

Vice Chairman of the Council, speaking for himself and Chairman Kitty Carlisle Hart, said: "From 1973, when she first joined us, until now she exhibited qualities that are valuable individually but priceless when combined...strength of character, curiosity, the ability to learn and grow, loyalty, vision and, most important of all, a sense of humor that included a real sense of the ridiculous...When we heard of her illness and then her death, we recognized that something had left all of us that never could be replaced."

STATEMENT OF THE CHAIRMAN AND THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

The fiscal year 1992-93 saw our budget cut to \$23.3 million, our lowest level since FY 1973-74, and a reduction of \$4 million from FY 1991-92. This meant continued hardship for arts organizations in every corner of the State as well as for the Council's reduced staff. However, we had prepared for the worst in 1991-92, and we were therefore better able to deal with the consequences, both internally and with our constituents, and our staff helped every inch of the way. Primar ly, we tried to find new ways to effectively help the field and operate the Council. For example, we focused our support on your ongoing operations, and we also initiated a pilot project that currently is active in two areas of the State ir helping build more local support for the arts.

So we -- and you -- have come through, and we sincerely hope the worst is over. Already there is some light on the horizon, for as many of you know, our budget for the upcoming fiscal year, 1993-94, has been set at a figure \$3 million higher than this year's. Much of that increase came about through your efforts. On top of everything else you do you were able to do that, too. Thank you, one and all, and we -- staff and Council members together -- will do all we can to vindicate your hard work.

Through this program local arts agencies administer a grants-making process, awarding up to \$5,000 to arts organizations and individual artists within their county or region.

Funding by County 1992-93

The Council's appropriation act mandates that "the residents of each county receive arts services proportionate to at least 40 cents per capita of population in each county, except that Council grant standards of artistic quality and administrative competence must be met." In compliance with this mandate, in 1991-92 the Council awarded grants to organizations providing cultural services in each of the state's 62 counties in the amounts shown below. The "required" amounts are based on the 1990 U.S. census figures. The Council's response to the mandate is made through grants to organizations which apply to any and all Council programs through the normal application process. In addition, grants are awarded to organizations that provide arts services on a statewide basis. Grants for these purposes are shown at the end of the list as "statewide."
