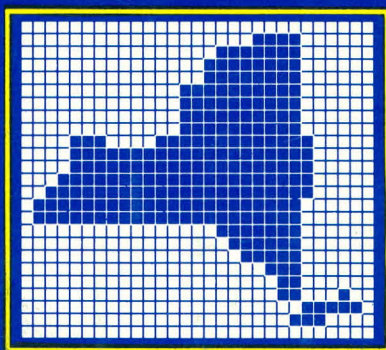

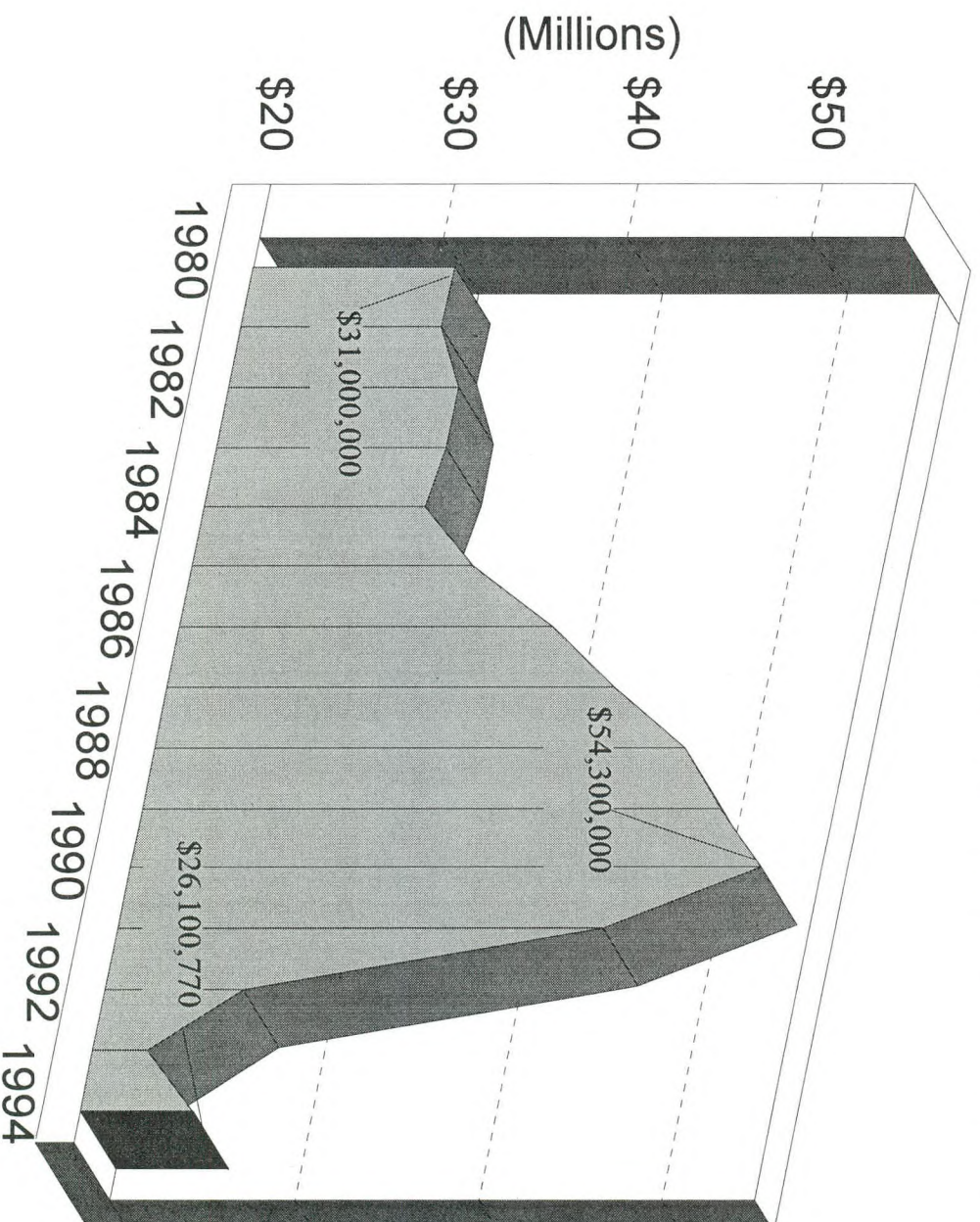

## NYSCA and the Regrant Process

As a matter of policy, the New York State Council on the Arts, through several of our programs, supports regrants in order to broaden our service and outreach to our constituents. What follows, then, is a brief description of our regrant programs. If you believe that you might qualify, please contact the program directly.

**Architecture Planning and Design Program** Architecture is primarily involved in two regrant programs. The smaller program is a regional technical assistance program for the North Country, administered by the Essex Community Heritage Organization in Essex. The main regrant program is a partnership with the Preservation League of New York State to give statewide grants for historic structures and landscape reports and surveys of historic properties. The Architecture program also administers an ongoing technical assistance program, working with the New York Landmarks Conservancy as a conduit.

**Electronic Media and Film Program** This program offers several regrant initiatives. Through the Experimental Television Center, regrants are offered for film and video screening series. Through Women Make Movies, funding has been awarded to assist in the distribution of completed audio, film and video productions, and a new initiative to promote media arts networking has been established with the Media Alliance.

**Individual Artists Program** Due to budgetary restraints, funding categories are rotated on an annual basis. In FY94, the program supported grants to composers and filmmakers. In addition to these project grants, the program regrants a portion of its allocation to the New York Foundation for the Arts for its statewide fellowship program and other services to individual artists. In FY94, 118 artists received fellowships.

**Literature Program** Literature funds Poets & Writers, Inc. which, in turn, sponsors workshops and readings in all 62 counties of New York State.

**Special Arts Services Program** The Technical Assistance Program of Special Arts Services has aided the institutional development of multicultural arts organizations statewide. With a two year grant from the National Endowment for the Arts and renewed support from the program itself, the Technical Assistance Program is now a two tiered initiative. Grants have been made to emerging and developing multicultural arts organizations to improve critical managerial and organizational development issues with the assistance of a professional consultant or consultant team. Harlem School of the Arts is the fiscal agent for this project.

**Visual Artists Program** The Visual Artists Program provides increased opportunities for individual artists to develop new work through its discipline-specific regrant program in crafts, painting, photography, performance art and sculpture. Administered by a number of nonprofit arts organizations throughout the state, these projects offer project funding and/or supportive workspace opportunities for artists to create and present new work. Additional regrant opportunities are offered through two pilot programs: sited work through the Public Art Fund and the studio exchange program through the Western New York State Artist Residency Exchange administered by the Wayne County Council on the Arts.





## Architecture, Planning and Design

The mission of the Architecture, Planning and Design Program is two-fold: to increase awareness and appreciation of the built environment in New York State, and to advance excellence and innovation in the design and planning fields.

## Arts in Education Program

The major goal of the Arts in Education Program is to involve teachers, artists and arts professionals in joint efforts that will result in direct, active arts experiences for children. The program is a cooperative effort between the Council and the State Education Department, with the Council as the administering agency. Cultural institutions are funded to create collaborative curriculum-based arts or environmental science programs throughout the state for students from pre-kindergarten through twelfth grade.

### Set in Motion

The Council undertook a special exhibition project this past year, a retrospective of film and video produced with Council support since the 1960's. Long committed to nurturing important and provocative talent, the Council has awarded production support to over 1,500 films and videotapes. *Set in Motion* was developed to reintroduce audiences to some of the fine work produced by New York State artists, including Barbara Kopple, Spike Lee, Jonas Mekas and Nam June Paik.

A week-long festival, featuring 59 films and tapes, premiered at the Film Society of Lincoln Center's Walter Reade Theater in New York City, in June, 1994. A catalog with an extensive film/videography, funding chronologies and commissioned essays was produced to accompany the exhibition. A touring version of the series will circulate to sites throughout the state and nationally over the next two years.

## Folk Arts

The Folk Arts Program supports activities that present and perpetuate the state's living cultural heritage of the folk arts. The program's funding strengthens traditions within the communities in which they originate and provides opportunities for general audiences to experience the folk arts of diverse cultures.

## State and Local Partnership: Decentralization Program

The Decentralization Program began in 1977 to make the arts more accessible on a local basis to all residents of the state. The means by which this goal is attained is by local regranting of state funds on a community or county-wide basis. Every county (with the exception of Manhattan) is currently served by the Decentralization Program, either locally or regionally, through designated nonprofit arts organizations. Through this program local arts agencies administer a local grants-making process, awarding up to \$5,000 to arts organizations and individual artists within their county or region.

## FUNDING BY COUNTY

The Council's appropriation act mandates that "the residents of each county receive arts services proportionate to at least 40 cents *per capita* of population in each county, except that Council grant standards of artistic quality and administrative competence must be met." In compliance with this mandate, in 1993-94 the Council awarded grants to organizations providing cultural services in each of the state's 62 counties in the amounts shown below. The "required" amounts are based on the 1990 U.S. census figures. The Council's response to the mandate is made through grants to organizations which apply to any and all Council programs through the normal application process. In addition, grants are awarded to organizations that provide arts services on a statewide basis. Grants for these purposes are shown at the end of the list as "statewide."
