an outlet. Space defines our art and informs it. It is, in effect, the only raw material common to virtually all of the arts. Space is also where private creation is married to public experience, housing not only the art and artist, but the viewer or audience as well.

Dance cannot be rehearsed or performed without dance floors. Art cannot be displayed in a gallery in upstate New York in January without an operable heating system. The very future of an historic house museum and its collection can be threatened by a deteriorated roof. And without special ramps, doors and other modifications, a cultural facility cannot adequately serve persons with disabilities and the elderly.

The myriad problems of creating art have often resulted in insufficient attention being paid to building problems. The temptation is great to ignore facility needs and opportunities, while concentrating on other artistic and institutional needs - to let that dance floor or roof go "just one more year" without replacement, to put off "just one more year" converting that unused storage space into much-needed additional exhibition space. Facility renovation can, however, have a major impact on a group's ability to create and present its work, and the Council has taken a leadership role in supporting capital funding as a critical element of it's nurturing of New York State's cultural resources.

As other branches of State government have begun to pay close attention to the condition of our physical infrastructure — roads, bridges, tunnels, water mains, etc. — the Council has been addressing the critical importance of New York State's "cultural infrastructure" through the Capital Funding Initiative.

In this, the program's second year, a total of \$700,000 was awarded to 50 applicants. This was also the first year of a new Revolving Loan Fund for capital construction, which awarded seven low-interest loans totalling \$335,099.

Through the new loan fund, NYSCA was able to provide significant support for a number of exciting projects. The New York Experimental Glass Workshop received a \$25,000 grant and a \$75,000 loan towards the expense of installing gas, water, waste and electrical systems in their new facility in the City-owned former Strand Theatre in Brooklyn. They are the only organization in New York City to offer glass blowing and casting facilities, for use by both professional artists and students, and have been operating for ten years out of a cramped and heavily-used facility on Mulberry Street in Manhattan. By relocating to the new facility, the group will be able to increase its space by almost 250%, thereby dramatically increasing the studio time available to glass artists and students.

Another loan is for Kenkeleba House, an organization for minority artists on the Lower East Side. A number of years ago, they purchased a building

from the City, and have been renovating it into a gallery and artist studios. They received a \$25,000 grant and an \$8,960 loan to repair the facade and install a zoned heating system in their street-level gallery. This system will allow the separate heating of the gallery, thereby increasing the times when it can be economically operated without having to heat the entire building.

The Erick Hawkins Dance Company was awarded a \$25,000 grant and a \$30,000 loan to pay for the cost of moving to a new facility. In late 1987, this renowned modern dance company had been evicted from its home of many years, and had to find and renovate new studio space immediately. Because the project had to be completed between Council funding years and on an emergency basis, it was primarily financed through an expensive commercial market-rate construction loan. The combined Council grant and loan will significantly reduce the group's debt service expense, thereby freeing up operating funds for the group's programming.

The projects supported with Council grants cover an extremely broad spectrum of type of construction project, art form, and geography. As mandated by the legislation which created the program, a special effort was made to support projects which benefit rural and minority communities. Other areas of special concern are accessibility and correction of health and safety problems.

The Depot Theatre in rural Westport in Essex County was awarded \$25,000 for a variety of improvements to their historic 19th century former railroad depot, including the installation of a bathroom accessible to disabled persons and an exterior ramp. Another important rural project supported was the installation of a heating system in the West Kortright Center, a performing arts presenting facility located in a 19th century former church in Delaware County. This work will allow the facility to operate year-round, dramatically increasing this group's ability to serve its community.

Examples of organizations serving minority communities aided by the Capital Initiative are Pregones Puerto Rican Theatre and the Studio Museum in

Harlem. Pregones was awarded \$25,000 to renovate their Bronx theatre facility. The innovative design of this renovation suspends the entire theatre like a stage set within the shell of a former church facility. The Studio Museum in Harlem was also awarded \$25,000 to upgrade an inadequate HVAC system. Problems with the current system had resulted in wildly fluctuating temperature and humidity levels, seriously threatening the artwork.

This was also the second year of a special Technical Assistance category, which provided small grants to groups in rural or minority communities to assist them in the planning of capital projects. Nine requests were funded in this category. The Hanford Mills Museum in East Meredith will hire a security consultant to conduct a comprehensive evaluation of the complex security problems posed by their 19-building industrial museum complex. The Harlem School of the Arts was funded to hire a real estate consultant who will examine a variety of different expansion options.

A total of over \$2 million in grants was requested this year by 109 grant applicants, compared to 101 last year which requested \$1.7 million. Of the 50 grants awarded in 1989, 24 went to groups outside New York City. 59% of the \$700,000 was awarded to projects addressing rural and minority communities or handicapped accessibility. Because of reduced funding levels this year, the Capital Funding Initiative was extremely competitive, funding a much smaller share of the total request than last year.

The program was, however, through grants and loans, able to provide significant support for 53 capital projects located throughout the State in twenty different counties. The types of organizations supported include theatres, dance companies, film and video art centers, arts schools, historic house museums, arts service organizations, local arts councils, museums and galleries.

The increasingly great demand for these funds makes it clear that the facility-related needs of arts organizations is a vast and ongoing problem which requires continuing support and attention from the Council.



# Arts in Education Program

THE ARTS IN EDUCATION PROGRAM WAS initiated in 1985 as a joint effort by the Council and the State Education Department. Through the partnership of these two agencies, cultural institutions are funded to create collaborative arts and environmental science programs throughout the State for students in grades pre-kindergarten through twelve. The major goal of the Program continues to be the inclusion of the arts as an essential subject for every child's personal and academic development. In 1988-89, the Program's allocation increased to \$3,050,000. AIE received 390 requests for a total of \$6,093,204 and funded 292 requests, about 75% of the total number received.

During 1988-89, priority funding areas were regional planning initiatives, primarily spearheaded by local arts councils in partnership with the area BOCES, and support for minority-run organizations. An example of regional planning activity is characterized by the Rensselaer County Arts Council and their partnership with the Capital Area School Development Association. Together they held five

days of discussions with six local arts councils, three BOCES districts representing schools in eight counties, the regional teacher center and other cultural organizations. This working group examined the status of school arts coordinators, the need for cooperative identification, training and provision for artist services, and developed a plan to strengthen the link between BOCES and regional cultural organizations. Among the minority-run organizations, Children's Art Carnival in Harlem received planning support to begin the Institute of Multicultural Education. The Institute will publish curriculum aids and teaching materials to integrate the study of minority art forms into the visual arts and history curriculum.

This was the second year that AIE accepted requests in the General Operating Support category. This category is restricted to organizations whose primary mission is the delivery of arts in education programs in school settings. Eight organizations were funded and grants averaged \$42,000.

The Implementation category received 230 requests; 188 were funded. The average grant in this category was \$9,800. The Cayuga Nature Center, Ithaca, received \$16,260 to complete and implement the environmental education curriculum they developed with science teachers in the Ithaca area. The Brooklyn Philharmonic received \$15,000 for their collaboration with BOCES for the high school residency and coaching program in several districts on Long Island. The Landmark Society of Western New York, Rochester, will be using their \$7,000 award for a built environment and historic preservation program with schools in Rochester. The Paul Robeson Performing Arts Company, Syracuse, was recommended for two requests: \$15,000 for a creative arts and language skills program for elementary students at the Dr. Martin Luther King Elementary School and \$12,000 for a video project at the Danforth High School.

The Planning and Development category was the second largest category, receiving 95 requests; 63 were funded at an average of \$4,650. The Salvatori Center for the Built Environment, Bronx, received two awards of \$4,000 and \$5,000 to develop a

mentoring program for students and to evaluate the Salvadori Mini-School, District 10, the Bronx. The Buscaglia-Castellani Gallery at Niagara University, Niagara Falls, received \$8,000 to plan a curriculum on the aesthetic interpretations of Niagara Falls from Native American and Anglo perspectives. Black Spectrum Theater, Queens, was awarded \$8,000 to develop and pilot a bilingual theater arts program with District 29 using African-American and Haitian themes.

Seventeen organizations applied in the Special Projects category for projects that reach children with special needs, to develop curricular materials or administer multi-county programs. Nine organizations were recommended for funding including the Westchester Conservatory, White Plains, which received \$14,500 to provide music programs for children with special needs in seven districts in Westchester. The Services to the Field category received 16 requests to sponsor local conferences, to survey the arts in education field, disseminate newsletters or develop testing and evaluation procedures for model programs. The Center for Safety in the Arts received \$8,000 to provide technical assistance to organizations and schools concerning art hazards such as toxic substances and improper ventilation.

In the Commissions and Sponsored Projects categories 13 organizations were funded to provide artists with the opportunity to create works of art for and with children. Grant amounts in this category averaged \$3,200. Some of the sponsoring organizations and their artists include Capitol Chamber Artists in Albany, for composer Carman Moore, East End Arts and Humanities Council in Riverhead, for holographer Linda Law, and Downtown Music Productions in Manhattan, for composer Nicolas Scarim.



## Dance Program

MARTHA GRAHAM ONCE SAID, "WE ARE A visually stimulated world today. The eye is not to be denied. Dance need not change — it only has to stand revealed." The Dance Program, during the latest season, underscored the continuing relevance of this statement through funding that sought to reveal dance in a multitude of ways on stages throughout New York State. This was achieved with \$3,890,000 in support awarded to 113 dance organizations under 12 funding categories in the 1988-89 year. That funding recognized every imaginable aspect of the creative process as it has affected and will affect generations of dance artists and audiences.

Historically, one of the main aims of Dance Program assistance has been the live performance of dance for the general public. At the same time, an effort has been made to insure that dancers are professionally compensated for all periods of rehearsal and performance. Two funding categories, Professional Performances/Home Base and General Operating Support have particular relevance to this mission and more than two-thirds of all Dance Program funding was expended under them in 1988-89. Within the General Operating Support category, thirty dance organizations, including the Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater, the American Ballet Theatre, Merce Cunningham Dance Company, Dance Theatre of Harlem, the New York City Ballet, Performance Space 122, and Trisha Brown Dance Company, were awarded a total of \$2,553,100. Although General Operating Support has been defined as unrestricted support for ongoing institutional activities, live performances in New York State have been interpreted as one of these activities. For example, well over 500 performances were offered during the year by the organizations receiving General Operating Support. A criterion in the consideration of these requests was a demonstrated

history of paying artists' salaries or fees. The funding category of Professional Performances/Home Base was responsible for the funding of 54 dance companies in home-season appearances. Major engagements by the American Ballroom Theatre, Feld Ballet, Erick Hawkins Dance Company and Bill T. Jones/Arnie Zane and Company were assisted. The category's funded projects were as artistically rich as they were stylistically diverse embracing, for example, a two-week run of Ballet Hispanico at the Joyce Theater, eight performances of Eiko and Koma at the Brooklyn Academy of Music, nine performances of the Urban Bush Women at the Kitchen, and a four-week run of the Paul Taylor Dance Company at City Center. Also addressed were home-season engagements by upstate dance companies such as Yung Yung Tsuai and Dancers (New Rochelle), the Berkshire Ballet (Albany) and, in a first award, Buffalo's Gemini Dance Theatre. Altogether, 14 dance companies received their first awards under the category in 1988-89, including John Kelly, Jeff McMahon, Stephen Petronio Dance Company, Shapiro and Smith Dance and Doug Varone Dancers.

Commissioning projects received renewed emphasis in 1988-89 funding as a total of \$88,000 was directed towards the fees of guest choreographers for the creation or restaging of 44 works. One of the most celebrated and discussed restagings of the year was the Joffrey Ballet's performance of George Balanchine's "lost" ballet from 1932, *Cotillon*. Seen at City Center in the Fall, *Cotillon* was the object of \$10,000 in funds placed towards the fees of the reconstructors, Millicent Hodson and Kenneth Archer. This was the same team that scored an earlier success for the Joffrey Ballet with Nijinsky's *Sacre du Printemps*, a 1987-88 Dance Program commission. *Cotillon* was a fitting tribute to the ballet company's late founder and director, Robert Joffrey, who initiated the project and to whom the entire season was dedicated. Similarly, the Dance Theatre of Harlem received \$10,000 in commissioning funds for a major project of great artistic and archival interest: the restaging of three ballets by Bronislava Nijinska, *Les Noces* (1923), *Les Biches* (1924), and the little-seen *Rondo Capriccioso* (1953). But new and developing choreographers were also assisted under

the same funding category. As one example, the American Ballet Theatre used \$5,000 in funds to commission two new works by Clark Tippet. It's worth noting that the first choreographic efforts by this choreographer were nurtured by Ballet Theatre in a choreographers' workshop which has been funded annually by the Dance Program. Elsewhere, four downtown dance presenters — Dance Theater Workshop, Danspace, the Kitchen and Performance Space 122 — commissioned a total of 16 works with support totalling \$17,000 under the category. Other recipients included the Berkshire Ballet, Maria Benitez Spanish Dance Company, and Ballet Hispanico. A complete listing of choreographers and commissioning organizations appears on pages 58 and 59.

During the year, the Dance Program continued to work to improve the environment for dance in metropolitan and rural areas in upstate New York. In addition to funding resident dance companies (under Professional Performances/Home Base) in those regions, the Program offered support for touring upstate in three funding areas. The Long-Term Residency in New York State category helped to make possible a total of 16 weeks of residencies by five companies with \$113,000 in support. The Danny Buraczeski Dance Company returned to Oneonta for a three-week residency at Hartwick College. To the west, the David Gordon Pick-Up Company settled into Ithaca for a four-week residency at Cornell University while, to the north, the Mark Morris Dance Group was seen in a three-week engagement at SUNY/Brockport. Residencies by the Dan Wagoner Dance Company at Skidmore College in Saratoga and by the Rod Rodgers Dance Company in Syracuse completed the range of projects funded during the 1988-89 year. Funds were directed towards dancers' salaries and administrative costs relating to the residencies. The companies realized essential goals of the funding category: the building of audiences for upstate dance events and a sustained period of creative rehearsal time. Professional Performances-Touring helped to send five companies to upstate locations with a total of \$18,000 in support. This included a first-time award to the Randy Warshaw Dance Company which assisted with a performance at the Westchester Community

College. The 1988-89 funding season represented the second year of operation for the New York State Touring Plan, an enterprising effort to offer multi-year support and videotape marketing assistance to dance companies undertaking a three-year plan of touring to upstate locations. Nine dance companies were assisted with a total of \$97,000 in support. Among the companies participating were Kei Takei's Moving Earth, the Feld Ballet, the Lar Lubovitch Dance Company and Garth Fagan's Bucket Dance Theatre.

The Long-Range Development category offered support, totalling \$30,000, to two dance companies who had designed three-year projects to spur artistic and administrative growth without the need to mount an annual performance season. CoDanceCo received

second-year support (producing a performance season at the 14th Street Y) while the Elisa Monte Dance Company completed the third and final year of its project.

Affordable rehearsal space for dance companies continued to be a major concern during 1988-89 and the Dance Program widened the effects of its support of studio spaces offering low-cost rentals (generally below \$10/hour). Sixteen sponsoring organizations received a total of \$49,000 in support covering 24,372 hours which served 590 dance companies (nearly a 50% increase in the number of companies over the previous year). Among the organizations assisted under the Rehearsal Space category were Pentacle (Danceworks), PS 1 (Institute for Art and Urban Resources), the Ethnic Folk Arts Center, Boys Harbor (a first-time award), and the Dia Art Foundation.

The Dance Program continued its strong investment in helping to secure a future for the classical ballet repertory through awards totalling \$77,500 to four companies under the category, Incentive Support: Building Ballet Repertory. Two of the award recipients, the Foundation for the Joffrey Ballet and American Ballet Theatre, were also among those supported when the funding category was initiated during the 1985-86 funding season. Then, as now, the category offers support to workshops designed to develop new ballet choreographers. The American Ballet Theatre used its \$50,000 award to conduct a workshop of four weeks duration involving three to four choreographers and nearly twenty dancers from the company. The Joffrey II Dancers, as in 1987-88, conducted a six-week workshop, with \$20,000 in support, while the New York City Ballet devoted its \$7,500 award to a workshop involving company member Robert LaFosse. Finally, the Feld Ballet received \$10,000 to run a three-week workshop involving developing choreographer James Sewell and several members of the company.

Rounding out the Dance Program's funding activity was the category of Services to the Field, under which 13 organizations received a total of \$293,400 in support to carry out projects having wide ramifications for the artistic and administrative well-being of

the New York State dance community. Among the projects funded were a program of discounted dance tickets (Theatre Development Fund), a program of administrative and marketing services (Pentacle Management/Danceworks), and an archival undertaking involving the filming and videotaping of several works (New York Public Library). The Brooklyn Dance Consortium and The Field (Performance Zone) were among the organizations receiving first-time support under the category. These service organizations worked in their own specific ways to make sure that the art of dance continued to be "revealed."



## Decentralization Program

1988-89 MARKED AN IMPORTANT MILESTONE in the development of the Decentralization Program. With the addition of Columbia County, under the administration of Albany League of the Arts, Decentralization became a state-wide Program, serving all sixty-two counties of New York State.

In Fiscal Year 1988-89, approximately 1500 applicants to the Decentralization Program received technical assistance and support services from forty-five Regrant Agencies around the State. Additionally, nearly 1100 organizations received grants of up to \$3000 to support local cultural activities which represent all artistic disciplines and reflect the full range of New York State's cultural diversity. The total allocation to the Decentralization Program for Fiscal Year 1988/89 was \$1,750,000.

In accordance with its original mandate from the State Legislature to encourage participation in the grant decision-making process at the local level, the Decentralization Program remains one of the

Council's most dynamic mechanisms for making cultural programs accessible to geographically and ethnically diverse segments of the State's population.

Guidelines for regranting funds through the Decentralization Program are set by local leadership in accordance with basic Council standards. Applications for support through the Decentralization Program are reviewed by local citizens experienced in the arts and sharing the concerns of the quality of life in their communities and the participation of all segments of the population. Decentralization supported programs convey strong artistic impulses from individual artists and community arts groups, and support local cultural resources as they emerge and develop from year to year. Funded programs reflect issues unique to their communities such as local development in the South Bronx; in addition, they speak to global issues important to localities throughout our State, such as the preservation of ethnic traditions and the quality of life for an aging citizenry. During its eleven-year history, the Decentralization Program has significantly broadened the reach of New York State arts funding and has provided a basis for critical cultural development on a local level.



## Film Program

THIS YEAR, THE FILM PROGRAM disbursed a total of \$2,260,000 to 173 organizations to carry out a total of 183 projects (out of 283 that requesting funding). In a difficult budget year, characterized by shifts in the total budget as the legislature in Albany worked to meet its deficit, the Film Program worked to ensure the maximum effect of its awards while at the same time safeguarding the stability and cultural health of the film organizations and artists of New York State. In addition, as the Council moved to incorporate the Film and

Media programs into a jointly-administered unit, the Film Program sought to serve its field during this difficult transition.

Providing dramatic evidence of the continuing vigor of cinema despite very real economic constraints, three major institutions opened impressive new facilities in this 1988-89 period. The very fact of these openings — that organizations were able to attract substantial new funding and fulfill their visions of how film and its public might best be served — is a testimony to the kind of dedication and enthusiasm that have always characterized the development of this field.

In Rochester, the International Museum of Photography was able to demonstrate the success of its capital-funds drive and to prove that the city of Rochester and the State of New York did care about its film-based patrimony enough to create a new facility to keep its archives in place. For film, the new facility provides state-of-the-art storage vaults, professional study centers, additional screening rooms, adequate storage for print materials, and offices for staff, all of which were formerly and inadequately housed in the historic George Eastman House, which is now being restored for public viewing.

In Manhattan, Anthology Film Archives (legally the Film Art Fund) fulfilled the dream of a decade by completing its conversion of a former courthouse in the East Village into a twin-theatre cinemathèque devoted to avant-garde and alternative cinema, complete with a library that documents the history of experimental film in a number of one-of-a-kind items and out-of-print journals. A repertory program culling films from past and present now makes available films unseen in the New York area in years.

In Astoria, Queens, meanwhile, the long-awaited American Museum of the Moving Image opened its doors. With two theatres equipped for everything from 70mm dolby sound to tri-standard 3/4" video, and every other conceivable format, the Museum immediately began an ambitious exhibition program while simultaneously unveiling a collection that

contextualizes popular culture within a more serious framework. Memorabilia not seen outside of childhood memories inhabit gallery space side-by-side sophisticated interactive demonstrations of how the movie industry actually works.

With such significant institutionalization in place, film exhibition and film study should undergo a veritable renaissance. In order to make certain that they flourish with the full diversity that the New York public deserves, the Film Program worked to disburse exhibition funds even more strongly to minority and rural applicants, and to strengthen these sectors by other strategies as well.

In the fall of 1988, the Film Program presented a workshop on rural film exhibition in conjunction with the Olean Public Library. Convening exhibitors from rural regions throughout the State, the two day workshop brought experts in programming, promotion, and the technologies of film presentation to target-shoot problems and address a variety of models. The growth of locally-based exhibition sites in relatively isolated communities throughout the State is enriching the film culture of these areas, but also mandating the development of an effective information network for rural programmers. The workshop was a first step toward this end.

A conference dedicated to minority and Third World film programming was initiated by the Film Program this year, joined by the Rockefeller Foundation as a funding partner and the Film News Now Foundation as the fiscal sponsor of the event, scheduled for Fall 1989. In addition, the Film Program was able to increase funding to a number of minority organizations (including the Black Filmmaker Foundation, the Film News Now Foundation, the Library Action Committee of Corona, and the Rochester Association of Black Communicators). The growth of minority presenters throughout the New York City metropolitan area and New York State also led to first-time funding for a number of important new exhibitors and service organizations, such as the Bronx Museum and Mind-Builders (both in the Bronx), the Harlem School of the Arts, the Langston Hughes Institute in Buffalo, and the Latino Collaborative. The creation of any authentic cultural

diversity depends upon the growth of such organizations, committed to programming specifically attuned to their audiences.

The Film Program's interest in improving the quality and range of public film exhibition has not been generation-specific: children are being served as well as adults. This year, the Gallery Association of New York State received funding to publish a handbook on children's programming, including suggested films, critical overviews, and case studies. A workshop will also be held, implementing these findings for professional programmers. New programs of films for children have been funded at the Brooklyn Museum, the Collective for Living Cinema, and the Cornell Cinema. In each case, these new programs have reflected responsible curatorial criteria for the presentation of quality work to children. The Asian Cine-Vision's ongoing program of children's film, exhibited at a public library in Chinatown, received renewed support as well.

Direct support for artists' work remains a cornerstone of the Film Program; to that end, nearly a quarter of the budget is earmarked for film production (see the Individual Artists Program listings in this report for details). In addition, the importance of distribution is emphasized by support in this category for specific projects. In this category, for example, Stanley Nelson received funds to distribute *Two Dollars and a Dream*, his documentary on Madame Walker and her black cosmetics empire; Ghasem Ebrahimian was supported to distribute *The Suitors*, a dramatic feature dealing with the plight of a newly-arrived Iranian woman in New York City; and Carole Langer was funded for the distribution of her feature documentary, *Radium City*, tracing the history and consequences of a dangerous industry and its women workers. All were funded through sponsoring organizations.



## Folk Arts Program

AS A YOUNG GIRL GROWING UP IN Southern Italy, Nina San Filippo learned to embroider richly symbolic, stylized floral and geometric patterns for items in her trousseau from her mother. Now a master of the needle arts, she transmits her knowledge and skills to young women in her neighborhood of Bensonhurst, Brooklyn by means of an apprenticeship for which funding was provided to the American Catholic Agency.

Old traditions are finding renewed vitality in new settings through support from the Folk Arts Program. Funds from the Program in 1988-89 helped to keep traditions vital, strengthening them in their community settings and providing opportunities for all New Yorkers to experience the living cultural heritage of the State. The Program awarded a total of \$1,550,000 to 124 organizations, 34 of which were new to the Program.

Folk arts bridge generations, reinforcing the ties which bind community members of different ages. The Lefferts Gardens Community Music Center was

supported for a project which explores the process of cultural transmission of music within an informal family network. Their program of Galician, Irish and Yemenite Jewish traditions presented several family members of different generations who grew up performing their folk music with each other. At the Children's Museum of History, Natural History and Science in Utica, upstate storytellers and musicians, who practice traditions relating to earlier forms of transportation, shared their memories and art with children.

Folk arts apprenticeships provide opportunities for master artists to share their knowledge and skills with apprentices from their communities who demonstrate ability in the art form to be learned. This funding category emphasizes support for traditions no longer widely practiced in New York. *Mundillo*, Puerto Rican lace making, will be taught in an apprenticeship at the Hostos Culture and Arts Program. The drumming traditions of the Garifuna, a people of African and Native American descent from Central America, is the subject of an apprenticeship funded through the Association for Cultural Equity. Master square dance caller and musician Loren Teachout from Oswego County will teach his calling skills to an apprentice through a project of the Cultural Resource Council of Syracuse and Onondaga County.

The Program supported projects from a remarkable diversity of cultural communities, including occupational, religious, regional and ethnic folk traditions. An increased number of projects involving traditions created and shared at the workplace were funded in 1988-89. At the Hanford Mills Museum at East Meredith, storytellers, musicians and craftspeople will present traditions related to their occupational experiences in the Upper Catskills. Dockworkers, subway workers and family doctors presented narratives of their working lives at a *Brooklyn at Work* festival organized by the Brooklyn Arts Council. The traditions of workers on the Champlain and Hudson Canal were featured at the Washington County Fair, through a project of the Lower Adirondack Regional Arts Council.

Religious folk arts were presented in secular settings to people of different faiths. Calligraphy from Buddhist, Islamic and Jewish traditions were explored in a series of lecture/demonstrations organized by the School of Sacred Arts. Support was provided to the Buscaglia-Castellani Gallery of Niagara University for a travelling exhibition of folk arts associated with the celebration of Easter among Polish-Americans in Western New York.

Traditional arts shared by women were featured in a number of projects. *Upon this Woman Rock: Women in the Black Church* is a film which focuses upon the role of African-American women preachers, for which support was provided to City Lore. The Queens Council on the Arts received funds to produce a video documentary which explores *mehendi*, a South Asian tradition of painting elaborate designs on the hands and feet of a bride and her nuptial entourage. Traditional Irish music and dance performed by women was featured in a statewide tour, *Cherish the Ladies*, organized by the Ethnic Folk Arts Center. Funding for this program was awarded to ten organizations, with funding provided to applicants ranging from the Niagara Council on the Arts to Hallockville in Suffolk County.

Folk arts are created by people sharing a common group identity. These groups may have been formed many generations ago, or within a relatively short period of time. Michael Cousino, a disabled Vietnam Veteran, creates dioramas representing his wartime experiences and those of his fellow vets. Their identity as a folk group was forged during the Vietnam conflict and reaffirmed as they maintained their group identity after they returned home. Traditional Arts of Upstate New York was awarded funding for an exhibition of Cousino's work which will tour throughout Upstate New York.

Applicants to the Folk Arts Program ventured to explore new topics and issues in the folk arts. The emergent traditions of African American youth in Queens were explored in an exhibition at the Jamaica Center for Visual and Performing Arts, *Stupid Fresh*. This organization is located in a neighborhood which is a world renowned creative center for these arts, which include break dancing, rap music and

innovative body adornment. The Delaware County Historical Association was funded for a video documentary on the folk aesthetics of the County Fair. This production will show how a shared aesthetic is displayed and expressed in a variety of forms, including quilts, clothing, parades and the adornment of automobiles.

The folk arts constituency is developing innovative projects to improve their professional skills and increase their awareness of successful projects. A new approach to technical assistance is being introduced by the New York Folklore Society. Through a mentoring project, folklorists receive assistance from a professional colleague whom they visit at the sites of the colleague's projects. They are thus able to be introduced to a new type of folk arts program in a different part of the State. Three historical museum service organizations are organizing workshop series throughout Upstate New York. These workshops will provide participating museum professionals with opportunities to learn about the documentation of living traditions and folk arts programming in a museum setting, and to develop pilot projects of their own.

General Program Support was awarded for the first time by the Council with an award to the Roberson Memorial. This funding category provides support to organizations which receive General Operating Support from another Council program. It provides unrestricted support for ongoing folk arts activities for organizations with a full time folk arts staff member paid through non-Council funding sources. The Roberson Center's folk arts program includes exhibitions, cultural heritage outreach programs and public programs relating to the ethnic and regional traditions of the Southern Tier. The Program also increased its institutional support, which amounted to a total of \$265,000 in the General Operating Support and Administrative Salaries categories.

The Folk Arts Program completed its fourth year as a funding program committed to preserving and perpetuating the traditional arts of New York,

whose richly textured cultural mosaic is becoming ever more varied. New Yorkers are experiencing renewed pride in their own traditions, and in the extraordinary stylistic and cultural diversity of the folk arts of the State.



## Individual Artists Program

DURING 1988-89 THE INDIVIDUAL ARTISTS Program administered a total of \$1,338,595, for 137 projects involving the creation of new work by composers filmmakers, media artists, playwrights, directors, designers, craftspeople, performance artists, photographers and sculptors. The amount represents a 5% aggregate increase over last year's allocation to the five funding categories handled by the program. Three of these funding categories offer support for artist-initiated projects in film and media (video and audio) and the visual arts. Requests for these funds are made through the sponsorship of a nonprofit organization that acts as a fiscal conduit for the artist. The program also handles composers' and theatre commissions. These are generally initiated by the ensemble or company that will perform the work.

This year \$41,000 was awarded for nine theatre commissions. The goal of the category is to provide opportunities for groups with limited budgets to commission outside talents. Funds are awarded for the creative fees of playwrights, directors and designers. They expand the creative possibilities for both an individual artist and the theatre company by helping establish new working relationships and encourage experimentation and development. At a time when the theatre community has been so hard hit financially, these funds have been catalytic in the development of new works for the stage, and new voices in American theatre. Seven of this year's awards were for women and minority artists.

Work that was supported this year represents the broad variety of artists and performance venues requesting commissioning funds. Judith Alexa Jackson received \$6,000 to write a new play that will explore the mythological teachings of Native American, Eastern Indian and Egyptian cultures. The work will incorporate music, dance, slides and film in live performance. Veteran journalist Alexander Cockburn received \$3,000 to write his first play. Working collaboratively with the Creation Production Company, Cockburn will create a work about Franklin Roosevelt and the Pearl Harbor bombing. Laurie Carlos received \$5,000 to write a new play that examines the texture of American Black life and its influences on culture and the media. The new work will premiere as a part of the Brooklyn Arts Council's/BACA Downtown Fringe Series. Milcha Sanchez-Scott received \$5,000 to create a new work for INTAR. The play will incorporate music and text to explore the Hispanic-American experience in a magical realist theatre work.

This year the Council committed an unprecedented \$203,051 to support of composers' commissions. Forty-three projects received grants under guidelines which allowed for consideration of up to 100% of the creative fee. The Council dropped its 1:1 matching requirement so that commissioning organizations could shift more of their resources to the other costs associated with supporting and presenting new work — principally those of copying scores

and rehearsal expenses. In addition to the ensembles, choruses and orchestras that receive on-going Council support, this category also welcomes dance and theatre companies, and organizations acting as conduits for groups of artists seeking to commission performance, film and video scores.

One of the most striking trends reflected in this year's funding is the amount and the diversity of music being written for the voice. New vocal work supported includes Roberto Sierra's setting of Eugenio de Hostos' *Peregrinacion de Bayoan* for the occasion of the Puerto Rican educator's sesquicentennial; Sheila Silver's multi-dimensional sound piece for the Gregg Smith Singers; works for solo voice by Anthony Davis (Harvestworks) and Peter Lieberman (Concert Artists Guild), and a cycle of songs based on the works of Victorian poets by Vivian Fine (Capital Chamber Players). Jazz is represented by awards to Bobby Previte (Sound Directions), Earl McIntyre (MOBI); Lee Hyla (Quintet of the Americas), and Frank Gordon (AACM). Among the composers supported for work with new technologies are Brenda Hutchinson, who is working with the Expanded Instrument technology developed by the Pauline Oliveros Foundation, and George Lewis, for creating a piece for acoustical and electronic instruments interacting via computer with a custom video system (Roulette Intermedium). Two operas received support: Meredith Monk's *Ghosts* (co-commissioned by the Houston Grand Opera), and William Schuman's one act companion piece to his classic *Casey at the Bat* for the Glimmerglass Opera Company. An increasing number of dance and theatre companies are requesting and receiving funds to commission work. Support for this development includes an award to Wayne Horowitz for writing incidental music for CSC Repertory's production of Harold Pinter's *Mountain Language*, Butch Morris' work for the Wooster Group's *Kyogen* project, and Basilio Georges' piece for the Spanish Dance Arts Company. William Bolcolm (NY Philharmonic), Andrew Imbrie (Riverside Orchestra) and Hillary Tann (Schenectady Symphony) are writing orchestral pieces; and Lois Vierk, Jay Alan Yim, and Julius Hemphill have been commissioned to write for chamber forces. (A full listing appears on page 98.)

Film Production awards for this fiscal year totalled \$534,000. This amount represents a 10% increase from last year's allocation, or \$28,766 in additional funds. Thirty four projects received support. As in past years, all phases of production were supported. Filmmakers are also offered support for distribution of their work by the Film Program (see page 86.)

Preproduction support was given to three projects for a total of \$43,000. Among those funded was *Deft Changes*, a narrative film in development by Alonzo Speight. The story, which is geared for young audiences, examines the relationship between responsibility and independence at the center of the passage to true adulthood.

Support for films in the production phase amounted to 58% of this year's budget. Traditionally this is the phase for which most support is requested and \$308,500 was awarded to 19 filmmakers. Documentary projects by Sachiko Hamada and Zydnia Nazario received \$20,000 each. Ms. Hamada's film *The Nail That Sticks Up* will focus on the lives of three Japanese women who have emigrated to the United States. Zydnia Nazario's *Linking Islands* will explore the question of Puerto Rican consciousness as evidenced through the work of Nuyorican poets and visual artists.

Sharon Greytak received \$20,000 funding for her first feature length narrative film, *Broken Frames*. The story concerns Erika, a product model who is struggling to reconcile conflicting emotions about her self identity and self image. Maureen Selwood's animated film *The Drawing Table: An Animated Memoir* received \$20,000 production support. The film will be constructed in five sections and combine drawn memory sequences with live action.

\$192,500 for post-production funds was awarded to thirteen projects, amounting to 36% of the total allocation. Of the thirteen awards, eight of the projects had previously received production support from the Council. This amount of second time funding indicates that the quality of work remains consistently high. It also underscores the fact that other sources of financial support are few and many filmmakers continue to face difficulties in obtaining

finishing funds for their projects. Completion funds include \$10,000 for Larry Gottheim's *Machete Gillette* an experimental work, shot in Santo Domingo, that poetically weaves local imagery and popular song. Bob Rosen's *Sun, Moon, Feather* an experimental documentary about the Miguel sisters (Spider-woman Theatre Company) living in Red Hook, Brooklyn received \$10,000 finishing funds and is now completed. Jessie Maple received \$20,000 and has finished her film *Twice As Nice*, a narrative film about twin sister college basketball stars.

Funding for Visual Artists Sponsored Work this year increased to \$210,608, over \$35,000 more than last year's amount. These awards for individual artists comprise 8.6% of the total budget for the Visual Artists Program. This category helps visual artists realize a specific project by providing 100% of the total project costs, up to \$10,500. Priority was given to projects that had the potential of making a significant contribution to the development of the artist. 23 artists received funding in this category, representing a great variety of disciplines and art forms. Artists working in all forms of visual art were eligible, photographers, painters, sculptors, as well as artists working with crafts, performance and electronic media. Over half of the awards were made to minority and women artists throughout the State.

Sculptor Ann Messner received \$10,500 to create a site specific installation. Working with found materials from the site, the work will integrate references to the actual location and the traditions of public sculpture. Monica Seaberry Beasley received \$10,000 to create a 30 foot painting to be installed outside of the Oswego Art Guild. The work will incorporate bold color and reflective paint enhanced by natural light and flora of the surrounding Fort Ontario Park. Photographer Shelly Ruston received \$10,500 to complete his work on a series of photographs documenting the recent changes in the upper Delaware Valley and Catskills. The work will explore the impact of commercial development on a region of the State that is rich with culture and traditions. Rimer Cardillo received \$10,500 to create a new installation project, *Altars*. The work will include 5 tryptych altars that will incorporate

drawings and sculptural forms created by the artist. Victoria Palermo received \$10,500 to create a series of sculptural forms using materials indigenous to the Adirondacks. The free standing pieces will be created with twigs, linens, clay and beeswax and exhibited at the Adirondack Lakes Center for the Arts.

Council support for individual audio, video, radio productions and installation works amounted to \$350,000. The panel reviewed 180 applications and twenty-nine projects received funding. Approximately half of the artists are receiving support for the first time.

The majority of this year's requests were for assistance in video production. \$228,000, or 65% of the budget, was spent in support of this category. Seventeen projects, ranging from documentary to experimental work were supported. Betsy Newman received \$10,000 in production funds for her tape *The Spirit of the Dream: The Grimke Sisters of South Carolina*. This experimental documentary portrays the efforts of the Grimke sisters in the pre-Civil War anti-slavery movement. It will combine texts from letters, speeches and slave journals to tell their story. David Blair's *Wax, or the Discovery of Television Among the Bees* received \$8,000 in completion funds. Image processing, industrial films, declassified US government UFO footage and Blair's narrative combine to tell the tale of a wealthy Egyptian bee scientist, Z. A. Abbassid. Ann E. Volkes and Ruth Lefkowitz received \$18,000 for their project *Lee Grant: Definitions of an Independent Woman*. The feature length documentary will examine the impact of being blacklisted during the 1950's on Grant's acting career and personal life. Indu Krishnan's examination of the process of cultural assimilation, *Home Truths: Three Generations of Asian Indian Women in America*, received \$24,000 production funding. Melvin McCray was awarded \$10,000 to complete his portrait of black activist *Dollie Robinson: A Woman and Her Times*.

Audio and video installations received \$105,000 or 30% of this year's media allocation. A total of nine grants were awarded. Shu Lea Cheang's *Color Schemes*, a video installation, examines the myth of

the American melting pot via the cycles of the laundry: Soak, Wash, Rinse, Extract. Reggie Hudlin received \$12,500 for his installation *Reggie's Third World of Soul*. This four channel piece will use parodies of television formats such as soap operas and talk shows, to present aspects of contemporary black life and black-white relations. Ed Tomney's audio installation *Seismic Room Intoner* received \$10,000 and will use aluminum beams, and springs to respond to movements and vibrations from audience members. Alex Hahn received \$15,000 for his experimental video installation titled *Dirt Site*. The piece will use three spatial horizons to represent the past, present and future worlds.

Individual radio and audio projects received 5% of the allocation, or a total of \$17,000. This figure reflects support for requests that were conceived and produced by independent artists rather than ongoing projects by media organizations. Requests for ongoing television and radio series were reviewed separately this year by the Media Program. Those projects receiving support for radio and audio work, through the Individual Artist program this year, range from narrative to experimental. Regine Beyer received \$5,000 for her documentary radio art programs on understanding the causes and effects of hearing loss. Sussan Deihim received \$7,000 for an interactive audio performance that will amplify and modify the sounds and rhythms of a ten member vocal ensemble. *Saratoga Springs*, an homage to small town America, is the newest radio project by Tom Lopez and received \$5,000 in production support

Support for residencies, subsidy of technical facilities, other commissioning as well as institutional support that creates venues for the presentation of artists' work are offered by several programs at the Council. Refer to the grants listings throughout this book for references to additional funding that benefits artists.



# Literature Program

IN 1988-89, NYSCA'S LITERATURE PROGRAM funded 164 organizations for a total of \$1,369,500 for literary programs and services. This represents twice as many literary organizations and almost a 100% increase in the financial support offered just a decade ago. The program now reaches out to all 62 counties of the State and strives to strengthen that connection by aiding the administrative infrastructure of the organizations that sponsor literary events and provide services to writers. Three categories are aimed explicitly at achieving that goal: General Operating Support, Technical Assistance, and Institutional Development of Upstate Literary Organizations.

\$143,000 was awarded in the General Operating Support category for the administrative expenses of a diverse group of organizations—among them are the Committee on International Poetry which produces readings by poets from around the world for New York City audiences; New Dramatists, a service organization for playwrights; and Writers & Books which sponsors readings and workshops as well as maintaining a bookstore and distribution services in the Rochester area.

Three organizations received technical assistance this year to hire consultants in different areas. Just Buffalo (Allentown Community Center) is working to increase its membership base in Western New York; the Library Action Committee (Langston Hughes Public Library) is devising an audience development project for the Corona, Queens community and Lumen is working on new marketing plans for its magazine *Sites*, as well as for the literary titles it publishes.

The category of Institutional Development of Upstate Literary Organizations is only in its second year but awards to upstate organizations increased by \$12,000 to a total of \$47,000. Four organizations — Allentown

Community Center/Just Buffalo, Community Writers Project of Syracuse, Hudson Valley Writers Guild in Albany and Writers & Books of Rochester received support for administrative initiatives designed to strengthen the effectiveness of staff, to increase the utilization of boards of directors and to develop long-range fundraising strategies.

The Literature Program continued its direct support of writers through one of its largest categories, Writers Appearances. The funds (over \$300,000) are used as fees for writers and offer audiences the opportunity to hear a variety of poets and fiction writers, playwrights and essayists read their work. The range of organizations regularly presenting writers to the public is as broad as the literary community itself. It includes Asian-Cine Vision and Manhattan Theatre Club in New York City, Hallwalls in Buffalo, the Wayne County Library System, the Women's Studio Workshop in Ulster County as well as Poets & Writers, Inc. which funds readings and workshops in all 62 counties.

The Writer-in-Residence category also provided support for a number of writers around the State: Sue Miller in Manhattan, Shay Youngblood in Syracuse, Oscar Hijuelos in Lake George and Frederick Ted Castle in Woodstock to name a few. In addition to providing time for writers to do their own work, the residency category was designed to help provide new literary programming to diverse communities and to assist organizations in developing new audiences for literature.

In order to support a fuller range of writers as well as encourage the production of new plays, the Staged Readings category offered support to 33 theatres for developmental work done with playwrights. In addition, \$40,800 was awarded to translators who will be translating new work for publication or for theatrical production.

Among the organizations that are the most long-lived in the literary field are non-commercial presses and magazines. Nineteen publishers were awarded \$181,600 to support the publication and distribution of books of poetry, fiction, plays, and non-fiction.

Literary magazines such as *Between C & D* and *Grand Street* (Manhattan), *Lake Effect*, (Oswego), and *The Glens Falls Review*, continue to reach out to a wider variety of writers and to develop their marketing expertise in order to expand distribution and gain new readers.

Last year, the Literature Program awarded funds to establish the Latin American Writers Institute in New York City. After a little over a year of operation the Institute has become a resident of the City College of New York and offers a series of lectures, readings and workshops involving Latin American writers and scholars from around the world as well as Spanish-speaking writers and audiences from the New York area. In an effort to address several concerns expressed by the constituency, the Literature Program sponsored, in cooperation with the Rensselaer County Council for the Arts, a spring conference on diversity in programming, developing audiences and networking. Held in Troy, the two day event was designed as a working conference for administrators who design and oversee reading series around the State. Over thirty librarians, programmers and writers attended seminar sessions that presented speakers sharing their own experiences in the field and that also encouraged practical information sharing.

The Literature Program has funded groups around the State that are exemplary in their efforts to reach out to their audiences. At least one group (Manhattan Theatre Club) now has a regular program of readings which are simultaneously presented in American Sign Language for the hearing impaired. Every genre and most schools of writing are represented by the groups we fund — from the Poetry Society of America to the Poetry Project at St. Mark's, from *Blatant Artifice* magazine in Buffalo to Dixon Place in lower Manhattan.

If the Council's mandate is to provide support for individual writers while at the same time serving the needs of the public of New York State, the Council's Literature Program has distinguished itself in fostering diversity and addressing the concerns of very diverse communities across the State. Through

categories that offer fees to poets and writers, that provide publication outlets, and that encourage the development of literary organizations, this program works to ensure a healthy literary environment well into the next decade.



## Local Arts Organizations/ Service Organizations Program

THE LOCAL ARTS ORGANIZATIONS/Service Organizations Program supports the artistic and administrative development of local arts agencies in New York State. The Program's constituency is a fundamental component of the arts delivery system of the State, and each year expands the critical role it plays in providing financial resources and cultural services to local artists and arts organizations across the State. As the primary administrative agents for both the Decentralization and LIFT Programs, as well as the New York State Fellowship Program, the ASO constituency continues to share fully the New York State Council's own mission of cultural development on behalf of the citizens of New York.

In addition to a continued commitment to flexible administrative support through the provision of General Operating Support, which represents approximately 80% of the Program's core allocation, the ASO Program also supports the institutional needs of its constituents through the categories of Professional Consultants and Institutional Advancement. Both categories are designed to encourage organizations to strengthen their administrative capabilities and to plan for future growth. In 1988-89, Arts Council of Rockland and the Northern Westchester Center for the Arts were awarded first-year support in the category of Institutional

Advancement. Second-year grants were awarded to the Alliance of New York State Arts Councils, Chemung Valley Arts Council and the Rockland Center for the Arts. Final-year grants were awarded to the Bronx Council on the Arts and the Rensselaer County Council on the Arts. Grants for the utilization of professional consultants were awarded to a total of fourteen organizations for consultancies ranging from board development to capital campaign development. Both of these highly specialized categories of support require extensive participation from the organization's Board of Directors, and Institutional Advancement funds must be matched on a two-to-one basis over three years.

Based on funding priorities identified by the Council at the onset of fiscal 1988-89, the ASO Program provided increased support in General Operating funds and project categories to local arts agencies serving rural communities throughout the State. A total of seventeen rural arts councils and art centers received increased support totaling approximately \$55,000. A second Council funding priority was the continuation of the Harlem Arts Services Initiative. This joint project between the ASO Program and the Special Arts Services Program was designed in 1987-88 to increase collaborative efforts and to promote greater sharing of resources among Harlem based arts groups. A total of \$75,000 was awarded to five Harlem based organizations under this initiative for 1988-89. Activities supported included the following: implementation of a cooperative marketing plan for three major Harlem institutions; marketing and promotional services for products designed by artists through Harlem Textile Works; and a series of professional development workshops for individual artists sponsored by Jazzmobile.

Again in 1988-89 the Council expanded its commitment to marketing the arts of New York State through a special Marketing Training Initiative coordinated by the ASO Program. Through this Council-wide initiative which began in 1986-87, organizations are funded to assist their constituencies in identifying and increasing their audiences through in-depth work with marketing experts and professional consultants. A total of \$150,000 was awarded to 8 organizations on behalf of the follow-

ing constituencies: small to medium-sized New York based theatre companies; Hispanic visual artists; New York State's self-presenting chamber music ensembles; independent video and media artists; individual artists working in schools; and cultural institutions located in Westchester and Orange Counties.

Unique among the activities supported through the Local Arts Organizations/Service Organizations Program is the New York State Fellowship Program, as designed and administered by the New York Foundation for the Arts. In 1988-89 the New York Foundation awarded a total of 236 Fellowship Awards (at an increased level of \$6000) to individual artists in fourteen categories and representing twenty-one counties around the State. Since the inception of the Fellowship Program, each fellowship recipient has been required to perform a public service activity within the State of New York. This integral part of the Fellowship experience, now called Artists and Audiences, has grown over the years to become a challenging series of program options for artists and a growing statewide network of sponsoring organizations. In addition to meeting its goal of increasing the level of Fellowship awards to \$6000 in Fiscal Year 1988-89, the New York Foundation continues to provide extensive services to individual creative artists throughout the State by improving their access to career information and resources.



## Local Incentive Funding Test/LIFT

IN 1988-89 TWENTY-TWO COUNTIES WERE awarded a total of \$244,000 through the Council's Local Incentive Funding Test Program (LIFT). Since its inception in 1983-84, LIFT has generated over \$1,250,000 in local funds to match State support. The Program was initiated by the New York State

Council to encourage county governments to play an integral role in the delivery of arts programs and services to the citizens of their counties and to encourage cooperation and collaboration among arts organizations based within each county. Through the LIFT Program, funds are awarded to counties on a matching basis with two dollars of State funds matched by 3 local dollars. Of the matching amounts, a minimum of 60% comes from the local county government budget. The remaining 40% of the local match may come from any other local source including municipal governments or local business. In 1988-89, grants ranged in size from \$1,200 to Herkimer County to \$34,250 for Westchester County.

Over the last six years the LIFT Program has generated a unique variety of local initiatives on behalf of county-wide cultural development. LIFT has proven to be an effective vehicle for entrepreneurship throughout the State with programs suitably reflecting local priorities.

In recognition of the special needs of their communities this year, specific projects were undertaken in several counties. Erie County used LIFT funds to finance an innovative program providing assistance to individual artists and minority arts organizations through fellowship support and program grants. In Westchester, county government and the local arts leadership worked in partnership to increase employment opportunities for individual performing, visual and literary artists through a special Visiting Artists Program. Approximately 75 traditional and non-traditional sites participate in this program annually including senior nutrition centers, day care facilities specializing in assistance for teenage parents, small town libraries, community centers and a wide range of county school districts. Wyoming County identified the need for more publicity and greater visibility for the art and cultural organizations operating in the county. In response, Wyoming County has used LIFT funds for the publication of a media guide listing media resources throughout Western New York and has published a cultural calendar detailing upcoming cultural events.



## Media Program

IN 1989-90, THE MEDIA PROGRAM awarded a total of \$1,659,655 to 102 organizations for a total of 255 projects in the areas of video, audio, radio, or television. It was a year marked by difficulties, both economic (as Albany struggled to meet the budget deficit and the Media Program's budget changed over the course of the year) and structural (as the Council proceeded with a plan of merging the Media and Film Programs, with an implementation set for the start of the next fiscal year). Despite these difficulties and challenges, the Media Program carried out the funding of a number of notable initiatives, sustained the growth and stability of its exhibition and organizational development categories in particular, and helped a number of important new productions see the light of day.

One landmark event that catalyzed the field was the opening this year of the Museum of Modern Art's major retrospective of the work of video artist Bill Viola, made possible with the Media Program's support. Incorporating both installation work and the exhibition of videotapes, the exhibition marked the first time that the Museum has presented a retrospective of a video artist and only the second time that any New York museum has so favored the field. In this sense, it was a coming of age both for the Museum and for the field as a whole.

This museum attention to video installation was paralleled by the Media Program's concern with finding broader outlets for such work and developing sites throughout the State with an interest in the exhibition of installation work. To that end, funding went to Parabola Arts for the first phase of a new touring initiative for audio and video installations, in conjunction with the Gallery Association of New York State.

Meanwhile, on Long Island, the Inter-Media Art Center in Huntington received funds to tour a

program of video art on the Island. And the Museum of the American Indian was funded to tour a new program, *Video Native American*, around the State. The touring and distribution of original video works to reach new audiences has been a particular emphasis this year. The *Icono Negro* will be circulated to sites in New York State by Camera News, while Buffalo-based Hallwalls is circulating *Infermental 7*, an international compilation of video art curated by Hallwalls. The Black Filmmaker Foundation was awarded funds to distribute videotapes by black makers statewide. Extending further the accessibility of new video works to the public, Upstate Films in Rhinebeck got first-time funding to begin showing video.

Radio and television play an important role in the dissemination of independent work to a broad audience. The Committee on Poetry, Inc. received funding to distribute a pioneering radio series exploring international poetry, beginning with a survey of the radio stations in New York State with an interest in innovative programming. The Educational Broadcasting Corporation (WNET-TV) continues its *New Television* series premiering innovative video, while at the same time continuing to dispense production funds that makes the completion of such work possible. A first-time grant to Staten Island Community TV is providing the public with television access as producers rather than mere consumers, through a series of production workshops to be held at its sophisticated new facilities. To enlarge awareness of audio art, the Archive for Contemporary Music has been funded to create and distribute both a catalogue and a computerized listing of its large collection.

For the field to develop, service organizations that serve the artist as well as the public are crucial. First-time support went to the Latino Collaborative, the first artist-service organization for Latino makers. Also in the category of institutional development was a special award to Camera News, enabling the hiring of a new administrative director to help stabilize this key distributor's operations. In the Buffalo area, greatly increased funding to Squeaky Wheel is intended to strengthen a young organization that has proved itself to be a vital

stimulant to video production, exhibition, and training for both emerging and established talents. Artists will also get a boost from the award to Light Work Visual Studies in Syracuse, where the money will establish a video/computer studio for computer imaging. Finally, the Funding Exchange received a substantial award to regrant production funds to both women and minority producers working to create video documentaries on issues of social importance; as a condition of the grant, the Funding Exchange is committed to matching Media Program funds on a one-to-one basis thereby enlarging the pool of funds available to artists in New York State.

Although video is a relatively recent medium, its past is already endangered due to the lack of archival technologies thus far available. In order to preserve videotapes from even the recent past, more work must be done to transfer endangered tapes to the most currently stable materials and to conduct research into the viability of authentic preservation. Grants were made to both the Museum of Modern Art and Film/Video Arts to establish two different approaches to the problem. The Museum will be developing a sophisticated 1" restoration facility to restore early video art, while Film/Video Arts will be establishing a low-cost 1/2" preservation and recovery facility for artists.

If preservation of the actual physical medium is important, so too is the less tangible preservation of the values, intentions, and aesthetic complexities of the work that is produced. For this reason, writing on video art has been supported for several years as a category of funding aimed at strengthening a field still nascent in its own interrogation of itself. Two awards were made in this category: one to Coco Fusco on the promotion of Latino media in the late-80s market, and one to David Trend for an essay on the distinction between amateur and professional at a time of increasing sophistication in consumer products.

Finally, and of foremost priority for the Media Program, a quarter of the year's budget went to the support of video and audio production by New York State artists. See the listings in the Individual Artists Program section of this annual report for details on

all the artist initiated projects that were funded. The significance of past funding was made clear by the success of *Inside Life Outside*, a video documentary on the homeless that was completed this year and has been presented to wide acclaim, including a presentation at the Berlin Film Festival. In addition, this year the Media Program experimented with a separate category of funding for video, television, and radio projects that were organization-initiated. A total of 12 projects were funded out of 47 requests. Awards included one to WSKG-TV in Binghamton for a one-hour documentary on jazz great Slam Stewart; one to Pacific Street Film Project for a videotape on Caribbean culture in Brooklyn, slated for airing on WNET-TV; and one to the Seneca Nation in Erie County, for a documentary on snowsnake, an ancient Iriquois game of skill, and the turtle rattle, a sacred musical instrument used in ceremonies of the Longhouse tradition.



## Museum Program

MUSEUMS EXIST TO COLLECT, PRESERVE, exhibit and interpret culturally significant objects including art, historical artifacts and natural history and science-related materials which constitute the material heritage of humankind. This past year, through its funding process, the Museum Program asserted its ongoing commitment to encouraging high quality, interpretive exhibitions, well-planned and comprehensive collections care, and innovative and effective educational programming.

The Program disbursed \$7,472,500 to a total of 188 organizations in 54 counties throughout New York State. These awards reflect the large and diverse museum community in New York State and the Council's commitment to funding a broad spectrum of high quality, museum-based activity. Awards

were given to a range of organizational types, from historical societies, fine art museums, children's museums, science and natural history museums, and science/technology centers ranging from small, community-based historical agencies to some of the nation's, and the world's, largest museums.

The highest percentage of the program's funding is directed towards General Operating Support with \$5,031,950, or 67% of the total allocation, devoted to GOS for 76 organizations across the State. In recognition of the ever increasing needs of the museum field, increases totalling \$240,792 were awarded to GOS recipients this past year. Additionally, first time GOS was awarded to four organizations — Historic Cherry Hill in Albany, the Center for Community Studies in Manhattan, Akwesasne Cultural Center in Hogsburg and the Society for the Preservation of Weeksville in Brooklyn. The balance of the Program's allocation of \$2,440,550 was disbursed in nine support categories.

In the exhibition category, the Museum Program panel reviewed numerous innovative art, history and science requests that attest to the cultural pluralism of New York State. A total of \$794,450, or 11% of the total allocation, was awarded for support of 78 exhibitions across the State. Among the more notable were: *La Bodega*, a social history of Hispanic grocery stores in New York City, presented by Amigos del Museo del Barrio; *Dreamings, the Art of*

*Aboriginal Australia*, organized by the Asia Society; *Traditions and Transformations: Contemporary Afro-American Sculpture*, an exhibition of works by ten contemporary African American sculptors, organized by the Bronx Museum of Art; *The Appropriate Object*, an exhibition of work by seven contemporary African American artists in diverse media, presented by the Albright-Knox Art Gallery; *It's News to Me*, an exhibition exploring the meaning of news journalism to children and their families, organized by the Staten Island Children's Museum; and *Access to the Arts*, an exhibition of tactile objects for the visually impaired, organized by the American Folk Art Museum. Other funded projects include an exhibition of Soviet art from 1980-1985 at Exit Art in Manhattan and an exhibition on 19th century cheese-making at the Northern New York Agricultural Historical Society in LaFargeville.

In the interests of ensuring the physical survival of and public accessibility to New York State's material heritage, the Program awarded \$609,580 for Collections Care and Documentation projects at 78 institutions. In addition, the Museum Program awarded an additional \$36,200 to 16 organizations for conservation treatment. Significant projects included the cataloguing of the Shapiro Collection of Russian porcelains at the Cooper Hewitt Museum, support for the cataloguing of the European glass collection at the Corning Museum of Glass, and the second year of support for inventorying the extensive, regionally-important collections at the Onondaga Historical Association in Syracuse. Other projects include the planning for upgrading storage areas at the Staten Island Historical Society for its significant holding of agricultural artifacts and a similar project at the South Street Seaport Museum to upgrade storage for its archeological collections from lower Manhattan sites. A limited number of multi-year awards were made to museums whose goals are to develop comprehensive collections management programs. One award, to the Studio Museum in Harlem, provided funds to catalogue and document its collection and to design and implement improvements in its collections storage areas. A two year project at the Ontario County Historical Society would re-classify and document collections, computerize data, and organize and re-store the objects by type.

The program continued its support for internships in the museum field, awarding \$94,500 for ten internships in as many institutions. In recognition of the need to encourage minorities in the museum field, four of the awards went to organizations committed to minority recruitment, including the Schoharie Museum of the Iroquois Indian for a Native American intern and the Bronx Historical Society for an Hispanic intern in the museum's Education Department.

The categories of Museum Education and Interpretation and Planning for Museum Education encourage museums to respond to the needs of their respective communities and to provide access to a museum's collections, exhibitions and scholarly research through educational programming. A total of \$289,050 was awarded in these two categories. Exemplary programs include a planning project to design educational programming in conjunction with historical photography collections submitted by the Dewitt Historical Society in Ithaca on behalf of itself and three other regional historical agencies including the Cortland County Historical Society, the Tioga County Historical Society and the Chemung County Historical Society. Salary support for a programming coordinator for the Asian American community was provided to the American Museum of Natural History. Additionally the Program supplied funds for planning for interpretive programs in conjunction with the Brooklyn Historical Society's new Brooklyn History Gallery.

The Museum Program maintained its commitment to provide high quality consulting, educational and technical services to the museum community through its significant operating and project support to such organizations as the Gallery Association of New York State, the Regional Council of Historical Agencies, the Federation of Historical Services, the Lower Hudson Conference and the Western New York Association of Historical Agencies. Individually, and as a network, these organizations provide many essential services to the New York State museum community, delivering both ongoing basic services as well as creating special initiatives, such as last year's New Directors' Institute, a week long intensive training seminar for 30 "new" historical

society and museum directors from organizations across the State, organized by the Regional Council of Historical Agencies. The Regional Council of Historical Agencies will organize a similar training program in exhibition development with this year's funding. In addition to these organizations, the Program also sponsors other services to the field, including conservation consultancies provided by the New York State Conservation Consultancy in cooperation with the Lower Hudson Conference and workshops for museum professionals sponsored in conjunction with the Metropolitan Museum of Art.

New Audiences for the Year 2000 is a Council funding initiative created two years ago to expand access to audiences that are not currently reached by established arts organizations. Under this special allocation, the Program funded five museums for a total of \$83,000. Particularly noteworthy were projects proposed by the Albany Institute of History and Art and the Buffalo & Erie County Historical Society. In Phase III of its project, which has previously entailed extensive self-studies involving programs, exhibitions, collections and audiences, the Albany Institute will organize ethnic festivals and mini-exhibitions for minority communities in the Capital District and will develop a collections strategy for inclusion of art and artifacts relevant to the region's ethnic history and art history. The Buffalo & Erie County Historical Society continued work commenced last year for planning of a major permanent exhibition called *Neighbors* which will examine how the succession of immigrant groups in Buffalo has shaped and been influenced by the history of the city and the county.

Throughout the year, the Museum Program staff has maintained an active dialogue with its constituency. It is through this communication and Council support that museums and other arts organizations throughout New York State enrich millions of our citizens.



## Music Program

NEW YORK STATE IS HOME TO A RICH diversity of artistic expression in the field of music. With the Music Program's commitment to supporting musical events of high professional calibre, we face the continuing challenge of making a difference throughout the State.

In 1988-89 the Council, through its Music Program awarded \$6,697,085 to 396 organizations and 43 composers. Support went to a diverse assortment of musical activities in all sixty-two counties of the State. Grants ranging from \$1,000 to \$675,000 were distributed to opera companies, orchestras, jazz ensembles, early music groups, music service organizations, traditional chamber music ensembles, concert bands, contemporary music groups, and vocal ensembles. In addition to the Program's regular list of funding categories, support was provided through a number of special programs, including the *New York New Music Network* tour, *New Audiences for the Year 2000*, *Composers' Commissions*, *Recording* and the *Musical Instrument Revolving Loan Fund*.

The Music Program's third *New York New Music Network* tour had its most successful season ever, filling houses across the State and garnering very favorable reviews. The Program received numerous letters from audience members eager to attend future Network presentations. Radio and television interviews and ads helped to make this a particularly effective project for developing and educating audiences for contemporary music.

Max Roach, Philip Glass, the Kronos Quartet, Double Edge, Women of the Calabash and Henry Threadgill were all participants in this season's tour. Together, these trend-setting composers and innovative instrumentalists turned the Empire State into the empire of new music when they presented twenty-one concerts in five cities throughout the State.

While the majority of the tour's budget (\$202,500) came from NYSCA, the Music Program was successful in attracting significant private sector participation for the first time. Production was shared by NYSCA and Hallwalls Contemporary Arts Center in Buffalo; \$67,500 of non-NYSCA support was contributed from a variety of funding sources.

Dramatic shifts in the demographics of the State's population have prompted arts organizations to reassess their audience development programs. In 1988-89, the Music Program encouraged those efforts through the New Audiences for the Year 2000 project. Conceived as a three-year program, New Audiences for the Year 2000 proved to be a significant catalyst in the cultivation of new audiences which were drawn from diverse communities. A grant of \$40,000 was awarded to the Syracuse Symphony in this, the final year of this special initiative. That orchestra's *Project 2000* included concerts of orchestral and choral music and jazz. In addition to this concert activity, the Syracuse Symphony's new audience development saw the establishment of a scholarship program for young minority musicians, as well as an instrument loan program for disadvantaged young people.

The Music Program continues to play a vital role in its own Musical Instrument Revolving Fund, a project that provides long-term, low-interest loans to music organizations. This program, financed with special funds provided by the New York State Legislature and sponsored by NYSCA, is the first state-supported project of its kind in the nation. The program is a decided break from the usual methods of public support for the arts. It does not provide grants to individuals or organizations for services, or for development. Rather, it helps musicians and music organizations purchase quality instruments through loans from a State fund to nonprofit music organizations. In 1988-89, eleven organizations received loans totalling \$199,585 for the purchase of twenty-eight instruments. Now five years old, the Musical Instrument Revolving Loan Fund program has proven remarkably successful in providing an imaginative solution to problems faced by New York State's musical community.

An important part of our work is the support of recording projects. In 1988-89 a total of \$126,500 was awarded to nonprofit recording companies, and to independent recordings initiated by music ensembles throughout the State.

Organizations which provided valuable service to the music field at large were awarded \$489,000; these encompassed a broad range of services, such as Meet the Composer's regranting activities.

The importance placed on the creation of new works is evidenced by the \$203,050 awarded in the Composers' Commissions category, as administered by the Individual Artists Program (a complete listing of those awards may be found under that Program's heading). With these grants, composers will write scores for various ensembles, including orchestras, opera companies, jazz, and chamber groups, dance, theatre and film scores. In each case the commissioning organization guarantees performances of the new work.



## Presenting Organizations Program

THROUGH ITS SUPPORT TO PRESENTERS, the Council seeks to accomplish two of its main goals — promoting cultural diversity and helping to bring artistic performances of high quality to the State's citizens. In 1988-89, a total of \$3,095,900 was awarded to 220 organizations in 54 counties for the presentation of 3,891 performances. This represents an increase of 370 performances over the 1987-88 level and was made possible because of a \$353,900 increase in the Program's allocation over 1987-88. Grants ranged from \$500-\$342,500 with the majority of the awards between \$3,000 and \$10,000. The majority of the grants were for the categories of General Operating Support and Presentation. Through the increased support for the former, POP

was also able to better address the stabilization needs of the field. Priority support was given to those organizations that incorporated into their seasons the presentation of lesser known and minority artists,

new work by living artists, and unique programming that carried high artistic and financial risks. In addition, a \$76,000 grant from the National Endowment for the Arts (Dance/Inter-Arts/State Programs Presenting Touring Initiative) was awarded to 33 organizations for the presentation of out-of-state dance companies.

As in prior years, over three-quarters of the Program's funds were allocated to organizations outside Manhattan. This high percentage of support reflects the Program's ongoing commitment to develop and sustain upstate presenters so that residents in the more remote regions of the State are able to experience a wide variety of quality artistic programming in their own communities. Fifty different types of organizations ranging from internationally distinguished institutions to small volunteer organizations including: multi-arts and cultural centers; arts councils; museums; historical societies; visual arts organizations; media centers; libraries; municipalities; dance, music and theatre producers; and ethnic, educational, religious and social service agencies received support.

Some highlights of the presenting year included: the two-week *Up Tiempo* festival by Creative Time in collaboration with El Museo Del Barrio in which artists of the Americas were presented; the reemergence of Town Hall as a major presenter with its *Not Just Jazz Festival*, the *Black Roots Sampler*, and the *New Tradition Series*; the annual summer residencies of the New York City Ballet, New York City Opera, and Philadelphia Orchestra at the Saratoga Performing Arts Center; the *Next Wave Festival* at the Brooklyn Academy of Music; Wave Hill's presentation of Jean Pierre Perreault's *Piazza*, a site specific dance with live music by David MacIntyre at this Bronx environmental center; Lincoln Center's second season of *Serious Fun*; and Central Park Conservancy's *Summerstage*.

The Program increased its support to minority organizations and to the presentation of minority artists in 1988-89. First-time support was given to Allentown Community Center and Eastside Coalition of Arts in Buffalo, and to the Fund for the Borough of Brooklyn on behalf of programming for the minority community at the Majestic Theatre in Brooklyn. Special highlights in 1988-89 included: the *Festival Latino* presented by the New York Shakespeare Festival, a three-week festival which featured international theatre companies; *Big, Bold, and Black* by Thelma Hill Performing Arts Center; the Dancemobile performances by Arts Uptown; dance and world renowned jazz artists presented at Afrikan Poetry Theatre and the Caribbean Festival by Caribbean Cultural Center.

Eleven organizations in the counties of Allegany, Bronx, Dutchess, Erie, Essex, Oneida, Queens, and Westchester received support for their first or second year of presentational activity through the New Presenter Development category. This category encourages the creation and development of new presenters in those regions of the State where there is a scarcity of performing arts activity and/or a lack of a particular art form.

In 1988-89, the Program increased support in the categories of Administrative Development and Professional Consultants. This was in response to the field's requests for the type of professional

support that is critical to their institutional stabilization.

In 1988-89, the Program continued several initiatives designed to stimulate the presentation of innovative and contemporary programming. Through the Commissions category, a total of \$90,300 was granted to 15 presenters in the counties of Bronx, Greene, Kings, New York, Staten Island, and Tompkins, to commission 27 works. Commissioned artists included: Eiko & Koma, Susan Marshall, David Gordon, Ann Carlson, Elizabeth Streb, David Van Tieghem, Oliver Lake, Theodora Skiptares, Leon Kirchner, Tobias Picker, and Bright Sheng.

A second category designed to stimulate more dynamic programming in upstate regions was the Incentive Programming category. This category provides funding to presenters of traditional programming to engage a non-traditional artist/ensemble for a half-week residency. Through this category, a total of \$80,822 was granted to 12 presenters (including a consortium of 4 presenters), from the counties of Cattaraugus, Chautauqua, Chenango, Clinton, Monroe, St. Lawrence, Suffolk, and Westchester. They presented half-week residencies by Craig Harris, Bob Holman, Laura Dean Dance Company, Jo Andres, and Western Wind.

In 1988-89, the Presenting Organizations Program in cooperation with the Cultural Resources Council of Syracuse and Onondaga County conducted two one-day seminars in Peekskill and Syracuse on the presentation of contemporary, non-traditional performing arts. Each seminar was co-hosted by the local arts councils. Entitled *New Works, New Audiences 1989*, these seminars offered artists showcases and roundtable discussions on such topics as programming, marketing and fundraising for new work. A total of 160 participants representing 110 presenting organizations attended.

In 1988-89, the Program expended \$125,000 for second-year participation in the Council's *New Audiences for the Year 2000* project. Second year participants — The Bardavon 1869 Opera House in Poughkeepsie and Proctor's Theatre in Schenectady presented a second series of non-traditional per-

formances — including a premiere of a work by David Cale — in alternative spaces developed especially for this initiative. Inter-Media Art Center presented a second series of programming to attract audiences from the minority populations of Nassau and Suffolk counties. The Arts Center, Nazareth College in Rochester received first-time support for extended residency activity and a specific marketing campaign to develop new audiences for Pat Oleszko, John Zorn, and Paul Zaloom.



## Special Arts Services Program

THE TOTAL DOLLAR ALLOCATION FOR Special Arts Services this year was \$4,557,200. The Special Arts Services Program awarded \$4,455,000 to 231 organizations throughout the State. The remaining \$102,200. was disbursed through other NYSCA Programs to fourteen primary organizations as part of a special funding initiative to strengthen the institutional operations of the multicultural constituency.

SAS funding enabled minority/ethnic artists, administrators, and organizations to pursue their diverse goals and thereby continue to enrich the vigorous cultural pluralism of New York State which the SAS Program is mandated to nurture and perpetuate. The 231 SAS grantees included twenty organizations which received first-time funding from the Program, and nine others which received support in special incentive, competitive categories only. These competitive categories: administrative internships; visual artist residencies; and choreographer development commissions, are designed to address the need for expanded professional opportunities for minority artists and administrators.

Generally, the funding categories of the Special Arts Services Program are designed with a threefold purpose: to promote the institutional stability and well-being of diverse minority/ethnic organizations; to provide direct support to ethnic artists and to arts programs which address the needs of multicultural communities; and to encourage more qualitative, relevant programming for ethnic community audiences.

In 1988-89, the Program's priority concern to strengthen the institutional capacities of its multicultural, applicant constituency was reflected in increased allocation of funds toward General Operating Support, Administrative Support, and the Institutional Advancement Program.

General Operating Support was extended to organizations which have a proven track record of exemplary service, a good measure of administrative efficiency, and a profound commitment to the Program's constituent communities. The total allocation for General Operating Support awards increased by 10% over 1987-88. Altogether, \$1,637,450 (36.8% of the SAS allocation) was distributed among 41 organizations.

The restructured Administrative Support category was introduced in the 1987-88 funding cycle in the hope of being able to respond more effectively to the fast changing needs of the multicultural constituency which includes many, young organizations at

different stages of institutional development. In 1988-89, \$215,750 was awarded to forty organizations. (This represents a 55% increase in awarded funds when compared to the \$139,000 distributed among thirty grantees in the previous year). Individual grants ranged from \$1,000 to \$15,000 but the average Administrative Support grant was just under \$5,000. Most of the funds awarded through this category provide partial subsidy of salaries for principal administrative personnel of organizations with well established funding histories within the Program. These administrative support grants are renewable, generally at diminishing levels of funding, for a maximum of five years of support.

The Institutional Advancement Program is another funding category designed to foster the well-being of the many developing institutions in the Program's applicant constituency. Institutional Advancement invites applicants to submit a three year plan which specifically addresses artistic and/or administrative concerns vital to the organization's ongoing progress. Applicants' proposals compete with each other for entry into the program. Second and third year participants must demonstrate satisfactory progress on their approved plans in order to win the next year's award.

In 1988-89, three organizations completed their participation in this funding initiative: Asian Cine Vision successfully developed an individual membership campaign. INTAR developed an ambitious musical theatre work, *Tango Apasionado*. And Kenkeleba House improved its promotional and funding development capabilities within a coordinated long-range plan. Altogether, twelve organizations were awarded \$210,000 through Institutional Advancement for 1988-89. (This represents a 6.5% increase in funds when compared to \$197,000 distributed among fourteen organizations previously.)

The three other competitive categories, visual artists residencies; minority choreographer development commissions; and administrative internships, provided new professional opportunities for minority individuals. Among the fourteen visual artists awarded residencies (ranging from five to nine

months) with diverse organizations throughout the State were: sculptor, Kim Tran; printmaker, Melvin Clark; mixed media/performance artist, Pepon Osorio; and ceramicist, Nitzia Tufino. Among the eight emerging choreographers who won commissions for new works were: Thomas Pinnock, Barbara Chang, and Oscar Correale. The internship category provided modest stipends for four fledgling arts administrators to facilitate internship experiences at institutions such as The Pyramid Arts Center and Women Make Movies, Inc.

As in the past, a large part of Special Arts Services' allocation was dispensed through the various categories addressing instruction and training programs; performances, exhibitions and presentations. Upcoming generations of artists are currently being trained in a variety of arts disciplines. Special Arts Services continues to be committed to extending support to training programs that enable aspiring and talented minority and ethnic individuals to receive training in their communities and enhance their capabilities and opportunities to pursue the arts as a career. Funds awarded through the instruction and training categories totalled \$1,019,980 (23% of the SAS Allocation) which was distributed among 110 programs. Total funding for performances and exhibitions targeted for diverse minority/ethnic community audiences amounted to \$871,120 (19.5% of the SAS allocation). These funds were distributed among 134 programmatic grants.

The funding details described above illustrate how the Program supports New York State's rich cultural heritage. As the demographic character of the State changes, the Special Arts Services Program hopes to continue to keep abreast of developments and trends that affect the field and to take a leadership role in providing the kind of support to artists and arts organizations that will enable them to maintain high quality arts activities and continue to serve the myriad communities of New York State. Special Arts Services takes great pride in the rich cultural diversity of its constituency.



## Theatre Program

NEW YORK STATE HAS LONG BEEN closely identified with its vibrant theatrical history. A quarter of a century ago, the off-off Broadway and American experimental theatre movements first flourished in New York City thanks to a remarkable confluence of talent and willingness to take risks. Shortly thereafter, the resident theatre movement took hold in the State, creating the excellent major theatres which today serve the larger metropolitan areas. Recent years have witnessed the evolution of

another force in New York's theatrical life, the emergence of an expanding universe of theatre artists and organizations that reflect the State's cultural diversity and richness. In 1988-89 the Theatre Program worked to encourage this new creative energy and to reach out to new audiences while deepening its long-standing commitment to leading theatrical institutions.

A total of \$4,420,000 (an increase of \$300,000 over 1987-88) was awarded to 160 organizations located in 29 counties. The funding, in amounts ranging from \$1,000 to \$300,000, supported activities cover-

ing the full spectrum of theatre aesthetics and forms including classical work, new plays, alternative theatre, performance art, music theatre, mime, street theatre and theatre for young people. Support was provided to off Broadway and off-off Broadway organizations, to large institutional theatres, resident theatres, ethnic theatres, summer theatres, ensemble or collaborative companies, and to a limited number of semi-professional theatres as well as to theatre publications and theatre service organizations.

Ongoing institutional support continued to be offered through the Program's two primary categories: General Operating Support and Professional Performance/Home Base. Together the two categories represented over 90% of the Theatre Program allocation and totalled \$4,100,000. During 1988-89, 90 organizations were placed on multi-year support in order to free administrative time and to facilitate long-range planning. The amount awarded in multi-year support increased from \$807,500 in 1987-88 to \$2,270,000 in 1988-89.

Fourteen theatres were awarded first-time funding including three new theatres upstate and two new ethnic companies. Nine of these companies were funded under the New Theatre Advancement category which was created to provide incentive support to young organizations demonstrating unusual artistic promise. The nine theatres were selected from 26 applicants to the category and received awards ranging from \$2,000 to \$4,500.

The Program often reviews applicants from a certain segment of the field comparatively, within the context of an overview of relevant problems and needs. During the past year both the ethnic theatres and the experimental/alternative theatres were considered in this manner. In response to the perceived fragility of many ethnic companies, the Program directed \$81,000 (or 27%) of its 1988-89 increase to this area, thereby increasing, restoring or giving first-time support to 13 ethnic theatres. The experimental theatres, often viewed as the research and development arm of the field, were increased by a total of \$99,000 or 33% of the allocated increase.

Funded theatre activity reaches into all parts of the State and includes not only the major resident

theatres (Studio Arena in Buffalo, GeVa in Rochester, Syracuse Stage in Syracuse, Capital Rep in Albany and Long Island Stage in Rockville Centre) but emerging institutions such as the Hangar Theatre in Ithaca, Das Puppenspiel in Westfield, the Kavinoky, and Theatre of Youth in Buffalo, Penguin Players in Thiells and smaller theatres such as Pendragon in Saranac Lake, the Depot Theatre in Westport and the Open Hand Theatre in Syracuse. The Program is committed to ongoing developmental support in an effort to make theatre accessible to everyone in the State.

The Special Projects category was created in 1987-88 to allow for the realization of unique projects of high artistic merit. These projects generally require an extended period of development and often fall outside customary Program guidelines. Three projects were supported in 1988-89 with a total of \$22,500. INTAR was funded for the development of a play by Puerto Rico's Rafael Sanchez and its bilingual presentation in both New York City and Puerto Rico. A series of half-hour radio dramas using some of the field's finest playwrights and actors will be produced and aired by WNYC partially supported by a Special Projects award, and the Women's Interart Center was funded for the collaborative development of a work exploring several of Shakespeare's characters within the context of today's theatrical landscape.

The Program has recently expanded its commitment to artists both in an effort to provide living support and to stimulate experimentation and the creation of new work. Commissions (ranging from \$3,000 to \$6,000) were given to 9 individual artists. The total amount awarded was \$41,000 (a \$7,500 increase over the prior year.) Among the recipients were Laurie Carlos for a theatre piece to be created for the Brooklyn Arts Council/BACA Downtown, David Cale for a new work to be produced by Second Stage and Ernie McClintock for the development and direction of a play at the Richard Allen Center. See the Individual Artists Program listing for a complete list of recipients. Support is also provided to artists through the Artistic Development category, with the two-fold purpose of assisting theatre artists of

exceptional talent in their career development and of adding depth to the artistic staffs of theatre organizations. The artist participates in the decision-making process of the company and assists the Artistic Director in a pre-determined capacity. The amount directed to Artistic Development was \$38,500 with 7 awards of \$3,500 to \$7,500 on either a one-to-one matching basis for the first year or a two-to-one match in the second year. Recipients included Beatriz Cordoba (Assistant to the Director of Repertorio Espanol), Marguerite Feitlowitz (Literary Manager for River Arts Repertory) and Nina Mankin (Dramaturg with New York Theatre Workshop).

A survey of the productions mounted at New York State theatres in 1988-89 indicates a striking variety and richness of artistic achievement. The Theatre Program continues to work to sustain and deepen its commitment to New York State artists and theatres.



## Visual Artists Program

**DURING 1988-89 THE VISUAL ARTISTS** Program awarded a total of \$1,824,245 to 125 organizations, throughout the State, for a broad range of contemporary arts activity. These funds represented an 11% increase over the Program's 1987-88 allocation, to more adequately respond to an ever-increasing number of inter-disciplinary and/or multi-disciplinary project requests received by the Program.

Of the 537 requests received, 194 (36.12%) were supported. The geographical range, as well as aesthetic and ethnic diversity, of those supported attest to the inclusive nature of the Program. Organizations such as Western New York's Access to the Arts, in Dunkirk, the East Hampton Center for Contemporary Arts, Staten Island's Snug Harbor

Cultural Center in the South and the North Country's Adirondack Lakes Center for the Arts, in Blue Mountain Lake were all funded, as well as many more between these points. El Museo del Barrio, Kenkeleba House, the Asian American Arts Center and the American Indian Community House Gallery, among others, received funds for exciting, and important projects — projects that reinforced the Program's belief that for the contemporary arts to be valid and meaningful expressions of our society they must embrace all of the cultural and ethnic influences that help to shape this society.

The current interest by many of today's artists in developing new works that comfortably cross over, fertilize and blur traditional disciplinary boundaries was very much in evidence in projects supported through organizations such as the Lucinda Childs Dance Foundation, Mabou Mines, Performance Space 122, Dixon Place, Creative Time and Dance Theater Workshop, in New York City, as well as Art Awareness, Hallwalls, and Pyramid Art Center, in Lexington, Buffalo and Rochester, respectively, and the Islip Art Museum in Long Island.

The Program's ongoing commitment to artists and arts organizations which serve artists and ensure that their work reaches a broad audience was, again, reflected in its funding. During 1988-89, 34% of the total allocation (\$614,803) was awarded as direct support (fees and materials) to artists in all disciplines, and 44.5% helped support the ongoing operations of organizations whose primary mission is the production, presentation and documentation of high quality programs and projects in the contemporary arts. The remaining 21.5% of the allocation was awarded to other ongoing programs and projects that, for a variety of reasons, do not receive funds in the form of general operating support. It should be noted, however, that all of these applicants, in addition to added opportunities for artists, also provide a wide variety of services to artists — such as exhibition catalogues, transportation and installation assistance, etc.

In keeping with, and augmenting, the Program's stated priorities, additional consideration was given to requests for projects that featured artists in mid or

advanced stages of their careers, such as Ibram Lassaw's solo exhibition at East Hampton's Guild Hall Museum; proposals that aimed to present the work of minority and women artists like David Hammons exhibition at Exit Art, Alfredo Jaar's site specific installation at Lightwork/Visual Studies in Syracuse and Mary Shelly's *Save the Diner* carved reliefs project in Tompkins County, among others. Crafts oriented requests such as the studio access program for minority artists (started by Greenwich House Pottery in Manhattan) also received VAP's enthusiastic support, as did projects focusing on new developments, experimentation, interdisciplinary exploration and/cr process rather than product.

During 1988-89, funding was provided through the Program's 17 categories of available support. These

categories are developed — and periodically altered, revised or eliminated, by the Council with considerable input from the Program's staff and panels. They are meant to respond to the types of activity and needs of the field.

Six of the ten organizations that applied for artists' residencies received support. Residencies ranged from two months at Women's Studio Workshop, in Rosendale, during which time artist Clarissa T. Sligh produced the small-edition book *What's Happening with Momma?*, to Ned Kahn's six month stay at the Hall of Science, in Queens, where he created *Temple of the Whirlwind* — a 20' high structure which produces an undulating column of water vapor that resembles a tornado.

In the category of Periodicals, 12 magazines received support totaling \$71,250, and 8 of them were awarded these funds for two or three years. Among those supported were theoretical journals such as *October*; *High Performance* and *The Act*, magazines which provide a context and criticism for contemporary performance; *New Observations*, *Real Life* and *Heresies*, publications, often guest edited, that present an alternative insight into contemporary art issues and, En Foco's unique and far-reaching "portfolio" of works by contemporary minority photographers, *Nueva Luz*.

Multi-year support was also provided to 25 organizations applying in the categories of Workspace, Exhibition Programs and Performance Programs as well as 27 General Operating Support applicants. Total multi-year funds awarded in the above categories, including Periodicals, and one Special Project was \$966,938. Additional institutional assistance was given to 5 applicants. The Oswego Art Guild, Chenango County Council on the Arts, Cityarts Workshop in Manhattan and the Pyramid Art Center in Rochester, all received partial salary support for new staff, and the Adirondack Lakes Center for the Arts was funded to enable it to hire a consultant to develop the visual arts program and plan the renovation of its gallery.

Individual Exhibitions and Temporary installations were two areas of support that continued to generate

a large number of very strong requests. \$148,510 and \$50,700 respectively, were awarded in these categories. All of the requests supported were both excellent in quality and responsive to the priorities established by the Program. Notable among the exhibitions were first retrospectives in a museum, for Christy Rupp and Edgard Franceschi, at Buffalo's Burchfield Art Center and Manhattan's Museo del Barrio, respectively, and the East Hampton Center for Contemporary Arts exhibition of Bob Giard's *Particular Voices: Portraits of Gay and Lesbian Writers*. Fine, site-responsive installation art included work by Pepon Osorio (who transformed Dance Theater Workshop's lobby into a parody of a tropical hotel), Tyrone Georgiou (who combines architectural, sculptural and photographic elements in his work at the Burchfield Art Center) and Alfredo Jaar, *Sheer Conviction*, at Lightwork/Visual Studies in Syracuse, among others.


From its inception, the Visual Artists Program has welcomed project requests that were "neither fish nor fowl." These projects, 17 in total, often labeled (for lack of a better term) "interdisciplinary", "multi-disciplinary", "new works", "new genres", etc., were funded through Collaborations, Commissions, Individual Performances and Performance Programs (for lack of better categories.) \$87,935 was awarded in these categories. Examples include: Pat Oleszko's *Humor's the Oddity*, a performance/installation at Hallwalls in Buffalo; Leni Schwendinger's lighting design for the Urban Bush Women's performance season at the Kitchen, in Manhattan, and a dance/video collaborative work by Michael Schwartz and Elizabeth Streb for Ringside Theater. Alternative presentors of these new works were also among those funded, including BACA Downtown's *Hybrid* series in Brooklyn and Open Channel's Dixon Place on the Lower East Side of Manhattan.

Along the same lines, projects that even further defy categorization, and/or do not fit under any of the existing categories, were reviewed as Special Projects. Nine of fifteen such requests were funded, among them: *Town Meetings* addressing the art community's responses to issues such as education, AIDS, homelessness, the national election and culture, organized by the artists group, Group

Material, and presented by the Dia Art Foundation; regrant programs for artists working in the various craft media and performance art, administered by the Empire State Crafts Alliance and Franklin Furnace respectively, and an exhibition/symposium/journal sponsored by the New York Feminist Art Institute which presented work by a variety of women from different ethnic backgrounds and explored relevant, multi-cultural and feminist issues.

All in all, as the number of applications continued to grow and the applicant profile to diversify, the Visual Artists Program, through its funding, was able to increase support, and encourage participation, of underrepresented artists, respond to risk-taking and experimental projects that crossover discipline boundaries, and hopefully, serve as a strong, though modest, stabilizing force for the contemporary visual and performance arts communities.




