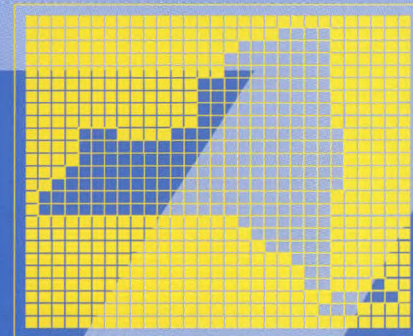

George E. Pataki Governor

Since its establishment in 1960 by Governor Nelson Rockefeller, the New York State Council on the Arts has worked unceasingly to encourage and support the vitality of the arts. In supporting the arts for the benefit of all New Yorkers, the Council serves artistically vibrant and diverse communities throughout the Empire State.

This is why I am particularly pleased that we were able to increase the Council's funding by 12.6 percent this fiscal year. This increase has allowed the Council to provide greater assistance to nonprofit arts organizations, public-private partnerships, educational institutions, local arts councils, municipalities, historical societies, foundations, and conservancies. These organizations, and others, all contribute in a unique way to New York's rich and multifaceted cultural and economic landscape.

This year, the Council has worked to refocus the state's attention toward the arts; and in doing so, has under-

scored the necessity of the arts to all sectors of our society. Through special events and the distribution of data collection, such as the Race for the Arts, the Governor's Arts Awards, and impact studies, the Council has proved that arts funding can no longer be seen as discretionary spending. Instead it should be viewed as essential to the cultural and financial well-being of all New Yorkers. Last year the state contributed \$65 million (nearly half of that amount was distributed through NYSCA) to support the arts infrastructure, which generated \$13.4 billion in economic impact, and \$480 million in collected taxes, for a return on investment of over 700 percent.

In addition to its cultural and economic endeavors, the Council has worked to integrate the arts back into the state's classrooms on a permanent basis. Working in partnership with the State Education Department, the Council embarked upon a new initiative known as the Empire State Partnership Project. The goal of this initiative

is the establishment of the arts as a discipline on par with other curricular disciplines, and as a highly effective, widely tested means to teach skills and knowledge in other discipline areas.

Lastly it is with great pleasure that I welcome Earle I. Mack as the Council's new Chairman. His energy and enthusiasm will be a great asset to the Council. Let me also express my gratitude to Kitty Carlisle Hart, who now serves as the Council's Chairman Emeritus. For 20 years, Kitty Carlisle Hart's passion for the arts and graceful leadership made New York State a haven for many great artists and arts organizations.

I applaud Chairman Mack, Council members and Council staff for their lasting commitment to the arts and for their work in keeping New York the "State of the Arts."

Governor's Arts Awards

On Oct. 2nd, Governor George E. Pataki and Earle I. Mack, Chairman of the New York State Council on the Arts, announced the 13 winners of the 1996 New York State Governor's Arts Awards. One of the world's outstanding contemporary artists, Roy Lichtenstein, was commissioned to create the award. Mr. Lichtenstein created a painted and fabricated brass sculpture titled "Starburst" as a lasting symbol of his gratitude to the state.

Initiated in 1966, the Governor's Arts Awards bring recognition to the state's preeminence in the arts. By tradition, the awards are presented by the Governor and the First Lady. This year, however, the format was altered. New York State is known for being the cultural capital of the world. The ceremony was thus changed to reflect that by having distinguished and celebrated New Yorkers, who often serve as emissaries to the world, through their arts or support of the arts, present awards to those being honored. Key personalities included the former New York State Council on the Arts Chairman Kitty Carlisle Hart, Betty Buckley, Gay Talese, Pierre Cossette, Herb Ross, Art Garfunkel, Chuck Scarborough, Forrest Sawyer, Speaker Sheldon Silver, Senator Roy Goodman, Cy Coleman, and Fred Zollo.

Earle I. Mack Chairman



This year was a transitional one for the New York State Council on the Arts. One of the most solid indicators of change for the greater good is that our new Governor, George E. Pataki, has been in office for over a year. Governor Pataki's commitment to and advocacy for the arts is well known. With the Governor's support, the arts in New York State are now regaining new momentum. Thanks to the Governor and the State Legislature, the Council received a 12.6 percent increase over last year, raising the budget to a six-year high of \$35.6 million.

With this increased show of support, the Council is once again able to lead the way in promoting the arts in New York State. Several new and exciting initiatives are in progress to highlight the value of the arts and their crucial role in our society.

Working with the Governor to place more attention on the arts, the Council hosted the first ever Race for the Arts. The race was enormously successful. There were more participants in the race than in the first running of the New York City Marathon. This five-kilometer race was the first in a series of steps the Council took to refocus the public's attention on the arts.

Following on the heels of the Race for the Arts, the Council held the Governor's Arts Awards in the Grace Rainey Rogers Auditorium of the Metropolitan Museum of Art. These awards celebrate New York's preeminence in the arts by recognizing some of our most gifted artists as well as corporations, patrons, local governments and organizations who have done so much to support artists and the work they create. The Council is proud of the accomplishments of this year's recipients. Their work—and the work of all the other artists and supporters of the arts in New York—brings not only great honor but also major economic benefits to this state.

With the state's attention turned toward the arts, the Council embarked on one of the most critical projects to date, putting the arts back into the public schools. It is

no secret that arts education across the nation has fallen well below the levels it used to enjoy, thus creating a body of adults who know little or care little about the arts. Consequently, we are faced with the problems of the "graying of audiences" attending cultural events that we all hear so much about. The only way to really develop audiences is to start at the beginning with a child's basic education. What we are setting out to do is not just to teach kids about art but rather to ensure that a child hears when he listens and sees when she looks.

With this as a background, the Council has worked with the State Education Department to create the Empire State Partnership Project. This project unites the State Education Department's strategic plan for raising standards for all students with the Council's long-standing goal of integrating and reinstating the arts into the state's classrooms on a permanent basis. Through this program, students throughout the state will have new tools to solve problems, think creatively, and develop mental discipline, which are valuable skills for any academic endeavor.

Not wanting to lose momentum, the Council is additionally working on two projects that will help carry New York's arts organizations into the next millennium. Through studying the economic impact of the arts, the Council seeks to show that the social and economic impact of arts go hand in hand. We are encouraged by the preliminary data being gathered and analyzed and look forward to the dissemination of these statistics. Secondly, the Council is looking toward organizing a technology conference, which will bring people together from the arts, business, funding and educational communities to explore the explosion of technical advances that are shaping today's arts organizations.

For approximately one and a half years the Council was without an Executive Director. After an extensive search, it is my pleasure to welcome Nicolette B. Clarke as the Council's new Executive Director. She comes to the Council

with 22 years of working in the arts. I am confident that, having served as the Executive Director and CEO of the Vermont Arts Council, she is the right person to lead this Council into the 21st century. I would also like to thank Al Berr for his valuable contributions. He graciously took over the helm and served as the Acting Executive Director while the Council searched for a new one. He has served as a pillar of strength to the Council and is a fine example of the commitment this staff has to the arts.

On behalf of the Council, let me express our deepest appreciation to Kitty Carlisle Hart for 20 years of service as the Chairman of this Council. She will be remembered for those achievements that advanced and virtually shaped our cultural identity in all the arts in New York State, and indeed, in the country. What characterized her every endeavor were the notions of aspiration and service. Politicians, audiences, donors, and artists of all disciplines were enriched by her presence in our lives. No one has ever cared more about this Council, or given more of herself so that the arts in New York State might flourish. We are especially pleased that she will continue as the Council's Chairman Emeritus.

Lastly, I would like to recognize the other Council members and members of the staff who have demonstrated unprecedented dedication and commitment to the progress of the arts at all levels. They were the ones who carried this agency through its darkest days and who continuously work to make, preserve and expand the cultural resources in New York State.

Concern for audiences, too, has guided my first year and I have been thrilled to view many events as an audience member. The Council has always been committed to providing the best possible arts experiences for all audiences and it is a certainty that we will continue to honor this responsibility.

The Council has also moved forward during this period. It is most important to note that the climate for the arts in our state has improved appreciably under the leadership of Governor George Pataki. For the first time in many years, we have been given cause for optimism in terms of funding and we have a solid commitment from the Governor that the arts will continue to receive serious consideration in the state's budget process.

In this context, we have worked to develop several new programs. One initiative is the Empire State Partnerships, an arts-in-education program that unites New York schools with arts and cultural organizations and is quickly proving to be a model for the rest of the nation. In addition, we have been planning the Governor's Con-

ference on Arts & Technology to be held in the spring of 1998. We look forward to bringing together a variety of artists, technology professionals, and interested organizations to explore how new technologies will affect the arts.

Finally, the Council's internal operations will be receiving a rigorous examination. We have already formed a working group to develop strategies for long-range planning and we look forward to when the Council's structure will lend itself to maximizing the potential of every aspect of our operations. We strive to honor the long tradition of excellence of the Council's staff; to provide the maximum support our resources allow for our constituents; to expand the opportunities for artists throughout New York State; and to continue to provide every citizen with a keener understanding of the importance of the arts in our daily lives. The challenges remain significant. But I am confident that, with the help of the Governor and the Legislature, with the leadership of our Chairman and the professionalism and dedication of the Council's staff, we will meet our goals. I am honored to be a part of this mission.

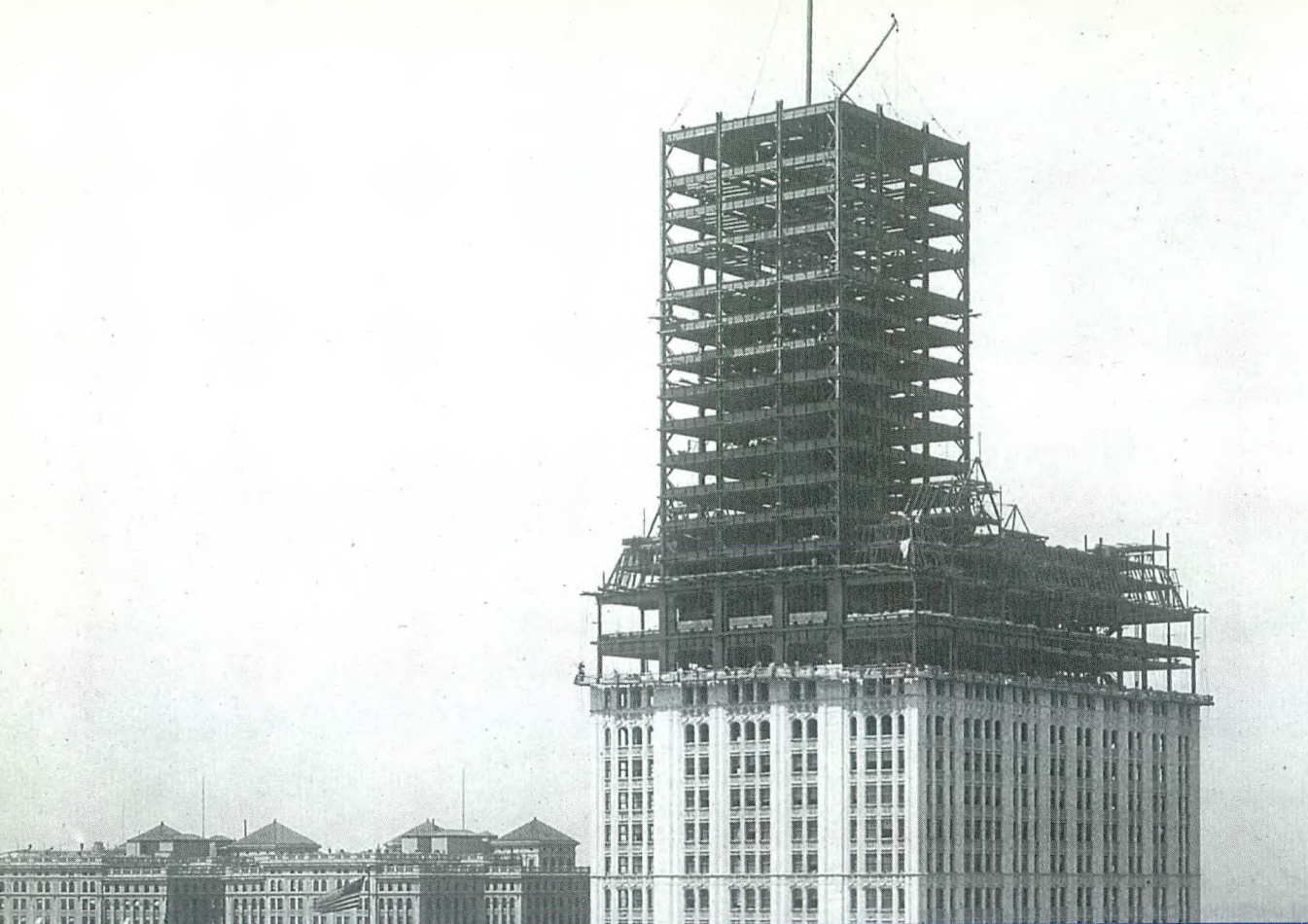

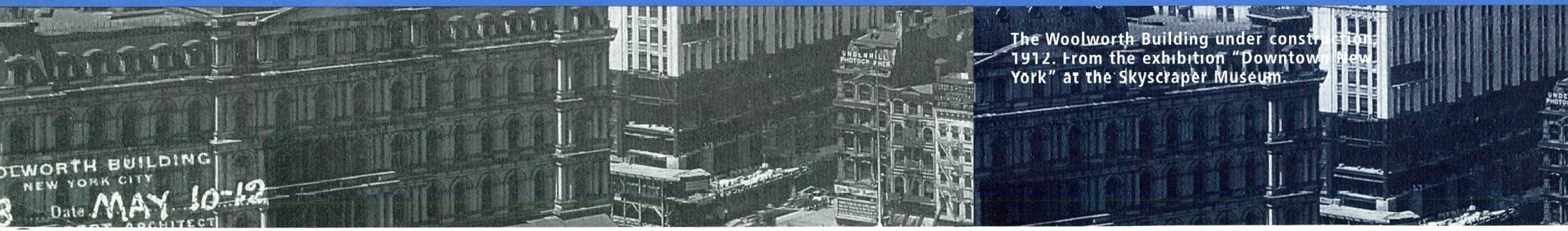

The Architecture, Planning & Design Program's mission is to increase the awareness and appreciation of the built and designed environment and to advance excellence and innovation in the design and planning fields. The Program uses four strategies to achieve its mission. It offers institutional funding to organizations that provide ongoing services and programs in the design, planning and historic-preservation fields; it supports public-education projects about the design fields; it gives funds to a wide variety of nonprofits and municipalities to hire professionals in the design fields; and it supports and catalyzes the art form through direct grants to individual architects, designers and scholars.

Twenty-eight organizations scattered across the state whose primary missions match that of the Architecture Program received General Operating Support in FY97. These groups represent the Program's core constituency, and include historic-preservation organizations, community design centers, regional planning and parks groups, and alternative galleries and educational centers that focus on the design arts. Some notable public programs were supported in FY97 as well. "The Architecture of Business/The Business of Buildings," the inaugural exhibit

of the new Skyscraper Museum, examined more than a century of skyscraper history with a wide range of photographs, models and archival material. Upstate, the Heritage Foundation of Oswego published a pamphlet on the historic bridges of Oswego County, and the Landmark Society of Western New York launched a major publication on the architectural resources found along the Erie Canal. The goal of these public-education efforts is to raise design literacy and increase awareness of New York's rich architectural heritage.

Several particularly notable facilities design projects were supported in FY97. The all-new Trapps Gateway Center at the Mohonk Preserve is a model of "green design." The Lee H. Skolnick Architecture and Design Partnership utilized indigenous stone and wood, geothermal heating and cooling systems and an extraordinary sensitivity to the existing landscape in this multi-purpose structure. As for adapting existing buildings to new uses, architect Stephen Tilly renovated and expanded the Draper Observatory, a National Historic Landmark, into a new headquarters and archive for the Hastings Historical Society. The performing arts also benefited from the Council's interest in supporting contemporary design

excellence with a grant to Second Stage Theatre. Dutch architect Rem Koolhaas has created a very exciting design for its new home near Times Square. In all cases, support for the architects' fees meant that strong, creative design thinking was brought to the table early, resulting in wonderful buildings that will serve their users well for many decades to come. Council funding has also catalyzed significant other public and private funding for construction.

A variety of other design and planning projects was also supported. Olean, Geneva, Catskill and Saranac Lake all took advantage of funding for architects' and planners' fees for their well-conceived community revitalization efforts. The Friends of Duane Park in New York City's Tribeca neighborhood received funds for landscape architect Signe Nielsen to redesign this small urban oasis, and Hospicare, a hospice outside Ithaca, created a "healing environment" in an adjacent public park with the help of landscape architect Paula Horrigan. Finally, the Program's Independent Projects category, our "artists" category, supported efforts by three individuals examining particular building types or places — New York State's CCC and WPA-era public parks buildings, Islamic mosques in New York City, and the islands of New York Harbor. While

more-theoretical design projects have been funded in the past in this category, these three projects have resulted in public-education efforts that have broadened the public's understanding of the state's built environment.

For many years, the Architecture, Planning & Design Program has designed and launched its own initiatives when it perceives that a particular need is not being met. FY97 was no exception with the creation of the New York Preservation Leadership Institute in partnership with the Preservation League of New York State and the National Trust for Historic Preservation. Focused on the management training needs of small, community-based historic-preservation nonprofits across the state, workshops were offered on fundraising, board development and strategic planning in Rochester, Saratoga Springs and New York City. As for ongoing, proactive efforts, the Program's Technical Assistance Fund continued to provide small, immediate grants for a wide variety of facility-related projects in every corner of the state. Finally, the regrant program established several years ago with the Preservation League extended the reach of the Architecture Program with grants for historic-preservation documentation projects in nearly twenty communities.

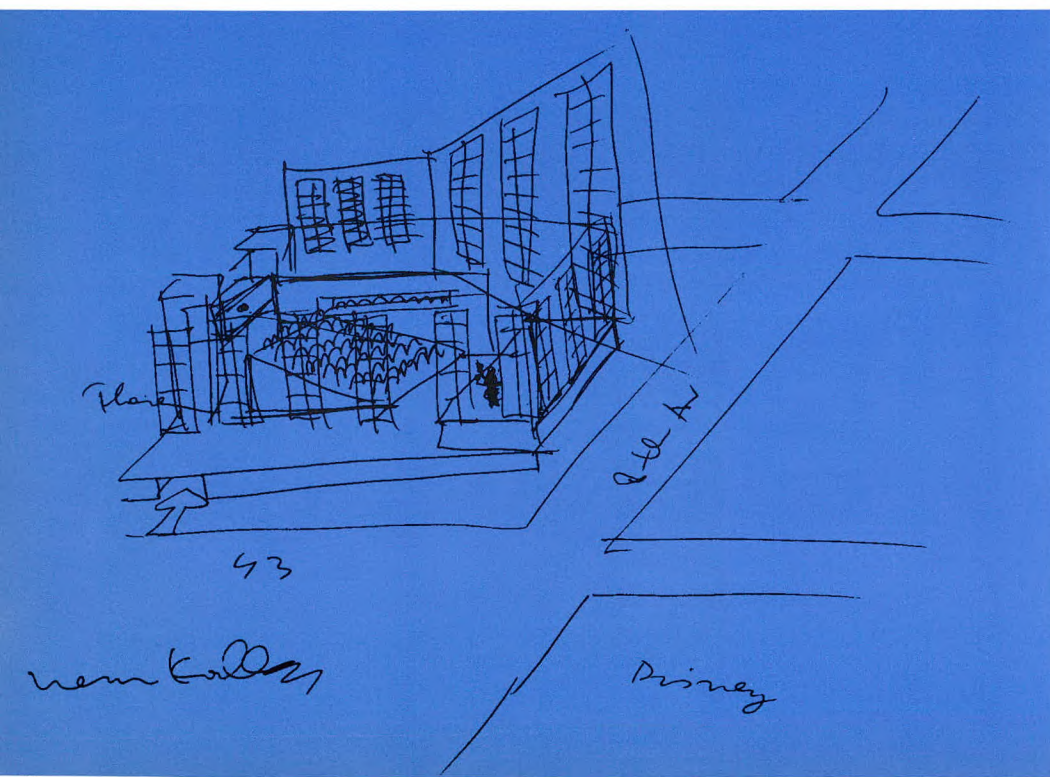

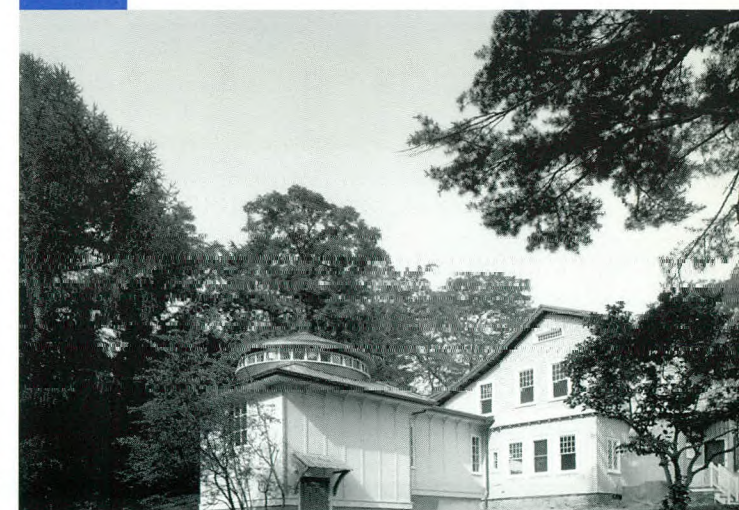

Capital Aid makes grants and low-interest loans available for the improvement, expansion or rehabilitation of existing buildings that are owned or leased by nonprofit cultural institutions receiving programmatic funding from the Council. It supports organizations active across the state in all arts disciplines and has given grants to help enhance theatres, dance studios, museums, galleries, and multi-arts centers, as well as literary and media centers. Capital Aid has become a critical source of support for essential capital projects, helping many of New York State's cultural organizations ensure that their facilities are safe, comfortable and accessible to all New Yorkers.

In FY97, twenty-three matching grants of up to \$25,000 each were awarded to a wide variety of projects. Many of these projects were for the most basic, but still very important, building renovations. The Adirondack Museum in Blue Mountain Lake and the New York Theatre Workshop in Manhattan received grants for roof replacements, while the Catskill Center for Conservation and Development in Arkville created an accessible walkway

and entrance to its fine, Victorian-era building. Funds were also used to help create new homes for flourishing arts organizations. The Saratoga County Arts Council moved into its new home in the old Saratoga Springs Public Library with a grant for interior renovation, and CEPA in Buffalo built darkrooms and a computer imaging facility in its new home on Main Street. Good design is always a consideration of this program, and the reconfiguration of the Vivian Beaumont Theatre's lobby with accessible ramps by architect Hugh Hardy was a particularly good example. Finally, Capital Aid also funds pure historic preservation, as exemplified by the grant to the Hudson River Museum for some interior restoration in its extraordinary Glenview Mansion.

Over the years, Capital Aid has also mounted its own programs in an effort to provide useful information to groups undertaking facilities projects. FY97 was no exception. In association with Access Resources, the Arts and Business Council and Hospital Audiences, two half-day, discipline-specific workshops focusing on the

requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act were held in New York City. Over 120 people from a wide cross-section of performing and visual-arts organizations attended. Finally, Capital Aid continued to offer targeted technical assistance consultancies to organizations just getting started on capital projects. As an example, the American Place Theatre received a Technical Assistance Grant for a detailed report on its HVAC systems in order to determine the appropriate scope of work for a new air conditioning system.

In closing, Capital Aid is helping maintain and enhance New York State's arts infrastructure, and in so doing is furthering the Council's goal of giving artists freedom and space to create and audiences opportunity to experience and enjoy their work.

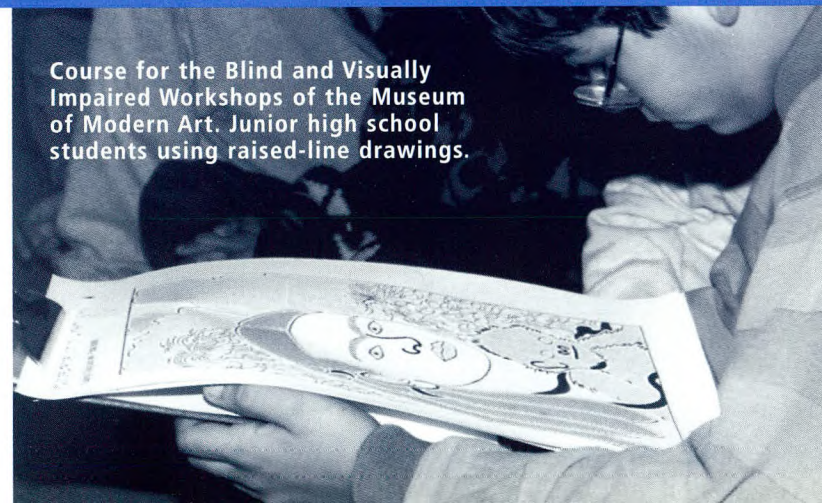

Arts in Education

The primary goal of the Arts in Education (AIE) Program is to support long-term, in-depth, curriculum-integrated arts and environmental science collaborations in schools throughout the state, involving artists, students and teachers in pre-kindergarten through twelfth-grade classes. General Operating Support is offered to those cultural organizations whose primary mission is arts in education. Planning & Development support is offered primarily to cultural organizations that are new to the Program, to help them plan projects with their educational partners. More-experienced cultural organizations may apply for Planning support in order to develop new partnerships. Special Projects support is directed to professional development for classroom teachers or teaching artists, and may also be used for assessment of ongoing programs. Implementation support for in-school residencies makes up the bulk of AIE-funded activity.

In 1996-97, the AIE Program supported 277 requests from 245 different cultural organizations around the state — in amounts ranging from \$2,000 to \$265,000 — for a broad range of multi-disciplinary activity. The Program continued to support ongoing regional arts-in-education projects, in the form of workshops and conferences, and initiated a consortium of Buffalo-area cultural organizations, which has since become the Coalition of Arts Providers for Children. The AIE Program used its developmental funds in 1996-97 to increase the level of its Special Projects support, which has been instrumental in the training of hundreds of classroom teachers and artists working in schools across the state. AIE continues to fund the Artist in Residence and Technical Assistance Programs at the New York Foundation for the Arts.

The AIE Program began as a cooperative effort between the Council and the State Education Department (SED), with the Council as the administering agency. In 1996-97, the relationship between AIE and SED was renewed with the initiation of the Empire State Partnership (ESP) Project. This statewide effort to develop model collaborations between cultural organizations and schools is based on the new State Learning Standards adopted by the Board of Regents in 1996, which, for the first time, include Learning Standards for the Arts. Twenty-five cultural organizations received ESP Phase I support of up to \$10,000, which included mandatory attendance at a two-week Summer Professional Development Seminar at the University of Rochester with five members of their project teams. For 1997-98, these organizations will be eligible to apply for ESP Phase II support of up to \$100,000.

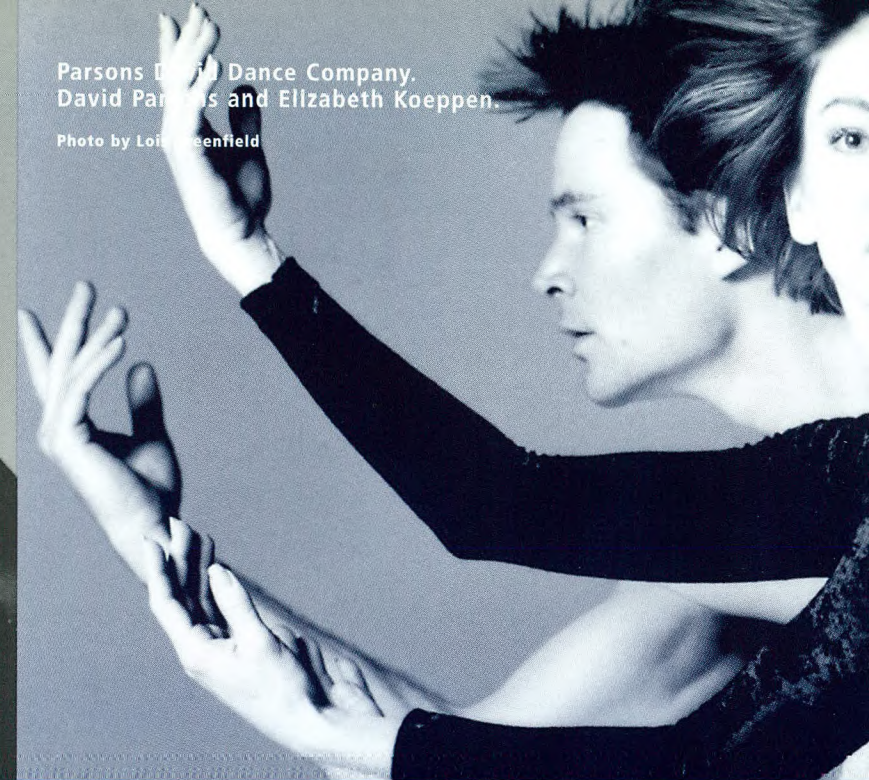

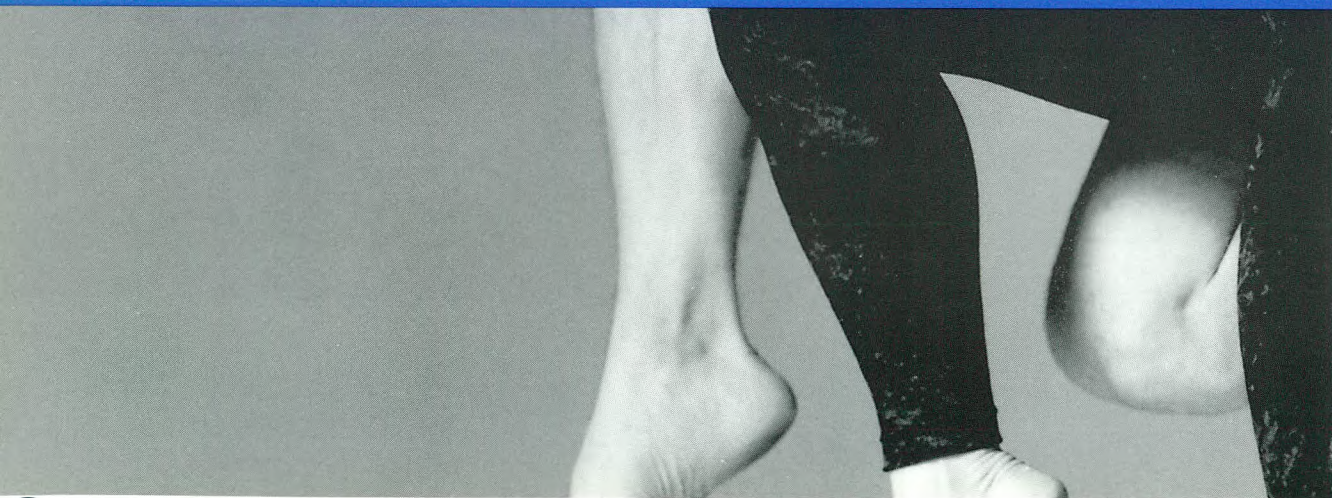

Dance



The Dance Program's primary goal is to help make possible dance performances of high professional standards for the people of New York State. Dance organizations eligible for support include ballet, traditional modern and avant-garde, ethnic, jazz and historical-dance companies as well as dance service organizations and consortia serving management needs. In addition to providing grants under the categories of General Operating Support, Services to the Field, and Professional Performances—Home Base, the Dance Program offers support for incentive projects such as Building Ballet Repertory, Commissions, Long-Term Residency in New York State, and Rehearsal Space. Building Ballet Repertory is a process-oriented category, created in response to the dearth of new ballet choreography and choreographers. Through Commissions, dance companies are encouraged to broaden their repertory by inviting guest choreographers to make new works or to restage or reconstruct existing works. The desire to foster more dance activity upstate led to the Long-Term Residency category. A dance troupe is able to spend

three to six weeks in residence in an area that is outside New York City and its home county, engaging in creative work, community and educational outreach efforts, and public performances. Rehearsal Space support helps subsidize those organizations attempting to provide affordable, low-cost studio facilities to dance artists and companies.

In 1996-97, the Dance Program continued funding of a developmental project, the New York State Task Force on "Partnerships in Dance," which is dedicated to increasing the level of dance activity around the state. Co-administered by Pentacle and Dance Theater Workshop, it is being funded through Danceworks (see listing under Long-Term Residency in New York State). The task force consisted of fourteen partners, reflecting aesthetic, ethnic, and geographic diversity, who are committed to implementing a statewide program of locally initiated short-term artist residencies involving performances and community outreach. Other projects undertaken by task force members included the printing and dissemination

of regional dance calendars or directories, the creation of discount ticket opportunities, and the convening of meetings attended by representatives of local arts and cultural organizations to address the needs of their respective communities.

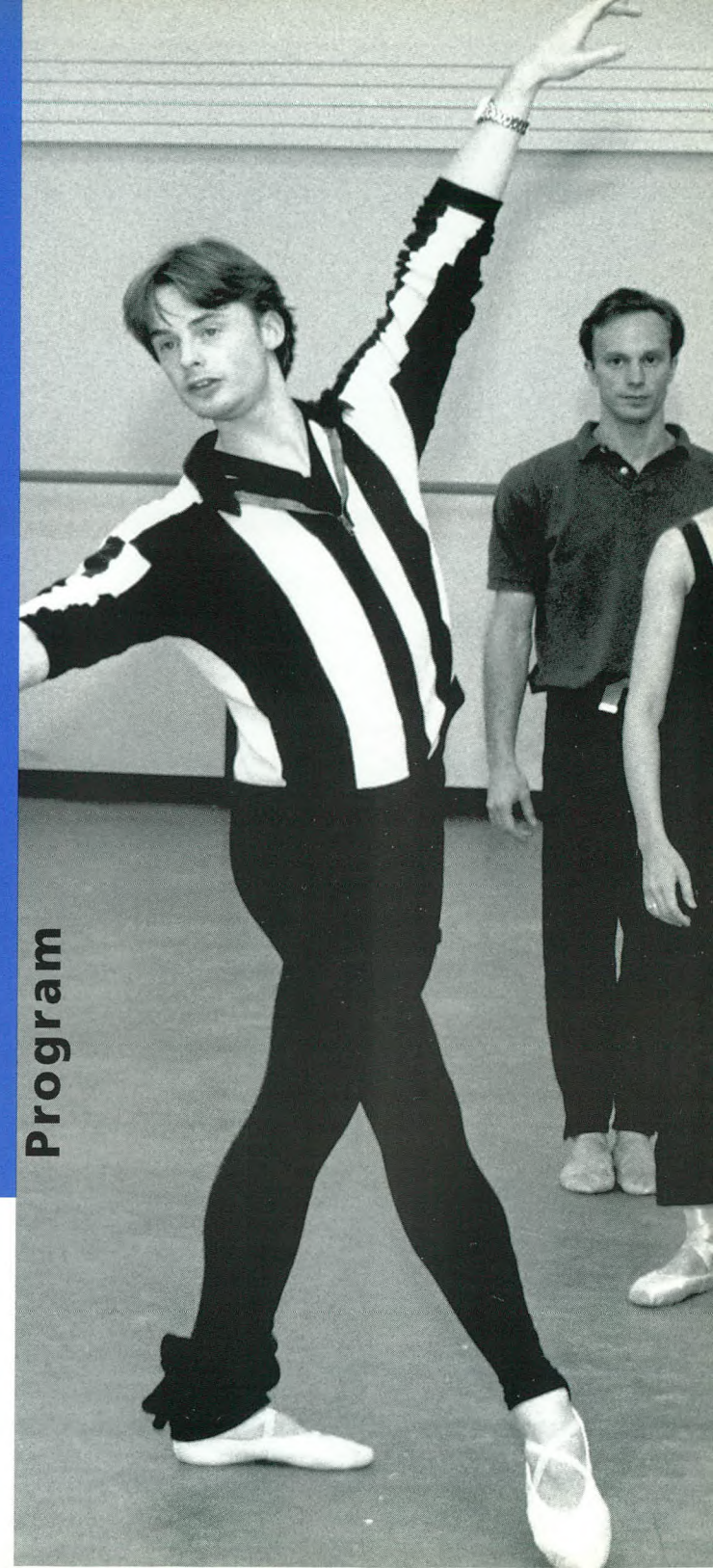

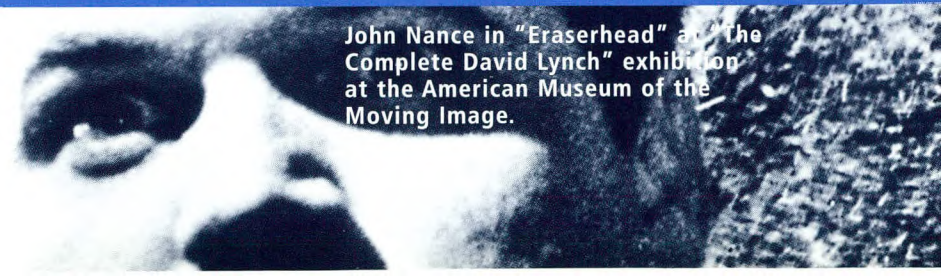

Electronic Media & Film

1996-97 saw a marked development in the ways the Electronic Media & Film constituency is exploring the use of technology and new media. The Program continues to support a broad range of activities in the areas of audio, film, radio and video. Through an award to Radio Catskill, planning is beginning on a roundtable designed to bring together independent radio producers and the nonprofit stations around the state to explore mutual interests and programming possibilities. We've also taken a year away from funding in our Distribution for New York State Arts category to evaluate its impact over the past decade and reflect on future directions.

This year marks significant anniversaries for two media arts organizations. Buffalo Media Resources, aka Squeaky Wheel, will be celebrating its tenth year of service in Western New York. Starting in a storefront with a volunteer staff and donated equipment, Squeaky Wheel has grown into the city's central source for training and equipment access, providing a forum for a vital media arts community. Women Make Movies, marking its twenty-fifth anniversary, has grown into the preeminent distributor of independent video and films by women. A special retrospective series and tour, to include new prints of many films, is being organized.

Exhibition remains a major funding activity for the Program. We welcome back WNET/Educational Broadcasting System with its new series, Reel NY. This summer Sunday night series premiered in 1996 and received Council support toward its second season. Also on the

exhibition front, film and video festivals are developing and flourishing in different parts of the state. The Columbia County Festival is being supported through the Exhibition Regrant fund, administered by the Experimental Television Center. The Hamptons International Film Festival, the Hudson Valley Film Festival and the Long Island Film Festival have brought new work to audiences in these communities.

Telecommunication and computer technologies are providing new tools for media arts organizations and are changing the ways the arts are created and presented. The Electronic Media & Film Program has directed funding to several of its flagship organizations and to special projects that explore the ways people in our field and the larger arts community can incorporate new technologies into their work. The Foundation for Independent Video and Film is beginning work on designing a website and rethinking delivery of its core information services in the new digital environment. Harvestworks is similarly expanding its equipment access and training courses. Lehman College has established a new artists' residency program, providing access to high-end equipment and exhibition opportunities. The New Museum received funding toward alt.youth.media, an exhibition of video, computer art and zines by teens that transformed the gallery into an interactive multi-media environment. Funding was also directed to the redesign of Artswire, the preeminent online arts resource, and to the development of a statewide arts and technology conference.

Folk Arts



The living cultural heritage of New York's folk arts embodies the state's extraordinary diversity. The New York State Council on the Arts' Folk Arts Program support is designed to maintain and perpetuate traditions found among all of the state's regional, ethnic, religious, and occupational groups. It enables cultural organizations to reinforce traditions within the communities where they originate. The Program's funding also provides new opportunities for audiences to experience the folk arts of different cultures, opening new horizons for understanding the way of life, shared values and sense of beauty of another tradition.

Twelve regional and countywide programs were supported in 1996-97, including funding for a new program in Western New York administered through the Genesee-Orleans Regional Arts Council as a collaborative project with the Arts Council for Wyoming County and the Genesee Valley Council on the Arts. Substantially increased funding was awarded to two emerging regional folk arts organizations, Long Island Traditions and Traditional Arts in Upstate New York, which serves the North Country. These programs are directed by professional folklorists, who document local traditions, provide services to individual folk artists and organize public programs.

Program

Cultural tourism was the theme of the 1997 New York State Folk Arts Roundtable, an annual forum for the field organized by the Program and the Cultural Resources Council of Syracuse and Onondaga County. Speakers discussed the impact of cultural tourism upon local traditions, and strategies for communities to determine how their local cultures can be appropriately represented. The roundtable continues to serve as the principal venue for professionals in the folk arts field to critically discuss their own local projects with colleagues.

Folk arts bridge generations, bringing younger people together with older masters of traditions and strengthening the continuity of a culture. Los Pleneros de la 21 was supported for a series of workshops on music and dance associated with Puerto Rican *bomba* and *plena* for children living in family shelters. The Brooklyn Children's Museum produced a series of presentations about ethnic gatherings that included African American, Caribbean, Chinese and Jewish traditions. At the Genesee Country Museum, a new children's component of the Old Time Fiddlers' Fair was supported by the Program.

New immigrant traditions are an especially vibrant feature of New York's folk culture in the 1990s. Support for the folk arts of new immigrants fortifies traditions

amidst the pressures of adaptation to life in America. The American Indian Community House was funded for a Day of the Dead celebration organized within New York City's Mexican community. Jishin Balpgi, a Korean Lunar New Year processional performance, was presented by the Young Korean-American Service & Education Center with the help of support from the Program. Utica's Vietnamese and Polish traditions were featured in a presentation organized by the Children's Museum of History, Natural History & Science.

The verbal and material culture traditions of workers express their distinctive occupational identities. Through the support of the Folk Arts Program, cultural organizations documented occupational folklore and presented traditions that were little known to a broader public. These included a project about backstretch workers conducted by the National Museum of Racing in Saratoga Springs, and the documentation and presentation of maritime traditions by the Westchester Arts Council.

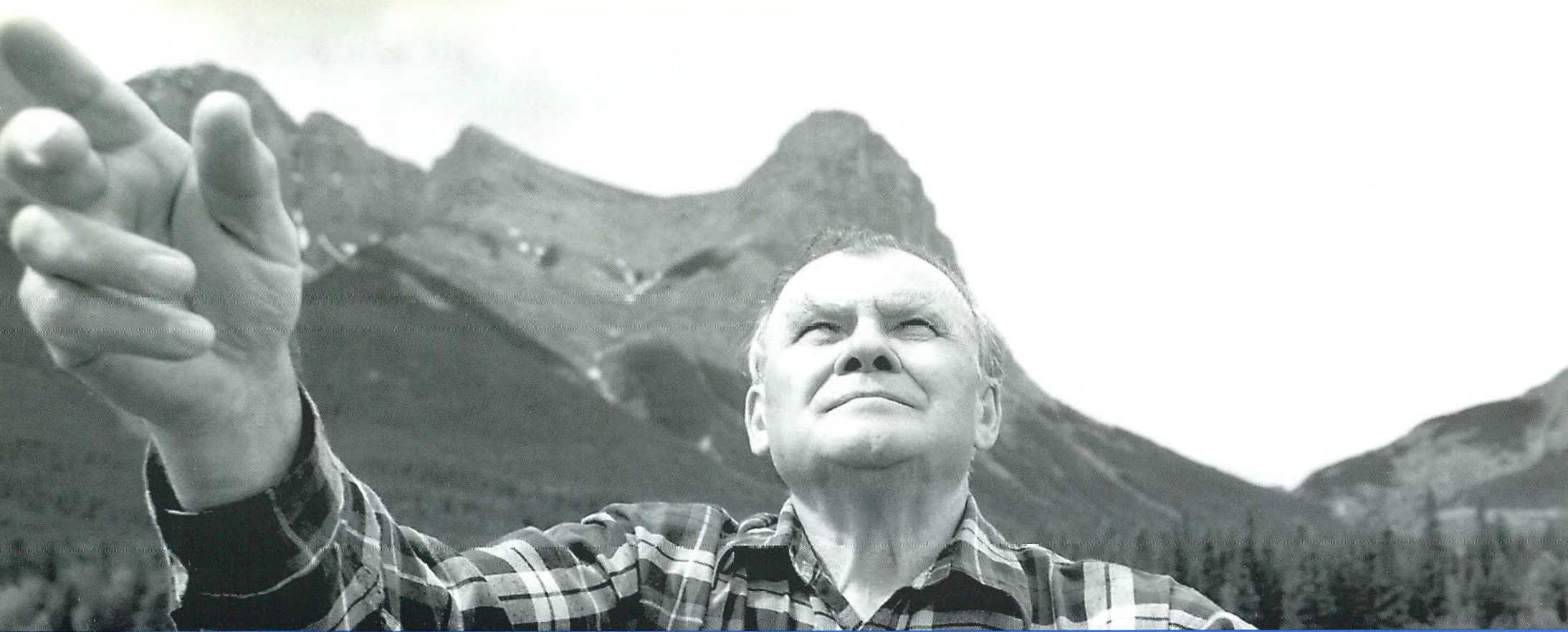



Support for the creation of new work by New York State artists is fundamental to the Council's mandate. Much of this support is provided through the Individual Artists Program (IND), which administers awards for project support for the creation of new works in film, media, music and theatre. The categories rotate each year. This year the Individual Artists Program supported over fifty artists through project support in Media Production and Theatre Commissions.

A tremendous range of projects received support. In Media Production, several CD-ROM projects received support, including Zoe Beloff's Beyond and Yasunao Tone's Musica Simulacra. Among the many new documentaries supported, Kara Lynch received funds for Black Russians and Angelo Jannuzzi for Transformations. In Theatre Commissions, new plays were supported by veterans Joseph Chaiken and Lee Nagrin, as well as emerging artists Gams on the Lam and Nilo Cruz.

The IND Program is also a primary supporter of the New York Foundation for the Arts Fellowship Program and the Special Opportunity Stipend (S.O.S.) Program, which offer direct support to artists across the state.

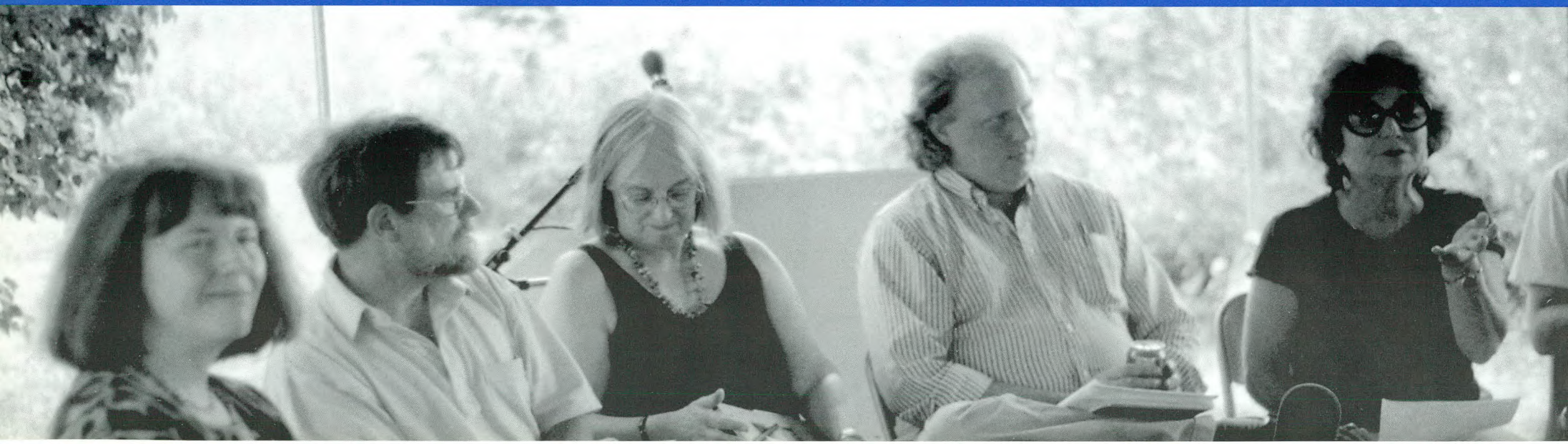
The Literature Program supports organizations that promote the creation, publication and distribution of important writing and that encourage the appreciation of literature by a diverse public. The Program directs assistance to writers principally through support of readings and workshops, literary magazines and noncommercial book publishers, writers' residencies and translation projects.

In FY97, requests for Literature Program funding totaled \$1,132,941. The Program awarded \$637,270 for literary activity throughout the state, reflecting an increase from the FY96 level of \$564,834. In a grantmaking climate that placed increased emphasis on project based funding, NYSCA's General Operating Support for organizations providing leadership and stability to the not-for-profit literary field increased

from \$123,992 to \$160,492. First-time GOS funding was awarded to the Hudson Valley Writers Center in Tarrytown.

Fourteen not-for-profit literary magazines received multi-year support. Twelve independent book publishers from Chautauqua, Delaware, Dutchess, Kings, Monroe, New York and Ulster counties were reviewed by the Panel and all received support, including the newest addition to the publication funding roster, Delaware County's Bright Hill Press. The Panel also reviewed requests for literary translation and recommended awards for translations into English of works from Italian, Ukrainian, Spanish and Chinese. In this category, translator Wang Ping received an award through the St. Mark's Poetry Project to work with eleven

American poet / co-translators on an anthology of poems written in China since 1980.

Twenty organizations statewide submitted literature requests totaling \$352,040 in the Challenge Grant Program. Of these, nine literary applicants received Challenge Grants totaling \$150,400 for projects involving institutional stabilization, audience development, marketing and backlist reprint initiatives for publishers. Poet's House received a Challenge Grant for projects including expansion of its groundbreaking "Poetry in the Branches" project in NYC public libraries to libraries in Buffalo. Writers & Books of Rochester and Canandaigua received a Challenge Grant to reinstate its suspended Visiting Writers Series and Writers' Residency Program. Boa Editions used its Challenge Grant to reprint sold-out

books of poetry by Lucille Clifton, Li-Young Lee and Dorianne Laux, as well as works by Charles Baudelaire and Arthur Rimbaud.

Developmental initiatives in the special projects category continued to be an important area of Literature Program emphasis. The Al Poulin, Jr. Independent Publishers Development Project, a cooperative venture designed to bring the work of NYS not-for-profit publishers to the attention of nonbook-store markets and new audiences such as public and university libraries and Internet users, received first-year support in FY97. The Literature Program extended its multi-year support for developmental projects begun in previous years, including the Bronx Writers Center and the Western New York Artists Residency Exchange, the latter funded in collaboration with NYSCA's Visual Arts Program.

The largest percentage of Literature Program monies was directed toward the encouragement of diverse public literary programming with fifty-one organizations receiving a total of \$330,530. An important and often overlooked component of this funding is a comprehensive regrant program administered by Poets & Writers, which provides direct support to writers through its Readings and Workshops activity in all sixty-two New York counties. In FY97, Poets & Writers funded 1,036 New York State events involving 207 sponsoring organizations and 360 writers. Also in this year, in recognition of its twenty-five years of outstanding service, Poets & Writers became one of the first literary organizations to receive a Governor's Arts Award.

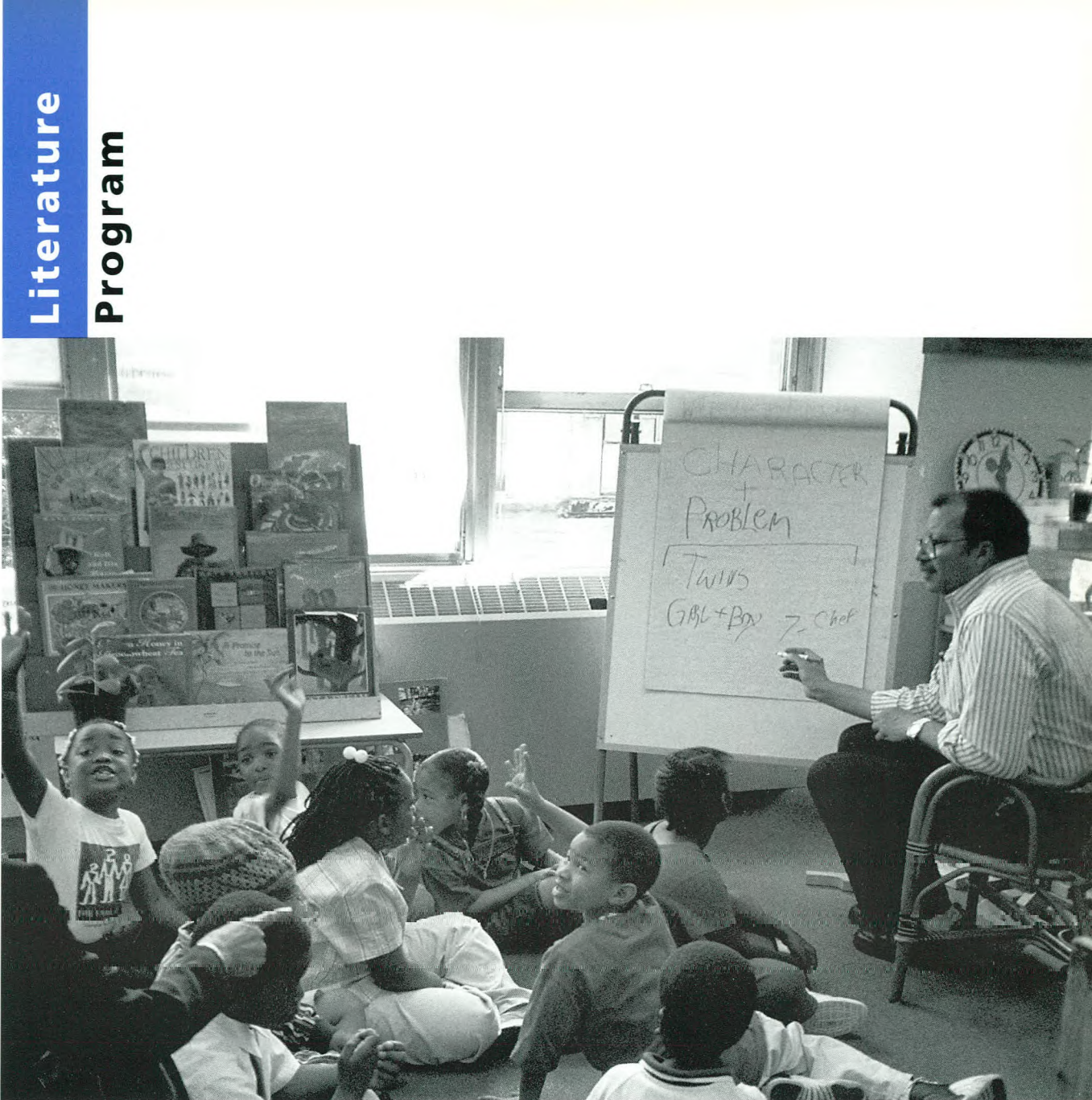

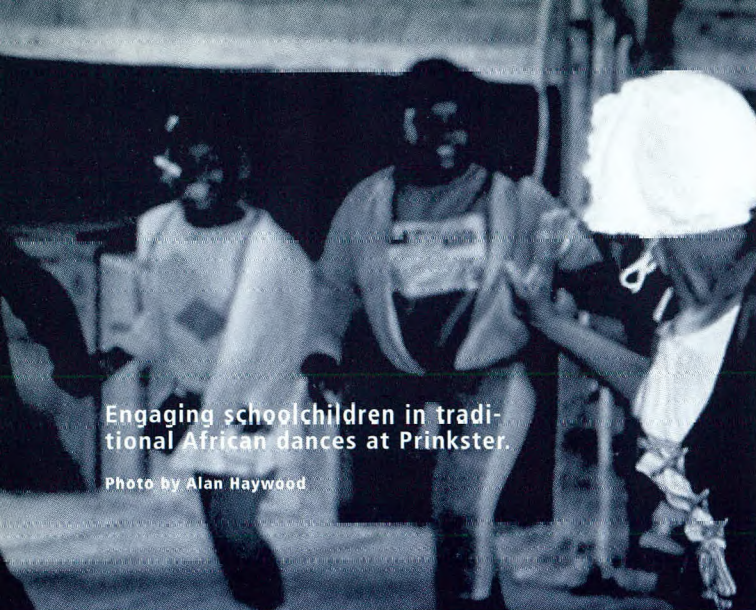

In 1996 the Museum Program celebrated its thirtieth anniversary. It is the Council's oldest and largest discipline-based funding Program, serving an extraordinarily wide range of museums. The Program supports responsible stewardship of the state's cultural patrimony through its funding of collections management, educational programming, which enhances public understanding of collections, and exhibitions venturing new approaches to art-historical, anthropological, scientific and social-historical topics. Substantial funding is also provided for the ongoing administrative and programmatic needs of museums through General Operating Support.

Museum



The major developmental priority of the Museum Program is the rebuilding of a statewide services infrastructure. Severe funding cuts in the early 90s weakened the regional service organizations networked throughout the state, impeding professional development of the field. Current funding increases to these organizations is helping them to restore vital services to museums. The Regional Council of Historical Agencies was funded to administer a new professional development and technical assistance program undertaken in collaboration with the Museum Program and the Lower Hudson Conference, the Western New York Association of Historical Agencies and the Museum Association of New York. The Program also convened a series of meetings of service organizations designed to trigger new professional development initiatives.

Educational projects supported in 1996-97 included initiatives that are expanding access to museums by underserved populations. The Museum of Modern Art's program for the blind and visually impaired is opening new horizons for learning about art through auditory, visual and tactile sensory experiences. At the Heckscher Museum, a junior docent program engages youth from low-income communities in interpreting art for their peers. The Hudson River Museum was supported for a new program for older adults, who participate in special public programs and view exhibitions in visits targeted to their needs and interests.

Funding for collections management includes support for new research about collections, improvement of storage, updating of collections records and introduction of new

technologies. The New York State Historical Association accomplished multiple objectives as it computerized collections records, engaged consultants to reinterpret objects and prepared to provide information about its collections on the Internet. A long-range collections management program was launched at the Ukrainian Museum as it prepared for a move to a new building in 1999. The Adirondack Museum was funded to undertake research about hunting in the Adirondacks that included original oral history and folklife documentation, research about its own collections and reconstruction of a hunting lodge.

The Museum Program helps ensure careful development and substantive research for exhibitions through its Exhibition Planning category. The Bronx Museum for the Arts was funded to plan an exhibition of work by the Uruguayan-born, New York-based artist Rimer Caudillo, inspired by his encounters with indigenous South American peoples. A permanent exhibition planned by the George Eastman House will orient visitors to the museum as it examines photography's impact upon multiple aspects of daily life and explores how culture is mediated through the photographic medium. The Lower East Side Tenement Museum received support to plan the re-creation and interpretation of a tenement family apartment representative of the dwellings of many early-twentieth-century immigrants.

Exhibitions supported in 1996-97 provided fresh interpretations of historical topics. The Seneca Falls Historical Society was funded for an exhibition dealing with the impact of the national women's movement founded in Seneca Falls upon its own community. Americas Society received funding for a catalogue for its exhibition about paintings that represent race, caste and class in colonial Latin America. Support was provided to the New York Historical Society for an exhibition about a little-known nineteenth-century African American community displaced by the building of Central Park.

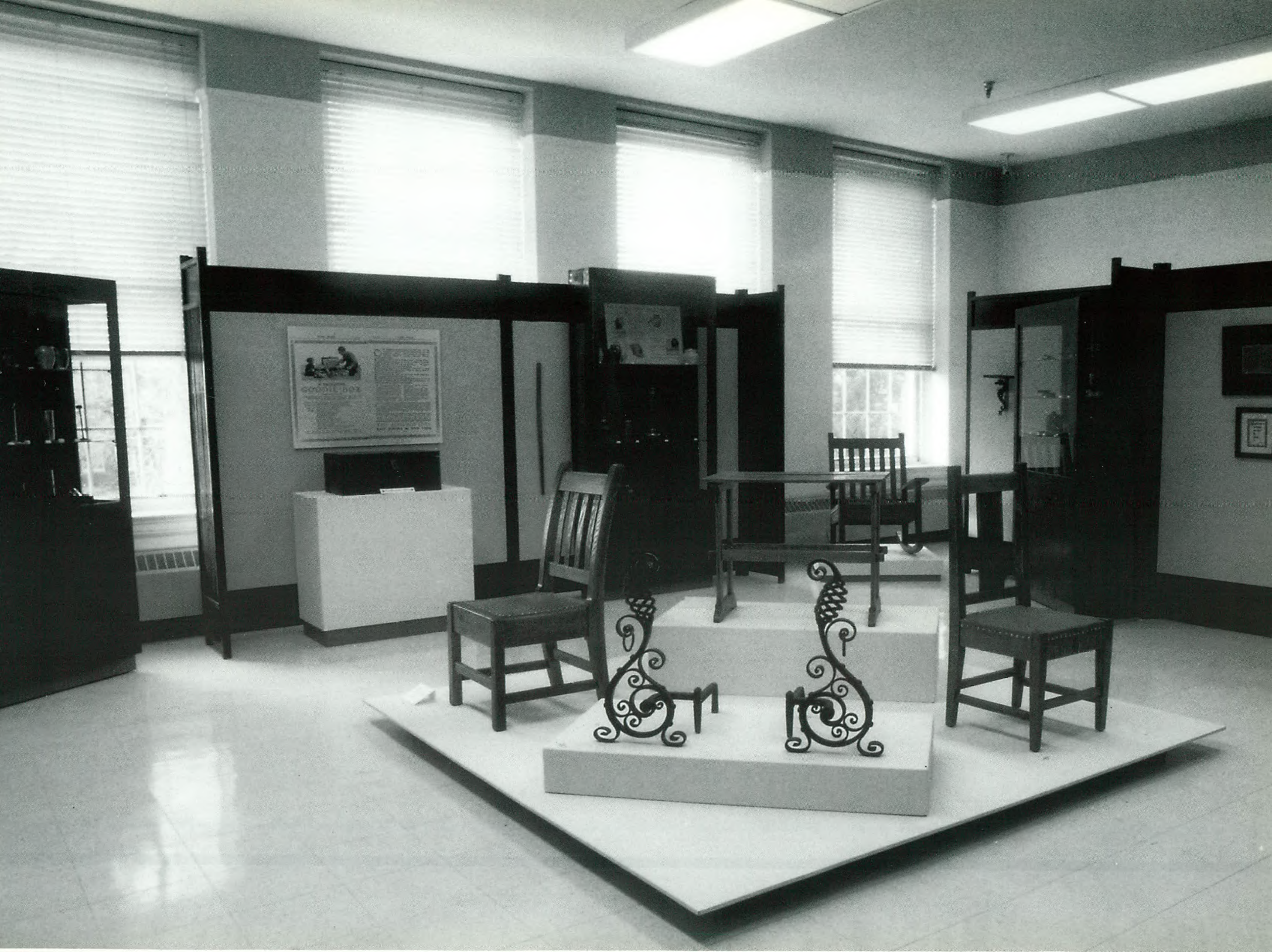

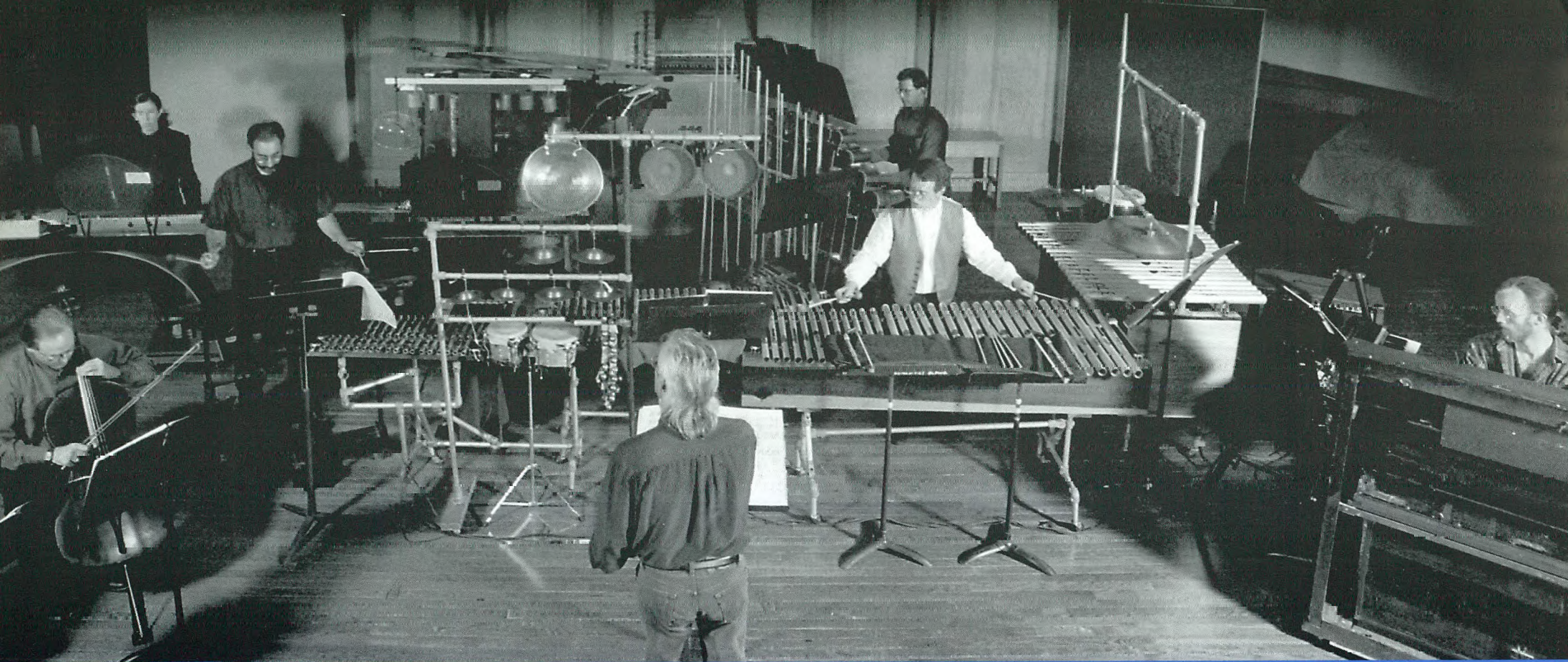

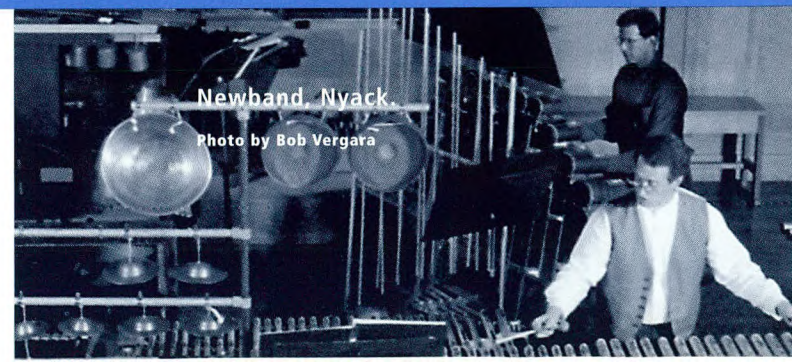

The Music Program supports the production and performance of musical events of high professional caliber for the people of New York State. The Program also supports music service organizations, radio production and broadcast, recordings, projects in new music technology and a musical instrument revolving loan fund.

The vitality of the Music Program stems from the extraordinary diversity and richness of musical expression found in New York State. Enhancing the quality of musical endeavor and broadening its availability to a large and growing audience have been important goals of the Music Program since 1961, when the Council approved its first music grant. Both as a demonstration of artistic potential and as a vital social resource, music has figured prominently in the Council's mandate to improve the quality of life in New York State.

During 1996-97, the Music Program disbursed \$2,656,379 to 210 organizations. Grants ranged from \$1,200 to \$178,132 and provided support for over ten thousand musical events throughout the state's sixty-two counties. In addition, \$219,723 through special legislation for the Musical Instrument Revolving Loan Fund resulted in eight low-interest loans to musicians for the purchase of musical instruments.

Half of the grants of the Music Program went to small performing ensembles, which provide the lion's share of musical performances in the state. Most of these groups, which include traditional chamber music, new music, early music and jazz groups, are artist-run, and employ some of the most innovative musicians in the country. Many of them are taking music in new directions.

As the relationship between art and technology grows steadily closer, music technology has become increasingly common in the composition, production and presentation of music. To function within this changing environment, composers need education, direction and personal time on a well-designed system. To this end, the Music Program provides funds to Harvestworks and Lear Studios of Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute for composers interested in instruction and experimentation on electronic and computer music systems.

In 1996-97, the Music Program presented two regional conferences for our Central and Western New York constituents. The gatherings were held in Albany and Syracuse. Musicians, board members, volunteers, and supporters of all groups producing or presenting music in Central and Western New York were invited.

The focal points of the conferences were an exploration of the exciting possibilities of more creative and diverse music programming, creating a repertoire for the twenty-first century, integrating new music into the repertoire, working with composers, exploring alternative venues, extending and challenging audiences, and the innumerable issues involved in turning these ideas into programming reality.

Pulitzer Prize-winning music critic and author Tim Page was the principal speaker, offering a critic's challenging view of where we can go from here. At both gatherings composer/conductor Victoria Bond and harpsichordist and ensemble director Andrew Appel offered their responses to Tim's observations.

In summation, through its various initiatives the Music Program has reached a larger audience for musical events than ever before. Within the state, Music Program support has reached organizations and the general public in every county, and has made it possible for more New Yorkers to take part in our exceptional cultural life.

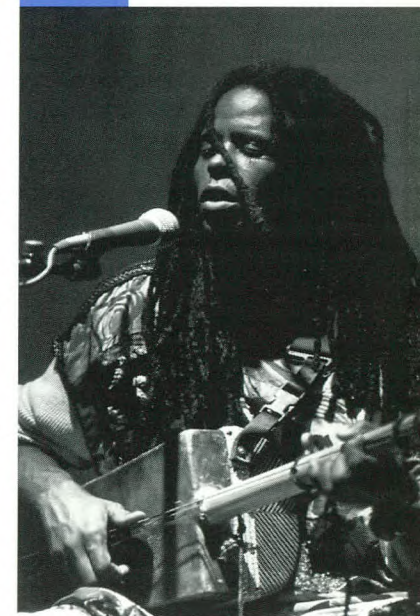



The Presenting Program provides support to a wide variety of organizations presenting culturally diverse performances of high professional standards and artistic excellence to the people of New York State.

In FY97, a total of \$1,526,295 was awarded to 132 organizations in thirty-eight counties for the presentation of 3,712 performances. Grants ranged from \$930 to \$174,319, with the majority of the awards between \$2,600 and \$10,700. Organizations receiving support included internationally renowned institutions; regional multi-arts and cultural centers; local arts councils; museums; libraries; municipalities; music and theatre producers; and educational, religious and social service agencies, as well as a host of small volunteer presenters.

Presenting



Priority support was given to those organizations that demonstrated clear artistic vision with balanced programming; incorporated residency activity into their seasons, including the presentation of lesser-known artists, artists of color, contemporary work and new work by living American artists; proposed unique programming concepts; and presented performances in underserved communities and to underserved audiences.

Most of the Program's funds were granted through the categories of General Operating Support and Presentation with over 70% allocated to organizations outside Manhattan. This high percentage of support reflects the Program's strong commitment to develop and sustain upstate presenters so that the residents in the more remote regions of the state are able to experience a

wide variety of programming in their own communities. Through the New Presenter Development category, five organizations in the counties of Chautauqua, Essex, Hamilton and Westchester received funding for their first or second year of presenting activity.

Some of the highlights of the presenting year include: the two-week International Festival of Puppet Theatre by the Henson Foundation, which featured over twenty innovative puppet troupes from around the world in 60 performances at venues throughout Manhattan; the three-day New York State Blues Festival in Syracuse, which celebrated internationally known performers, local legends and emerging artists in a variety of downtown sites; the annual two-week residency of the New York City Ballet at the Saratoga Performing Arts Center; the

unique programming of Brooklyn Academy of Music's Next Wave Festival, which included forty-two performances of the French equestrian theatre troupe Zingaro; Hubbard Hall's annual Fiddle Weekend, which featured a parade, music, workshops, jamming and contra dance with over a dozen musicians and dancers in the intimate rural opera house in Cambridge; the successful co-presentation of the Chuck Davis Dance Company by One Seventy One Cedar Arts working in partnership with the Corning-Painted Post Civic Music Association at the Clemens Center in Elmira; the exciting new three-week Lincoln Center Festival, which featured over two hundred performances of sixty-four productions, including numerous premieres by contemporary and mainstream international and American artists; and the four-day International African Arts Festival, a celebration of black arts and culture from around the world, which featured over a dozen widely acclaimed artists at the Boys and Girls High School in Bedford-Stuyvesant.

To assist in the development of the field, the Presenting Program introduced an important technology initiative with three goals: to unite all presenters through the Internet, using inexpensive e-mail, Listserver and Usenet news group technologies; to assist presenters in obtaining/maintaining a presence on the World Wide Web; and to assist presenters in purchasing software that addresses specific management, technical and box office needs.

In FY97, the Program focused on the first goal—to create a dedicated Listserver that would enhance presenters' ability to quickly and effectively communicate with colleagues regarding a broad spectrum of day-to-day management and presentation issues.

Special Arts Services



The Special Arts Services Program advances the Council's commitment to cultural pluralism through its funding to multi-disciplinary arts activities within the African-Caribbean, Latino/Hispanic, Asian/Pacific Islander and Native American/Indian communities, as well as other ethnic groups seeking to perpetuate distinct artistic traditions. The Program enriches the cultural landscape of the state by aiding in the development of community-based artists and arts institutions, and fostering the growth and capabilities of other, more-emerging arts groups of quality and potential. In addition, the Program fosters outreach to specific communities by improving access to arts training opportunities and cultural-heritage education through performances, exhibitions, workshops and special initiatives.

Since its creation in 1967, the Special Arts Services program has been concerned with institutional issues facing its constituency. In recognition of the particular problems facing organizations of color and other ethnic-based groups, the Program has offered a variety of categories designed to support vital administrative functions where they may be lacking in otherwise artistically sound institutions.

For the past nine years the Program has offered a Technical Assistance Program (TAP) to strengthen the managerial operations of small and medium-sized organizations statewide. TAP, which is available outside the regular funding process, is a vital initiative that has greatly benefited emerging and developing organizations. TAP's support of customized consultancies focusing on long-term issues of planning, marketing, funding development and artistic and managerial successorship has heightened awareness of these issues and enables TAP recipients to achieve greater stability and success in a chillingly competitive funding environment.

TAP is but one example of the Special Arts Services Program's response to the urgent needs of its field. Through these and other ongoing investments in NYS's multi-cultural organizations, artists and the neighborhoods they serve, the Program has been pivotal in aiding the institution-building efforts of this vibrant and valuable arts community.

State & Local



The State and Local Partnership Program has as its goal the continued cultural development of the state through support of local initiatives that boost the visibility of the arts and contribute to an environment where the arts can thrive. The Program encourages activities that enhance public information, innovative programming and community/regional cultural planning through its support of organizations demonstrating an ongoing commitment to long-term cultural development.

Support is provided in a number of categories designed to encourage strong community outreach, technical and developmental assistance provision for emerging arts and cultural organizations, and communitywide programs that boost the visibility of artists and the work of arts and cultural agencies. In addition, through its funding, the program seeks to support multi-disciplinary, participatory programs for the general public in an inclusive community setting. Categories of support include Jump Start for emerging local arts councils and multi-arts centers; Community Arts Access for support of workshops, publications and other projects; Services to the Field for important arts-related services; and General Operating Support for eligible local arts organizations.

Toward these goals, the State & Local Partnership Program provides funding to Community Multi-arts Centers, Statewide Arts Service Organizations and Local Arts Councils. These local arts agencies and service groups form a sophisticated and comprehensive network of cultural providers that serve New York residents in every corner of the state.

Decentralization

The State/Local Partnership Program also manages the Decentralization Program, the Council's statewide program of community arts regranting. The Program operates in partnership with local arts agencies in sixty-one of the state's sixty-two counties to provide support to community-based arts groups and to local cultural providers at the grass-roots level. At the core of the DEC Program is a process of local decision making. Through the use of locally based panels and advisory boards, the DEC Program engages citizens from a wide range of backgrounds and community interests. Decentralization is one of the most effective Council mechanisms to reach underserved, rural and isolated areas to ensure access to the arts by citizens in every part of the state.

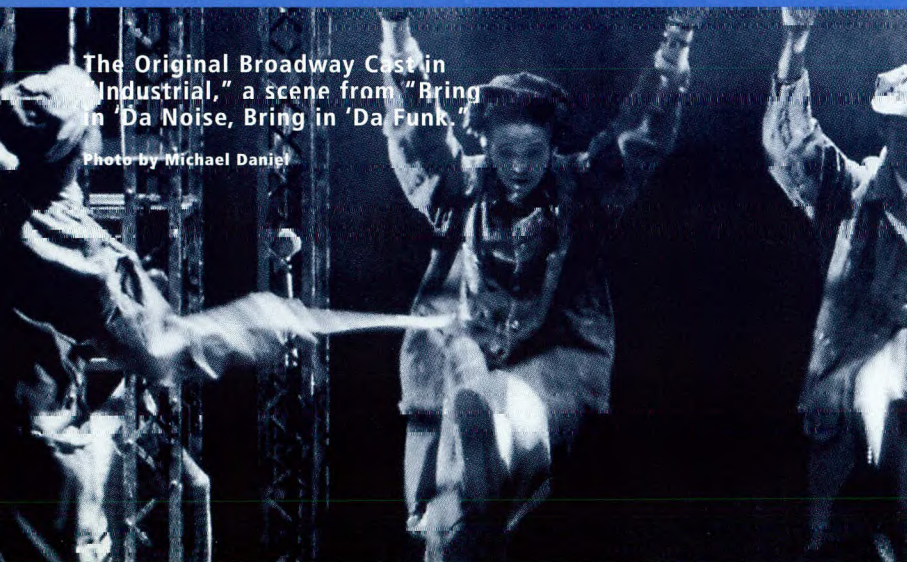

The Theatre Program's most basic goal is to contribute to a healthy balance among all the elements that make up a vital theatre community: producing organizations, artists, service organizations and the development of audiences. The increase in NYSCA's budget for FY97 provided the Council with an opportunity to assess changes that have occurred in the field since severe budget cuts in the early 90s. The FY97 funding roster incorporates a response to those new needs and trends on which the Program hopes to build in the future.

General Operating support and performance support to producing organizations remains the cornerstone of the Program. The bulk of the budget increase was directed toward increased commitments to small and mid-sized companies. The Council voted to offer the New Theatre Advancement Category, which supports emerging companies, on an annual basis (it had previously been offered biennially), and a portion of the Program's Development

Funds was used to increase the maximum grant to \$5,000. Funding in this category is of increasing importance because it recognizes promise as well as accomplishment. Recipients in this category reflect a wide range of sensibilities and approaches. The program also continued to support its "standard bearers" at significant levels.

Support for service organizations was also increased in acknowledgment of their importance in providing technical assistance and acting as forums for the exchange of ideas and information, and as venues for the documentation and dissemination of historical material on which today's artists can build. In addition, several service organizations are addressing the challenge of audience development in a time of increased competition from other media. The Council increased its support of the Alliance of Resident Theatre's PASSPORT annual program — a joint marketing effort aimed at developing audiences from Queens, Brooklyn, Staten Island and the Bronx.

Artists and support for new creative work were identified as priorities for Development Funds. The Theatre Program transferred \$15,000 to the Individual Artists Program to increase awards for Theatre Commissioning for directors, writers and designers. (See individual artists section.)

Despite a tough economic climate, nonprofit theatre continues, through a combination of artistic energy and managerial ingenuity, to be a vital cultural force in this state. In addition to their incalculable artistic value, nonprofit theatres have also contributed to the recent economic revival in the commercial sector. The 1996-97 season's two most acclaimed musicals were born in nonprofit theatres: *Bring in 'Da Noise, Bring in 'Da Funk* (NY Shakespeare Festival) and *Rent* (New York Theatre Workshop).

In FY97 the Visual Arts Program awarded \$831,114 in funding to organizations throughout the state. Of this amount, 46% was allocated to ongoing multi-year activities that included exhibitions, workspace programs, publications and regranting. A priority of the Visual Arts Program funding is to reflect the wide range of experimental work created by living artists. Applicants are encouraged to take risks, offer new opportunities to artists and interpret contemporary art for the public.

Three pilot projects continued to receive development and special project funding in FY97. The Town of Islip, due to the enormous progress it made in providing opportunities for artists to develop and present new work on site at its Carriage House, received \$16,245 in support. With funds organized and administered by the Islip Art Museum, selected artists work on installations over an extended period of time and then present this work to the public. The project offers the viewers ongoing

access to the creative process "in action." Hallwalls Contemporary Art Center, in Buffalo, administered another community-based workspace project. Five counties in Western New York participate in the Artists Residency Exchange program, receiving \$25,424 in shared support. These opportunities for visual artists and writers to be hosted for short-term residencies in neighboring counties have proved successful on many levels. The Delaware Valley Arts Alliance, on behalf of the Visual Arts Program, administered \$64,000 in funds for the Curatorial Initiative Project. This statewide effort is designed to provide additional opportunities for visual arts groups to hire professional and/or emerging curators from outside their organizations. This project will be entering its third year. Previous recipients include: Art in General (Manhattan); Bronx Council on the Arts (for Longwood Arts Center); CEPA Gallery (Buffalo); Fund for the Borough of Brooklyn (Rotunda Gallery); Hallwalls Contemporary Art Center (Buffalo) and Franklin Furnace

(Manhattan). Each of these pilot projects will be evaluated by the Council in FY98 in order to determine future funding requirements.

The Visual Arts Program's competitive Single Exhibition category allocated a total of \$35,000 in funding to four organizations. Art in General (Manhattan) received \$7,000 in support for its collaborative installation "The Kitchen," organized by artists Tomie Arai and Millie Chen. A one-person show by installation artist Cathleen Lewis received \$7,000 in funding and was presented by Lehman College Art Gallery as part of its ongoing series titled "The Bronx Celebrates." Another Bronx based group, Pepatián, was awarded \$12,000 for Pepon Osorio's ambitious project "Familias en Taxicabs." First-time funding of \$9,000 was also awarded to Brooklyn-based Momena for its group exhibition "The Gaze."

NYSCA and the Regrant Process

As a matter of policy, the New York State Council on the Arts, through several of our programs, supports regrantants in order to broaden service and outreach to our constituents. What follows is a brief description of our regrant programs.

The Architecture, Planning & Design Program offers two regrant programs. Regional technical assistance for the North Country is administered by the Essex Community Heritage Organization in Essex. The Program's main statewide regrant effort is a partnership with the Preservation League of New York State to give grants for documentation projects in the field of historic preservation: historic structures and landscape reports as well as cultural resources surveys.

The Electronic Media & Film Program offers several regrant initiatives. Through the Experimental Television Center in Owego, matching monies are made available for artists to appear with their work as well as for film and video screening expenses. Through Women Make Movies in Manhattan, funds have been awarded to assist in the distribution of completed audio, film and video productions. In addition, an initiative to promote media arts networking upstate with the assistance of Media Alliance in Manhattan has been established, funding a variety of projects.

The Individual Artists Program rotates funding categories on an annual basis. In FY96, the program supported grants to Media Production and Theatre Commission artists. In addition to these project grants, the program regrantants a portion of its allocation to the New York Foundation for the Arts for its statewide fellowship program and other services to individual artists. In FY96, 112 artists received fellowships.

The Literature Program funds Poets and Writers of Manhattan which, in turn, sponsors workshops and readings in all sixty-two counties of the state.

The Technical Assistance Program of Special Arts Services assists the institutional development of arts organizations of color and those serving distinct ethnic communities throughout the state. With a two-year grant from the National Endowment for the Arts and renewed support from the Council, the Technical Assistance Program is now a two-tiered initiative. Grants are made to emerging and developing multi-cultural arts organizations to improve critical managerial and organizational development issues with the assistance of a professional consultant or consultant team.

The Visual Arts Program provides opportunities for individual artists and curators to develop new work through its discipline-specific regrant program in crafts, installation work, photography, performance art, public art projects and sculpture. Administered by a number of nonprofit arts organizations throughout the state, these programs offer project funding and/or supportive workspace opportunities for artists to create and present new work. Additional regrant opportunities are currently available to independent curators through the Delaware Valley Arts Alliance in Narrowsburg.

Primary List

Primary organizations are defined as “eligible arts organizations that, by the quality of their arts services, their stature as arts institutions on a state or national level, or by the importance of their contributions to a significant population or the arts discipline in which they specialize, are particularly important to the cultural life of New York State, and the loss of which or the diminution of services would, in the opinion of the Council, constitute a serious artistic loss to the people in the state.” In compliance with a legislature mandate, at least 50% of the Council’s local assistance funds were awarded to the following cultural organizations, and this list was filed with the state’s Division of Budget for the 1996-97 fiscal year.
